MATCH UP: The fifth-ranked Huskies go on the road to face PSAC East rival East Stroudsburg. BU enters with a record of 6-0, 3-0 in the PSAC while the Warriors have a record of 5-1, 2-1 in the conference. ESU enters Saturday's matchup coming off a big 21-20 win over West Chester. Last week, Bloomsburg defeated Millersville 45-10, racking up 240 yards and four touchdowns on the ground. **Brandon Real** posted 155 combined return yards, including a 68-yard punt return for a touchdown and **Dan Latorre** had 184 yards of total offense and three total touchdowns.

THE HEAD COACHES: Huskies coach **Danny Hale** (West Chester '68) is in his 17th year on the Bloomsburg sideline, racking up a 142-46-1 (.754) record. The 142 wins are first all-time in school history. For his career, Hale is 182-59-1 and his winning percentage of .754 is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in Division II. Hale has led BU to six playoff appearances, including the latest in 2008. He has been honored as the PSAC East Coach of the Year 10 times, the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year nine times, and was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year following the 2000 season.

Denny Douds (Slippery Rock '63) is in his 36th year as head coach at East Stroudsburg. Douds, the PSAC record-holder with 223 career wins, is one of 16 coaches in all of college football with 200 victories. He has led the Warriors to nine PSAC titles and three NCAA playoff appearances, the last being in 2005.

HALE IN THE PSAC: With last week's win over Millersville, Danny Hale has moved into a tie with IUP's Frank Cignetti for third most career PSAC victories with 182. A win over East Stroudsburg would move Hale into sole possession of third place, behind ESU's Denny Douds (currently 223) and Millersville's Gene Carpenter (212).

REGIONAL RANKINGS: The Huskies debuted at No. 1 in the first NCAA Division II Regional Football Poll of 2009. The poll, which determines playoff seeding in each region, was released on Monday with the Huskies and their 6-0 record in the top spot of Super Regional One. Fellow PSAC schools Edinboro (third), Slippery Rock (fourth), East Stroudsburg (fifth) and California (seventh) are also ranked in the top 10.

TEAM OF THE DECADE: From 2000-2009, the Huskies have been the most dominant team in the PSAC, boasting an overall record of 90-22 (.804). So far this decade, Bloomsburg has made the playoffs five times and has a conference record of 51-6 (.895).

BEASTS OF THE EAST: Dating back to 2005, the Huskies own a 29-3 record against PSAC East foes. During that span, BU is 15-2 against the East at home and 14-1 away from Redman Stadium. 24 of the 29 wins have come while ranked in the top 25.

WINNING WHEN THEY'RE RANKED: Bloomsburg has flexed its muscles when ranked in the top 25 posting a 79-19 overall record since 1985. The Huskies are 72-13 when ranked in the regular season and 38-12 while on the road.

LAST MEETING

Bloomsburg 42, East Stroudsburg 23 October 11, 2008

BLOOMSBURG-- **Derrick Price** rushed for 113 yards and a score and the Bloomsburg University defense converted two turnovers into touchdowns to lead the Huskies to a 42-23 win over East Stroudsburg on Saturday.

Bloomsburg's defense made the first big play in the game when **Vince Browning** intercepted a Tim Roken pass on the game's opening drive and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown. The Huskies added to their lead on their first drive of the game marching 98-yards in 16 plays with **Stefan Adams** covering the last three yards to give Bloomsburg a 14-0 after one period.

The defense made its second big play of the game late in the first period when **Jesse Cooper** recovered a fumble by Joe Patridge and returned it 20 yards to the Warriors 41-yard line. Eight plays later Adams scored his second touchdown of the game to make it 21-0.

After the Bloomsburg defense forced a three and out, quarterback **Dan Latorre** connected with **Kyle Ream** on a 77-yard scoring pass for 28-0 lead with 10:04 left in the second.

East Stroudsburg finally broke through with a 51-yard scoring drive to make it 28-7 with 4:04 left to play before halftime.

The Huskies put up one more score before halftime when Price, who leads the PSAC in rushing, ran 34-yards for a score to give Bloomsburg a 35-7 lead at the break.

