MATCH UP: Bloomsburg University will take its first roadtrip of the season as the Huskies head to California, Pa. to take on the Vulcans in a PSAC cross-over matchup. This is a rematch of last season's NCAA Regional Final, a game the Vulcans won 27-24. Cal dropped its season opener last Thursday evening, 23-17 to Saginaw Valley. The Vulcans committed three turnovers and allowed a safety in the home loss. The Huskies are coming off of a 10-7 victory over nationally-ranked Ashland. The BU defense forced three turnovers and allowed just 261 total yards to one of the top offenses in Division II.

THE HEAD COACHES: Huskies coach **Danny Hale** (West Chester '68) is in his 17th year on the Bloomsburg sideline, racking up a 137-46-1 (.747) record. The 137 wins are first all-time in school history. For his career, Hale is 177-59-1 and his winning percentage of .749 is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in Division II. Hale has led BU to six playoff appearances, including the latest in 2008. He has been honored as the PSAC East Coach of the Year 10 times, the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year nine times, and was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year following the 2000 season.

John Luckhardt enters his eighth season at the helm of the Vulcans, putting together a 57-24 record (.704), the most wins in school history. In 2008, Cal won the PSAC West crown for a fourth consecutive season and reached the NCAA semifinals before losing to Minnesota Duluth. For his efforts, Luckhardt picked up his second consecutive NCAA Division II Regional Coach of the Year award. Prior to Cal, Luckhardt coached 17 years at Division III Washington & Jefferson, compiling a 137-37-2 record.

PSAC DEFENSIVE POW: Senior LB **Anthony Smith** received PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week honors for his outstanding play vs. Ashland last Thursday night. Smith recorded a career-high 11 tackles, including 0.5 tackles-for-loss, and led the charge on a goal line stand in the 2nd quarter. Ashland, which averaged over 37 points per game in '08, were able to muster just 261 yards and 7 points against Smith and the rest of the Husky defense.

CROSSING OVER: The Huskies' record with teams in the PSAC West since 1999 - which included Shippensburg until 2008 - is 29-11. BU is 17-4 at Redman Stadium and 12-7 on the road.

THE GRADUATE: QB **Dan Latorre**, now in his fourth year as the starter, graduated as a triple major in the spring and is now in grad school. One of the best players to ever wear a Husky uniform, Latorre, who was named first team All-PSAC East last year, heads into the 2009 season third all-time in school history in both yards passing and touchdowns and is the all-time leader in rushing yards by a quarterback.

MR. EVERYTHING: Latorre is featured in the latest edition of *Bloomsburg: The University Magazine*. The story, written by Husky play-by-play commentator Jim Doyle, details Latorre's athletic and academic accomplishments. In addition to receiving first-

LAST MEETING

Bloomsburg 24, California 27 November 29, 2008

BLOOMSBURG-Kevin McCabe threw three touchdown passes to lead California, Pa. to a 27-24 win over Bloomsburg University in the NCAA Division II Super 1 Regional Final.

The Vulcans opened the game on a 10-play, 70-yard scoring drive capped off by a one-yard touchdown plunge by Daine Williams. The extra point attempt was blocked by the Huskies **Dave Huot** to make the score 6-0.

On the ensuing drive, **Derrick Price** broke a 44-yard run down to the 10-yard line, followed by a 10-yard touchdown run by Price on the next play to give Bloomsburg a 7-6 lead.

The Vulcans would reclaim the lead on a 15-yard touchdown pass from McCabe to A.J. Jackson, making the score 13-7. On the ensuing drive, **Dan Latorre** hit **Kyle Ream** on a 46-yard yard strike, setting up a 12-yard touchdown pass to Price as the Huskies took the lead 14-13.

Jesse Cooper returned the second-half kickoff 81 yards to the California eight-yard line. The Huskies settled for a field goal to take 17-13 with 12:30 remaining in the third. Two possessions later, McCabe found Marcel Pestano for a 16-yard touchdown to give Cal a 27-17 lead.

Cal took a 10-point lead when McCabe found Josh Gumbert for a six-yard strike with 36 seconds left in the third. Bloomsburg answered on the ensuing possession, as Latorre plunged in from a yard out to cut the Cal lead to 27-24.

After a Vulcans punt, Latorre directed a 10-play, 54-yard drive with under three minutes remaining in the fourth quarter. On third-and-nine from the Cal 34-yard line, Latorre scrambled to the eight-yard line, but was separated from the football by the Vulcans Darren Burns. The ensuing fumble was recovered by Cal's Brandon Gordon. From there, Cal would run out the clock and preserve the victory.

