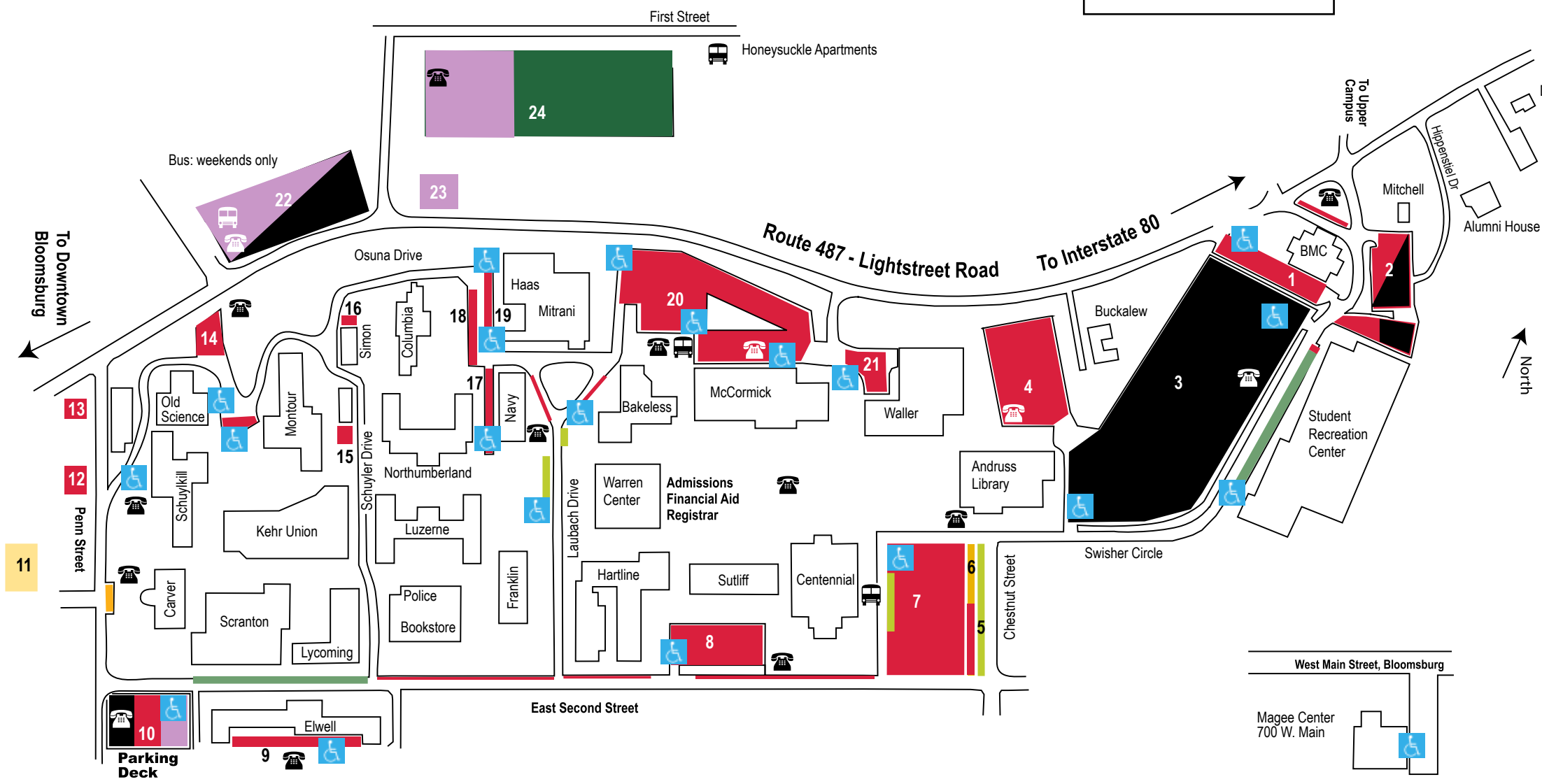

Call boxes on campus are direct connections to university police. They are recognizable by a blue light atop posts on which phones are installed.

University Police are headquartered in the lower level of the University Store Building and are available 24 hours daily.

Eligible vehicles may be registered at the University Police office for appropriate parking identification Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Parking fines may be paid Monday through Friday at the Business Office in Waller Administration Building, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., or at any time by check or money order at University Police.