ESU began to chip away at the lead in the third period. Roken hit Doug Ogden with a five-yard scoring pass to cap a 67-yard drive.

Early in the fourth quarter the Warriors defense sacked Latorre in the end zone for a safety bringing the Warriors to within 35-16 with 13:23 left in the game. After the Huskies free kick to the Warriors gave ESU the ball at their own 46-yard line, Roken put together a three-play drive with Patridge scoring from four yards to make it a 35-23 game with 12:14 to go in the game.

After a short kickoff and a personal foul gave the Huskies the ball at midfield, Latorre hit **Jordan Weisman** with 30-yard scoring strike on 4th down to put the game out of reach at 42-23.

SCOUTING EAST STROUDSBURG: The Warriors come into Saturday's matchup averaging 400.8 yards and 29 points per game. The ESU offense is led by Matt Marshall, who ranks first in the PSAC with passer rating of 158.3, second with 229.2 passing yards per game and third with 12 touchdowns. The Warriors feature a group of three veteran receivers that each average over 15 yards per catch. As a group, Jeff Giglio, Ed Kiser and Sam Shuman have combined for 251 receptions for 4,200 yards and 33 touchdowns during their career. The running game has had multiple contributors, including true freshmen Kendrick Williams and Eric Deery, who are averaging nearly 6.0 yards per carry.

ESU's defense showcases their four starting linebackers, each of whom has recorded at least 25 tackles this season. Matt Freed is fourth in the PSAC with 59 tackles (9.8 per game) and leads the team with 3.0 sacks and 5.5 tackles-for-loss. Safety Nick Artinger has posted three interceptions this season and cornerback David Castillo has two picks and four passes broken up. The Warriors defense has forced 13 turnovers so far in 2009.

Giglio also returns kickoffs for the Warriors, averaging 21.7 yards per return. Drew Reinhard handles kicking duties, going 3-of-6 in field goal attempts and converting 21 of his 24 extra points. Joseph Janovic averages 32.2 yards per punt, placing seven inside the 20-yard line.

THE GRADUATE: QB **Dan Latorre**, now in his fourth year as the starter, graduated as a triple major in the spring and is now in grad school. One of the best players to ever wear a Husky uniform, Latorre, who was named first team

All-PSAC East last year, heads into the 2009 season third all-time in school history in both yards passing and touchdowns and is the all-time leader in rushing yards by a quarterback.

MR. EVERYTHING: Latorre is featured in the latest edition of *Bloomsburg: The University Magazine*. The story, written by Husky play-by-play commentator Jim Doyle, details Latorre's athletic and academic accomplishments. In addition to receiving first-team All-PSAC honors for his play in 2008, Latorre earned a 3.78 grade point average while taking 19 credits.

GETTING A GRAND: With his game-high 86 yards in the win over Mercyhurst, sophomore TB **Kenny Domzalski** went over 1,000 rushing yards in his career. In his freshman year of 2008, he ran for 878 yards, good for second on the team. So far this season, Domzalski is second on the Huskies with 303 yards on 80 carries. He now has 1,181 career rushing yards, 15th all-time at BU.

HITTING 100: Sophomore TB **Derrick Price** rushed for 100 yards in each of his first two games this season. Price ran 26 times for 185 yards, one yard shy of his career-high, two week ago vs. C.W. Post. In his first action of the season against Kutztown, he rushed for 105 yards and two touchdowns. Price has now rushed for 100 yards in a game nine times during his career. Senior FB **Stefan Adams** is the only other Husky to run for 100 yards in a game this season when he rushed for 104 yards on 15 carries against Ashland in the season opener.

WEARING 'EM DOWN: The Huskies have relied on successful 4th quarter running performances to wear down opponents and help gain victories over Ashland, Cal, Kutztown and C.W. Post. Against the Pioneers, the Huskies gained 89 yards on 15 carries with a touchdown in the 4th quarter. 81 of those yards came from Derrick Price. Against the Golden Bears, BU rushers gained 71 yards on 12 carries in the final stanza. Price totaled 50 yards on five carries, including a 29-yard touchdown run with 5:39 remaining. Stefan Adams ran nine times for 85 yards in the 4th against Ashland, helping BU hold the ball for 9:12. Kenny Domzalski had 47 of his team-high 68 yards in the final quarter against Cal, including a 25-yard jont on a key 3rd down.