Latorre completed 9 of 14 passes for 141 yards and a touchdown as well as rushing for 82 yards. Price rushed for 112 yards and scored two touchdowns, one rushing and one passing. Bloomsburg concludes the 2008 season with a record of 11-2.

SCOUTING CALIFORNIA: The Vulcans, voted by conference coaches as the preseason number one in the PSAC West, dropped their first game of 2009, 23-17 to Saginaw Valley. QB **Josh Portis**, a transfer graduate student, leads Cal in rushing with 82 yards on 12 carries and has thrown for 145 yards on 14-31 passing, with 2 interceptions. Portis previously played at Florida and Maryland. The Vulcans will feature **Windell Brown** and **Freddie Bacco** in the backfield, who have combined for 14 carries for 62 yards and 2 touchdowns in 2009. **A.J. Jackson**, **Dominique Curry**, a graduate transfer from Cheyney, and **Chedrick Cherry** will be Cal's receivers. They combined for 9 receptions and 111 yards in the opener. The Vulcans were 8-of-16 on third downs and 2-of-4 on fourth downs in the opener.

Despite the loss, Cal gave up just 103 rushing yards (a 2.8 yard average) to Saginaw Valley. LB **Dontey Brown** and NT **Sam Fikaris** led the way with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively, for the Vulcans defense. Brown also posted 3.0 tackles-for-loss and Fikaris added a sack. DB **Erik Harris** registered seven tackles and an interception.

Kevin Hagerman missed his only field goal chance last week, but hit 4-of-5 last season. Four players returns kickoffs for the Vulcans, as they averaged 25 yards on 5 returns. Curry is a threat off the edge, as he came up with a blocked punt vs. Saginaw Valley.

team All-PSAC honors for his play in 2008, Latorre earned a 3.78 grade point average while taking 19 credits.

THE RECORD BOOK: Latorre currently stands third in BU history in both passing yards (5,816) and passing touchdowns (49). Here is where he stands compared to other Husky greats:

GOING FOR A GRAND: Latorre just doesn't rely on his arm to lead the Huskies down the field, but also his legs. His 545 rushing yards last season was a record for a BU quarterback and with his 191 yards during 2007, he is closing in on 1,000 career rushing yards. After rushing for 18 yards in the win over Ashland, Latorre currently stands at 753 yards.

SPREADING IT OUT: The Huskies 16 completions on Thursday night were spread out among seven different players. Receivers **Jordan Weisman** and **Branden Wright** each had four to lead the team, while junior receiver **Cory Stiger**, junior tight end **Ben Weaver**, and senior fullback **Stefan Adams** each caught two. Junior receiver **Chris Tressler** and senior running back **James Sweeting** both added a reception.

HITTING 100: Adams rushed for 104 yards on 15 carries against Ashland, including a key 46-yard run in the 4th quarter. It was the second time in his career that he has broken the 100-yard mark and was just seven yards shy of his career-high. In 2007 against Clarion, the fullback ran for 111 yards and two TDs in a 52-10 win.

THE 'BACKERS: **Anthony Smith** led all Husky defenders on Thursday with 11 tackles, including five solo, but he wasn't the only linebacker who helped the overall defensive effort. Junior **Mike Varanavage**, the team's leading returning tackler with 53 in 2008, recorded seven stops against the Eagles, including one tackle-for-loss. Junior **Thomas McFarland**, who had a key 4th quarter interception against Ashland in '08, had six tackles and two pass breakups on Thursday night.

THE D-LINE: While the linebackers made the tackles, the defensive line provided the pressure. Senior **Justin Presley** registered eight tackles on the night, but it was his 3.0 sacks that put the pressure on the Eagles offense. In addition to Presley, senior **Alphonso Nathan** and junior **Marcus Zimmerman** each recorded a sack, while junior **Todd Givler** added a half-sack for the Huskies. Zimmerman also recovered a fumble late in the 2nd quarter that stalled an Ashland drive.

THE DBs: The BU defensive backs also came up huge against Ashland. Sophomore **Oscar Rivera** was second on the team with nine tackles, including one tackle for loss and a first quarter interception on a fake punt. Sophomore **Vince Browning** came up with another turnover when he recovered a fumble forced by sophomore **Andrew Fogel** on the opening kickoff of the third quarter. Rivera, along with seniors **Jesse Cooper** and **Domenique Price** added several key pass breakups to help limit the Eagles offense to 171 passing yards.

KEEPIN' IT LOW: The seven points that the Huskies allowed to Ashland marked the fifth time in the last 14 games that BU has held an opponent to seven points or less.