Guide to Parking on Campus

Effective August 2007

Bloomsburg University provides parking for eligible students, faculty, staff, and visitors. All vehicles must be registered with University Police. Metered parking is available at the Chestnut Street Lot, along Second Street between Elwell Hall and Scranton Commons and at the Recreation Center.

Parking on University owned or leased property is at the driver's own risk. The University assumes no responsibility for damages or theft.

If you're faculty, staff or an eligible student, you can register with University Police from 8 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. You'll need your vehicle registration card and driver's license.

Students living outside an established perimeter around the university are eligible to park on campus. See map at University Police for a detailed perimeter. Students residing within the perimeter who desire to warehouse their vehicle on campus will be permitted to register a vehicle for the Blue Lot. There is a fee for this lot.

Students with 60 or more earned credit hours park in lots shown in black; those with fewer than 60 credit hours must park in designated lots shown as purple on the map.

Resident hall students with 60 or more credit hours can register a vehicle and park in the First Street (Green) Lot. Students with less than 60 credits can register a vehicle and park in the Blue Lot. There is a parking fee of \$75.00 per semester for each lot.

Students residing in Mt. Olympus or Montgomery Apts. can register a vehicle and park in designated spaces located near each apartment complex. These lots require a parking fee of \$75.00 per semester.

If you're a visitor to campus, you must obtain a visitor's parking hangtag and display it in your vehicle. Visitors may park in any legally lined area on campus. Permits can be obtained in the following buildings: Carver Hall, Buckingham Maintenance Center and University Police.

If you're an overnight guest of a student, you must get a visitor's permit at University Police and park in the resident student parking First Street (Green) lot.

Parking is permitted only in lined spaces, in the decal/hangtag designated area. Parking on the grass is prohibited unless directed by University Police.

Parking is not allowed on university property between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m., except for the resident student lots, Montgomery Place Apartments, Mt. Olympus Apartments and Kile Apartments. Parking in these lots requires a special hangtag for the specific lot or a visitor pass.

Parking in some areas of campus is restricted for resident directors, the Community Government Association and university vehicles. Handicapped parking spaces are located throughout campus. Cars parked illegally in restricted areas can be towed at the operator's expense. The operator can be fined.

Parking Fines

Parking fines are \$15 per ticket unless it is a fire lane violation, which is \$50, and vehicles can be ticketed hourly. Illegal parking in handicapped spaces carries a \$50 to \$200 fine plus costs. Violators who get three or more parking tickets, with one or more unpaid, for at least 20 days prior to the current violation, will have their vehicle booted and/or towed at the owner's or driver's expense.

To Learn More...

Formal parking regulations are available at University Police. The police are headquartered in the lower level of the University Store. The Police Department phone number is 570 389-4168. The office is open 24 hours per day, 365 days per year.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Q. I am a visitor; what do I need to do? A. Get a visitor's permit and display it in your vehicle. Visitors may park in any legally lined area on campus. Permits can be obtained in the following buildings: Carver Hall, Buckingham Maintenance Center and University Police. If you're visiting the Admissions Office, Athletic Department, Speech and Hearing Clinic, or the Reading Center visitor permits can be obtained from those departments for their specific areas.



- Q. How many vehicles can I register at a time with University Police? A. Faculty and staff may register three vehicles. Students may register one, unless the second is a motorcycle.
- Q. Where should I park if I cannot find a place on lower campus? A. Park at the Special Events (orange) Lot on upper campus and ride the free shuttle bus to lower campus.
- Q. What are the hours when restrictions apply to campus parking? A. From Monday through Friday from 6 a.m. to 5 p.m., parking is restricted to the designated areas. Open parking is permitted from 5 p.m. to 2 a.m. Monday through Thursday, with the exception of the Heating Plant Lot, handicapped parking and metered parking spaces. There is no parking on campus from 2 a.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday. On weekends, beginning at 5 p.m. Friday until 2 a.m. Monday, open parking is permitted, in any legal parking space except the special reserved areas, meter parking spaces and the Heating Plant Lot. All vehicles must be parked in a legal lined parking space.
- Q. I'm eligible to register a vehicle, but I have brought an unregistered vehicle to campus or have misplaced my permit. What should I do? A. Go to the University Police and get a temporary permit for that day.
- Q. What should I do if my vehicle breaks down on campus? A. Get a disabled vehicle permit from University Police within a half hour of the break down. The permit will be issued for no more than three days.
- Q. What happens if I ignore tickets? A. If you have three unpaid parking tickets with one or more not paid for 20 days or more, your vehicle will be booted and/or towed at your expense.