SPREADING IT OUT: The Huskies have relied on several players to catch passes during their first six games of 2009. BU's 79 total completions have been spread out among 13 different receivers: Five wide receivers, five running backs and three tight ends. In last Saturday's game against Millersville, nine different players caught passes for the Huskies.

GOING DEEP: The Huskies have tried several deep passes each game in 2009, connecting on five passes of over 40 yards. Junior WR **Chris Tressler** has been the main beneficiary of those deep balls, recording a 47-yarder against Cal, a 41-yarder against Meryhurst, and another 47-yard pass against Kutztown. Senior WR **Jordan Weisman** has been on the receiving end of the other two 40-plus plays, catching a 40-yarder in the opener against Ashland and a 56-yarder against Kutztown.

NATIONALLY RANKED DEFENSE: The Huskies defense has dominated opponents this season, giving up just 10.0 points per game, which ranks first in the PSAC and is fourth in all of Division II. BU is also near the top nationally in total yards allowed (269.8 - 15th in DII; second in PSAC), rushing yards allowed (88.2 - 16th in DII; second in PSAC), redzone defense (56.2% - seventh in DII; first in PSAC) and fourth down defense (6.7% - sixth in DII; first in PSAC).

In addition, the BU defense averages 3.33 sacks per game (tied for 12th in DII), 7.50 tackles-for-loss per game (tied for 44th in DII), and forces opposing quarterbacks to post a pass efficiency rating of just 104.57 (24th in DII).

KEEPIN' IT LOW: The Huskies have kept opposing offenses at bay, allowing an average of just 10.0 points per game. What is even more impressive is the amount of points BU's opponents have scored against other teams. Ashland, which is averaging 35.6 points per game against its five other opponents, scored only seven against the Huskies. Cal, which managed only 10 points against BU, has averaged 35.0 points in other games, including 52 a few weeks ago.

A-TRAIN: Senior LB **Anthony Smith** leads all Husky defenders and is third in the PSAC with 62 tackles (10.3 pg) in 2009. The senior has been named PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week after games against Ashland, Mercyhurst and C.W. Post. Against the Eagles, Smith registered 11 tackles, including five solo, and a half-sack. He led keyed a goal line stand in the second quarter and helped lead a defense that allowed just 261 yards to one of the nation's top ranked offenses. Against Mercyhurst, Smith had another 11-tackle game and had his first career interception, which was returned 15 yards to set up a late 1st half score. Two weeks ago against the Pioneers, Smith recorded a career-high 19 tackles, a sack and a forced fumble to win the award for the third time this season.

THE 'BACKERS: Smith isn't the only linebacker making plays for the Huskies. Junior **Mike Varanavage** topped all tacklers against Cal with 10 and had 11 stops against C.W. Post. He is second on the team with 50 tackles this year, recording at least seven in every game. Varanavage also knocked down the Vulcans Hail Mary pass in the closing seconds to seal a 17-10 victory. Junior **Thomas McFarland** is fourth on the Huskies in tackles with 31, recording eight with one tackle-for-loss against Mercyhurst and seven last week against Millersville. Redshirt freshmen **Ryan Feldman** and **Jarrett Pidgeon** have also seen action in recent weeks, each posting career-highs in tackles against the Marauders (Feldman with five, Pidgeon with four.)

THE DBs: The BU defensive backs have helped the Huskies limit opponents to just 181.2 passing yards per game. Sophomore **Oscar Rivera** leads all Husky defensive backs and is third on the team with 34 tackles, including two tackles-for-loss. Rivera also has an interception and four pass breakups, including back-to-back breakups in the 3rd quarter against C.W. Post which helped end a Pioneers drive. Junior **Alex Landis** has recorded 27 tackles, including 0.5 tackle-for-loss. He has also posted an interception and four pass breakups in 2009.