POSITIVE RETURNS: Jesse Cooper, an All-PSAC defensive back, flashed his ability in the return game against the Eagles. Cooper returned the opening kickoff of the game 42 yards to the Ashland 40, giving the Huskies great field position on their first drive. He also returned three punts for 49 yards, including a 28-yard return late in the 4th quarter. Cooper totaled 91 total return yards on four returns.

FROM THE ARCHIVES: The 10 points scored in the opener was the fewest for Bloomsburg in a season opening win since 1977 when the Huskies beat Shippensburg at home 6-3. It was the least points scored in a home game since the 21-0 loss to Shippensburg in 2003 and least in a home victory since beating Kutztown by an identical 10-7 score in 2001. The 7 points allowed was the fewest in a season opener since a 22-0 win at Wayne State of Michigan in 1997.

The Huskies all-time record in season openers in 112 seasons since 1892 is now 51-57-4, and in 112 home openers is 69-38-5. Ten straight wins in home openers ties the school record set from 1947 to 1956.

A FAMILY AFFAIR: Huskies sophomore fullback **Matt Cox** comes from a family of fullbacks. His father, Lawrence, played at Temple from 1979-82; his older brother Mike played collegiately at Georgia Tech from 2004-07 and is currently in his second year with the Kansas City Chiefs; and younger brother Lucas is a junior at Georgia Tech.

Coincidentally, current BU assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, **Paul Darragh**, began his playing career at Temple during Lawrence's final year.

HUSKIES IN THE PLAYOFFS: BU has made the NCAA Division II playoffs in three of the past four seasons and seven times overall. The Huskies claim a 7-7 overall playoff record, including a 5-2 mark games played at Redman Stadium. Last year BU faced two PSAC foes in second round opponent West Chester and California (PA) in the quarterfinals. Bloomsburg defeated the Golden Rams 28-21 before falling to the Vulcans, 27-24.

The Huskies also reached the NCAA playoffs after the 1985, 1996, 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2006 seasons. In 2000, Bloomsburg went 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing to Delta State in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win.

BU VS. RANKED OPPONENTS: Through the years, the Huskies have found success against other top schools in Division II, compiling a 27-34-1 record against ranked teams since 1985. That record has improved since 2000, as BU has gone 18-15, including a 11-5 mark against ranked opponents at Redman Stadium.

Among the 18 victories this decade are home wins against No. 5 IUP, No. 10 Northwood and No. 13 Millersville in 2000; No. 23 West Chester in 2005; No. 17 California in 2006; No. 5 California in 2008; and No. 15 Ashland in 2009. Away wins include No. 2 Cal-Davis and No. 11 Slippery Rock in 2000; No. 3 East Stroudsburg in 2005; No. 5 Shepherd in 2006; and No. 15 Ashland in 2008.

TEAM OF THE DECADE: From 2000-2008, the Huskies have been the most dominant team in the PSAC, boasting an overall record of 84-22 (.792). In those nine seasons, Bloomsburg has made the playoffs five times and has a conference record of 48-6 (.889).

REDMAN AT NIGHT: Last Thursday's game was the very first night game at Redman Stadium. Lights were added prior to the 2008 season, however the latest start time for a game was 3:30 p.m. The Huskies will have another late start this week when they travel to California to play

the Vulcans and will play host to the Marauders of Millersville on Saturday, October 3 at 5 p.m.

FOR OPENERS: After the season opening win over Ashland, the Huskies are now 30-41-2 in season openers from 1935-2009. Bloomsburg has found early season success recently, going 6-1 in openers since 2003. The lone loss came at the hands of Division I-FCS opponent James Madison, 14-3, in Harrisonburg, Virginia. Danny Hale is 9-8 in season openers at Bloomsburg, including a 6-2 record in home openers.

BU VS. RANKED OPPONENTS: Through the years, the Huskies have found success against other top schools in Division II, compiling a 26-34-1 record against ranked teams since 1985. That record has improved since 2000, as BU has gone 17-15, including a 10-5 mark against ranked opponents at Redman Stadium.

Among the 17 victories this decade are home wins against No. 5 IUP, No. 10 Northwood and No. 13 Millersville in 2000; No. 23 West Chester in 2005; No. 17 California in 2006; and No. 5 California in 2008. Danny Hale

Bloomsburg University Head Coach



Danny Hale, one of the winningest coaches in all of Division II, will begin his 17th season at the helm of the Huskies in 2009. Hale also spent five years as head coach at West Chester University.