Senior **Jesse Cooper** registered his first interception of the season against Mercyhurst and added four tackles, helping the defense hold the Lakers to 130 passing yards. Senior **Domenique Price** had the second pick of his career against the Lakers, and has chipped in with 20 tackles, two tackles-for-loss and four pass breakups this season. Sophomores **Vince Browning** and **Andre Glover** have received more playing time as the year has gone on, combining for 25 tackles, three pass breakups, and an interception by Browning in the win over C.W. Post. Junior **Dan Oliver** received his first significant playing time against tKutztown, notching four tackles and a pass breakup.

DOMINATING D-LINE: Senior **Justin Presley** leads the PSAC and is tied-for-second in Division II with seven sacks (1.17 pg) through six weeks of action and his 10.5 tackles-for-loss (1.75 pg) is also first in the conference. Presley has teamed with fellow senior **Alphonso Nathan** and juniors **Dave Huot** and **Marcus Zimmerman** to provide the defense with a constant pass rush and tackles behind the line of scrimmage. Huot and Zimmerman have combined for 24 tackles, including 10.5 tackles-for-loss and 4.0 sacks in 2009.

Junior **Todd Givler** and sophomores **Kenny Orlando** and **John Pettine** have also been threats to opposing offenses, combining for 31 tackles, 5.5 tackles-for-loss, 3.5 sacks and two pass breakups so far in 2009.

POSITIVE RETURNS: Freshman **Brandon Real** has found success returning kicks in his first season with the Huskies, averaging 27.4 yards on kickoff returns and 24.6 yards on punt returns. Last week against Millersville, Real had a 68-yard punt return for a touchdown and a 54-yard kickoff return. Jesse Cooper has also flashed big plays in the return game, returning the opening kickoffs against Ashland and Mercyhurst 42 and 44 yards, respectively. He also returned three punts for 49 yards, including a 28-yard return late in the 4th quarter, against Ashland.

JUST FOR KICKS: After going 6-for-6 on extra points against Millersville, senior **Jon Koenig** has extended his streak of consecutive made point-after kicks to 79. His streak started against Cheyney in 2007 and extended through 2008 when he connected on 54-of-54 kicks.

Koenig established a new career-long against Kutztown with a 50-yard field goal. The kick came at the 11:17 mark of the 4th quarter and put the Huskies up 24-6. This came one week after kicking a then-career-long 47-yard field goal against Mercyhurst. Koenig has also kicked a 42-yarder against Cal.

Last week, Koenig was honored as one of 13 recipients of the Fred Mitchell Award for the month of September. The award recognizes NCAA Division II and Division III place kickers for excellence on the football field and in the community.

KOENIG CLIMBING THE LIST: Koenig currently stands tied for third all-time in PSAC history in career PATs made with 161. He entered his final season with 146, 33 behind all-time leader Alex Walsh (179) of West Chester. Koenig now sits nine behind East Stroudsburg's Mark Brubaker, who finished his career with 170.

Bloomsburg University Football Game Notes

THE FRESHMEN: Kicker **Jared Shannon** has been one of a few true freshman getting playing time for the Huskies in 2009. Shannon handles BU's kickoffs and the Huskies rank first in the PSAC in kickoff average at 62.8 yards, and has five touchbacks. In other words, he routinely makes the returner field the kick inside their own 10-yard line. Given additional duties against C.W. Post, Shannon scored the first points of his career, going 4-for-4 on extra points.

In addition to his return duties, TB Brandon Real saw his first collegiate action earlier this year against Cal, carrying the ball eight times for 19 yards, including a 12-yard run on the Huskies first scoring drive early in the 2nd quarter. WR **Kyle Fisher** has played in three games this year for BU, making his mark on special teams. Fisher has three tackles this season, including two against Cal on kick coverage, and returned a kickoff 33 yards against Kutztown.

ROAD WARRIORS: BU has enjoyed much success on the road as of late. In their last 16 away games, the Huskies are 14-2 and win by an average margin of 28.5-16.3.