At Bloomsburg, Hale has posted a career record of 137-46-1 (.747) and holds the school record for most coaching victories. Overall in 21 years as a head coach he has a mark of 177-59-1 (.749) and is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in NCAA Division II in winning percentage. In his 16 seasons as head coach at Bloomsburg he has led the Huskies to 10 outright or shared Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern

Division titles and six NCAA post-season playoff berths. In the period from 2000 to 2008 the Huskies are also one of the most successful NCAA Division II programs with a combined record of 84-22 (.792).

In 2008 the Huskies started the season winning the first nine games of the year, including wins over nationally-ranked Ashland and California (Pa). Bloomsburg earned a bid to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the sixth time overall, and fifth time this decade, reaching the NCAA Region One finals.

In 2006, the Huskies posted a mark of 12-2 and won the PSAC Eastern Division title, while also capturing the NCAA Northeast Regional title and advancing to the NCAA Division II national semi-finals. Hale was named the PSAC East Coach of the Year, the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division II District I Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year award. By virtue of being a finalist for the award he was featured on an ABC-TV special hosted by Keith Jackson.

In 2005, Hale led the Huskies to a record of 11-1, including an unbeaten (11-0) mark in the regular season. It was just the fourth time in school history that a Bloomsburg team went through the regular season without a loss. He also earned PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year honors and the AFCA District One Coach of the Year award.

The Huskies have reached the NCAA playoffs in 1996, 2000 and 2001 seasons. During the 2000 season the Huskies were 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win. Hale earned the American Football Coaches Association Division II National Coach of the Year following the season.

At West Chester Hale posted a mark of 40-13 and won three PSAC East titles and advanced to the NCAA playoffs in 1988.

Prior to West Chester, Hale was an offensive line and defensive coordinator at Colgate from 1981 to 1983. Prior to Colgate, Hale was the offensive line coach at Bucknell from 1975-80 and was defensive coordinator/linebacker coach at Vermont in 1974.

Hale is a graduate of West Chester, earning his bachelor's and master's degrees in Health and Physical Education in 1968 and 1973. He was an all-conference pick at West Chester and earned the team's most valuable player in the 1967 State Championship game, while also lettering three times for the track and field team. He is a member of the West Chester Football Hall of Fame and the Delaware County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

In 1968 Hale signed with the Pottstown Firebirds, the semi professional farm club of the Philadelphia Eagles, before entering the Marine Corps where he played middle linebacker for the Quantico Marines. Following a three-year stint, he was honorably discharged as a first lieutenant in 1972.

2009 Game Recaps

Bloomsburg 10, Ashland 7 August 27, 2009

BLOOMSBURG-Senior running back **Stefan Adams** ran for 104 yards, including a key 46-yard run in the fourth quarter, as Bloomsburg University defeated Ashland 10-7 in a battle between two nationally ranked football teams on Thursday night at Redman Stadium.

The 13th-ranked Huskies (1-0) got on the board first with a 28-yard field goal by senior **Jon Koenig** at the 11:11 mark in the first quarter. The kick came after a nine-play, 29-yard drive that was set up by a 42 yard kickoff return by senior cornerback **Jesse Cooper**.

After 15th-ranked Ashland's (0-1) first drive stalled at the Bloomsburg 34, the Eagles tried some trickery when punter Derek Reidel's fourth-down pass was intercepted by sophomore cornerback **Oscar Rivera**. The Huskies then started an eight-play, 85-yard drive that ended when senior quarterback **Dan Latorre** bolted into the endzone from eight yards out to put Bloomsburg up 10-0.

The Huskies defense controlled Ashland for most of the game, forcing two fumbles, two punts and stopping the Eagles four times on fourth down plays through nearly three quarters of play. Seniors **Justin Presley** and **Anthony Smith** led a Bloomsburg goal line stand late in the second quarter, coming up with three stops inside the Husky one yard line.

The Eagles closed the Bloomsburg advantage to three late in the third when Carlin Isles scored from 50 yards out to make the score 10-7. However, the Husky defense stifled Ashland's fourth quarter drives, registering three sacks and forcing Billy Cundiff into 4-of-11 passing for just 24 yards.

Smith led Bloomsburg with 11 tackles while Presley recorded eight, including three sacks. Smith, senior **Alphonso Nathan**, and juniors **Marcus Zimmerman** and **Todd Givler** were also able to get to Cundiff, combining for three sacks.

Latorre finished the game 16-of-28 for 158 yards, while rushing for an additional 18 yards on eight carries. Four of Latorre's runs went for key Bloomsburg first downs. Senior **Jordan Weisman** and sophomore **Branden Wright** each caught four passes for the Huskies.