FROM THE ARCHIVES: The 35-3 halftime lead against Millersville was the largest for the Huskies since 2007 when they led Cheyney 34-0. It was the 13th time at Bloomsburg under Danny Hale that the team has enjoyed a halftime advantage of 30 points or more.

The win against Millersville was the 10th straight for Bloomsburg, only the sixth time in school history the Huskies have won that many against a single opponent. The other five are 19 times over Cheyney, 1990-present; 17 over Kutztown, 1993-present; 15 over Mansfield, 1948-1962; 14 over Mansfield, 1993-2006 (the streak is still technically active since Mansfield dropped football); and 10 over Lock Haven, 1993-2002. Only the Mansfield streak was in the pre-Danny Hale era.

The victory over Millersville clinched a school record 11th consecutive winning season for the Huskies, breaking the old mark of 10 set from 1946 to 1955.

The Huskies have gone six consecutive games giving up no more than 14 points for the first time since 2000, which is the longest at Bloomsburg under Coach Hale. The last time the team had a longer stretch was from 1950-1952 when they went 12 games.

Bloomsburg has won six straight to start the season for only the seventh time in school history. The other times were under Robert Redman (1948, 1950 and 1951), George Landis (1985), and twice before under Coach Hale (2005 and 2008).

A FAMILY AFFAIR: Huskies sophomore FB **Matt Cox** comes from a family of fullbacks. His father, Lawrence, played at Temple from 1979-82; his older brother Mike played collegiately at Georgia Tech from 2004-07 and is currently in his second year with the Kansas City Chiefs; and younger brother Lucas is a junior at Georgia Tech.

Coincidentally, current BU assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, **Paul Darragh**, began his playing career at Temple during Lawrence's final year.

CROSSING OVER: The Huskies record with teams in the PSAC West since 1999 - which included Shippensburg until 2008 - is 31-11. They have won six of their last seven games, including the 17-7 win over Mercyhurst. BU is 17-4 at Redman Stadium and 14-7 on the road.

HUSKIES IN THE PLAYOFFS: BU has made the NCAA Division II playoffs in three of the past four seasons and seven times overall. The Huskies claim a 7-7 overall playoff record, including a 5-2 mark games played at Redman Stadium. Last year BU faced two PSAC foes in second round opponent West Chester and California (PA) in the quarterfinals. Bloomsburg defeated the Golden Rams 28-21 before falling to the Vulcans, 27-24.

The Huskies also reached the NCAA playoffs after the 1985, 1996, 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2006 seasons. In 2000, Bloomsburg went 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing to Delta State in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win.

Danny Hale

Bloomsburg University Head Coach



Danny Hale, one of the winningest coaches in all of Division II, will begin his 17th season at the helm of the Huskies in 2009. Hale also spent five years as head coach at West Chester University.

At Bloomsburg, Hale has posted a career record of 142-46-1 (.754) and holds the school record for most coaching victories. Overall in 21 years as a head coach he has a mark of 182-59-1 (.754) and is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in NCAA Division II in winning percentage. In his 16 seasons as head coach at Bloomsburg he has led the Huskies to 10 outright or shared Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern

Division titles and six NCAA post-season playoff berths. In the period from 2000 to 2008 the Huskies are also one of the most successful NCAA Division II programs with a combined record of 84-22 (.792).

In 2008 the Huskies started the season winning the first nine games of the year, including wins over nationally-ranked Ashland and California (Pa). Bloomsburg earned a bid to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the sixth time overall, and fifth time this decade, reaching the NCAA Region One finals.

In 2006, the Huskies posted a mark of 12-2 and won the PSAC Eastern Division title, while also capturing the NCAA Northeast Regional title and advancing to the NCAA Division II national semi-finals. Hale was named the PSAC East Coach of the Year, the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division II District I Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year award. By virtue of being a finalist for the award he was featured on an ABC-TV special hosted by Keith Jackson.

In 2005, Hale led the Huskies to a record of 11-1, including an unbeaten (11-0) mark in the regular season. It was just the fourth time in school history that a Bloomsburg team went through the regular season without a loss. He also earned PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year honors and the AFCA District One Coach of the Year award.

The Huskies have reached the NCAA playoffs in 1996, 2000 and 2001 seasons. During the 2000 season the Huskies were 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win. Hale earned the American Football Coaches Association Division II National Coach of the Year following the season.

At West Chester Hale posted a mark of 40-13 and won three PSAC East titles and advanced to the NCAA playoffs in 1988.

Prior to West Chester, Hale was an offensive line and defensive coordinator at Colgate from 1981 to 1983. Prior to Colgate, Hale was the offensive line coach at Bucknell from 1975-80 and was defensive coordinator/linebacker coach at Vermont in 1974.

Hale is a graduate of West Chester, earning his bachelor's and master's degrees in Health and Physical Education in 1968 and 1973. He was an all-conference pick at West Chester and earned the team's most valuable player in the 1967 State Championship game, while also lettering three times for the track and field team. He is a member of the West Chester Football Hall of Fame and the Delaware County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

In 1968 Hale signed with the Pottstown Firebirds, the semi professional farm club of the Philadelphia Eagles, before entering the Marine Corps where he played middle linebacker for the Quantico Marines. Following a three-year stint, he was honorably discharged as a first lieutenant in 1972.

Game 1

Bloomsburg 10, Ashland 7 August 27, 2009

BLOOMSBURG-Senior running back **Stefan Adams** ran for 104 yards, including a key 46-yard run in the fourth quarter, as Bloomsburg University defeated Ashland 10-7 in a battle between two nationally ranked football teams on Thursday night at Redman Stadium.

The 13th-ranked Huskies (1-0) got on the board first with a 28-yard field goal by senior **Jon Koenig** at the 11:11 mark in the first quarter. The kick came after a nine-play, 29-yard drive that was set up by a 42 yard kickoff return by senior cornerback **Jesse Cooper**.

After 15th-ranked Ashland's (0-1) first drive stalled at the Bloomsburg 34, the Eagles tried some trickery when punter Derek Reidel's fourth-down pass was intercepted by sophomore cornerback **Oscar Rivera**. The Huskies then started an eight-play, 85-yard drive that ended when senior quarterback **Dan Latorre** bolted into the endzone from eight yards out to put Bloomsburg up 10-0.

The Huskies defense controlled Ashland for most of the game, forcing two fumbles, two punts and stopping the Eagles four times on fourth down plays through nearly three quarters of play. Seniors **Justin Presley** and **Anthony Smith** led a Bloomsburg goal line stand late in the second quarter, coming up with three stops inside the Husky one yard line.

The Eagles closed the Bloomsburg advantage to three late in the third when Carlin Isles scored from 50 yards out to make the score 10-7. However, the Husky defense stifled Ashland's fourth quarter drives, registering three sacks and forcing Billy Cundiff into 4-of-11 passing for just 24 yards.

Smith led Bloomsburg with 11 tackles while Presley recorded eight, including three sacks. Smith, senior **Alphonso Nathan**, and juniors **Marcus Zimmerman** and **Todd Givler** were also able to get to Cundiff, combining for three sacks.

Latorre finished the game 16-of-28 for 158 yards, while rushing for an additional 18 yards on eight carries. Four of Latorre's runs went for key Bloomsburg first downs. Senior **Jordan Weisman** and sophomore **Branden Wright** each caught four passes for the Huskies.

CALIFORNIA,PA- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** hit **Cory Stiger** with a four-yard touchdown pass with 22 seconds left to play to lift the sixth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies over 17th-ranked California (PA), 17-10, on Saturday night.

After Cal (0-2) had tied the game at 10-10 on an 18-yard scoring pass from Josh Portis to AJ Jackson with a minute to play, the Huskies (2-0) started their game winning drive on their own 39-yard line. After Latorre's first pass fell incomplete, he scrambled for 10 yards out to the Huskies 49-yard line. Following a timeout with 36 seconds to play, the senior quarterback hit a wide-open **Chris Tressler** with a 47-yard bomb to the Vulcans four-yard line. On the next play, Latorre hit Stiger with a touchdown pass, Stiger's first career scoring catch, to put Bloomsburg in front 17-10 with 22 seconds to play.

After an incomplete pass left just one second to play, Portis' last pass was knocked down by the Huskies **Mike Varanavage** preserving the Bloomsburg win.

The game was a back and forth struggle between the defenses with the only scoring threw the first three quarters being a field goal from Jon Koenig from 42-yards out which tied his career long with 12:47 to play in the second period. In the third period, Cal's Kevin Hagerman connected from 30-yards out tying the score at 3-3 heading to the fourth period.

Bloomsburg went in front 10-3 on a special teams play. A long punt from Bloomsburg was muffed by Cal's Mike Brown and recovered in the end zone by Bloomsburg's **Branden Wright** with 4:29 to play setting up the wild finish.

Latorre finished 12-22 for 166 yards and one score, while **Ben Weaber** caught five passes for 37 yards to lead the receivers. Varanavage finished with 10 tackles and the one key pass break-up, while **Anthony Smith** added eight tackles.

Bloomsburg 17, Mercyhurst 7 September 12, 2009

ERIE-- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** rushed for one score and passed for another to lead fifth-ranked Bloomsburg University to a 17-7 win over Mercyhurst College on Saturday. The win was the 10th straight road win for the Huskies dating back to 2007.

After a scoreless opening period of the game, the Huskies (3-0) finally got on the board on a career-best 47-yard field goal from **Jon Koenig** with two minutes left in the half. The senior's kick capped an eight-play, 46-yard for the Huskies that included a 20-yard run from **Kenny Domzalski** and an 18-yard pass from Latorre to **Ben Weaber**.

On the ensuing drive for the drive Mercyhurst (1-2) quarterback Joe Laffey had a pass intercepted by Bloomsburg linebacker **Anthony Smith** who returned the ball to the Laker 23-yard line 1:03 left in the period. The Huskies drove to the Mercyhurst one-yard line, aided with a pass interference call, which set up a one-yard run from Latorre with 19 seconds left in the half making it 10-0 at the break.

Bloomsburg made it 17-0 early in the fourth period when **Cory Stiger** caught a four-yard scoring pass from Latorre to cap a 44-yard scoring drive. The big play in the drive was a 41-yard reception by **Chris Tressler** putting the Huskies in scoring position.

Mercyhurst finally got on the board in the fourth period when Laffey completed a one-yard pass to Josh Szeluga with 6:08 to go. The Lakers would get the ball back two more times in the final six minutes, but the Bloomsburg defense stopped the Lakers on both occasions. On a fourth and two at the Bloomsburg 38, the Huskies **Thomas McFarland** made a stop for a loss of two yards to turn the ball over on downs, while **Domenique Price** intercepted a pass on Mercyhurst's final drive to seal the victory.

Domzalski rushed for a game-high 86 yards and went over 1,000 yards for his career. Latorre finished 12-24 for 112 yards and one score. Defensively, Smith had another big game for the Huskies with a team-high 11 tackles, seven of them solo. He also intercepted one pass and broke up another. As a team, Bloomsburg allowed just one touchdown for the third straight game and allowed just 192 yards of total offense. Mercyhurst quarterback Joe Laffey was 19-36 for 130 yards and one interception.

Bloomsburg 31, Kutztown 12 September 19, 2009

KUTZTOWN-- The fourth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies extended their road winning streak to 11 games with a 31-12 win over Kutztown University on Saturday night.

Bloomsburg (4-0, 1-0 in the PSAC East) took the lead midway through the first period when sophomore **Derrick Price**, seeing his first action of the season, scored on a three-yard run with 5:39 left in the first period. The score capped a 91-yard drive with the big play being a 56-yard completion from **Dan Latorre** to **Jordan Weisman**.

Kutztown (2-2, 0-1 PSAC East) got on the board at 10:18 of the second on a 30-yard field goal by Matt Dineen. The points were the first scored against the Huskies defense in the first half this season.

The final minute of the first half would prove to be a turning point in the game. Bloomsburg would score with 33 seconds to go before half when **Dylan Manni** caught a two-yard pass from Latorre to make it 14-3.

On Kutztown's next possession, BU linebacker **Anthony Smith** made an interception for the second straight game and returned the ball 34-yards to the Kutztown three-yard line with just 16 seconds to play. Latorre then hit **Chris Tressler** with a three-yard scoring pass to extend the Huskies lead to 21-3. The extra point by **Jon Koenig** pushed his streak of consecutive PAT's to 72.

Late in the third period with Kutztown at the Bloomsburg 10-yard line, a sack by Smith and **Todd Givler** pushed the Golden Bears back and forced them to settle for a 33-yard field goal by Dineen early in the fourth period.

Koenig pushed the Huskies lead to 24-6, when the senior stepped back and drilled a career-long 50-yard field goal. It was just a week ago that Koenig hit a then career-long 47-yard field goal.

Later in the period the Huskies made it a 31-6 game when Price would run 29-yards for a score with 5:39 left in the game. Kutztown tacked on a late score to make the final 31-12.

Price finished with 105 yards rushing and two scores, while Smith was one of four defenders with seven tackles each for the Huskies.

Bloomsburg 28, C.W. Post 14 September 26, 2009

BLOOMSBURG-Sophomore **Derrick Price** ran for 185 yards and three touchdowns as No. 4 Bloomsburg University defeated C.W. Post 28-14 in PSAC football action on Saturday afternoon at Redman Stadium.

The Huskies (5-0, 2-0) got on the scoreboard first at the 10:57 mark in the first quarter with a 20-yard touchdown pass from senior **Dan Latorre** to junior **Cory Stiger**. This capped off a four-play, 62-yard drive. Freshman **Jared Shannon** tacked on the extra point to give Bloomsburg an early 7-0 lead.

The Pioneers (1-4, 1-1) struck back with an eight-play drive that covered 80 yards, resulting in a 17-yard scoring toss from Eric Anderwkavich to Chris Harris to tie the score at 7-7.

Starting at their own 33-yard line, the Huskies regained the lead using first down receptions by Stiger and several runs by sophomore **Kenny Domzalski** to get the ball to the C.W. Post one-yard line. A second down touchdown run by Price helped stretch the Huskies lead to 14-7.

The Huskies defense made two second quarter stops when they forced a turnover on downs inside their own 10-yard line and got an interception by sophomore **Vince Browning**, ending the late first half drive.

The Huskies would increase their lead less than five minutes into the second half when, after a 28-yard pass from Latorre to senior **Jordan Weisman**, Price galloped up the middle for a 33-yard touchdown run. The scoring drive covered 79 yards and used up just 1:35 on the clock.

The defenses tightened up as both teams traded punts and neither was able to get much going throughout the rest of the third and much of the fourth quarter. The Pioneers did find some offensive life and closed the gap to 21-14 on a 15-yard pass from Anderwkavich to Harris with 3:08 left in the game.

After a failed pouch kickoff gave the Huskies the ball at their own 49-yard line, Price went to work rushing four times for 44 yards to the Pioneers seven-yard line. After a three yard pass to sophomore **Dylan Manni**, Price busted up the middle for his third touchdown of the day to give the Huskies a 14-point advantage with 1:34 remaining.

Latorre finished 10-of-17 for 125 yards and a touchdown and Stiger caught four passes for 84 yards. Senior **Anthony Smith** led all tacklers with 19 stops, including a sack and a forced fumble. Junior **Mike Varanavage** recorded 11 tackles while sophomore **Oscar Rivera** had nine tackles and two pass breakups.

Bloomsburg 45, Millersville 10 October 3, 2009

BLOOMSBURG --Quarterback **Dan Latorre** rushed for two touchdowns and passed for another to lead the fourth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies to a 45-10 win over Millersville University on Saturday night. The win was the 90th win of this decade (2000-09) for the Huskies and giving them an overall mark of 90-22.

After the Huskies stopped the Marauders on the opening drive of the game, Bloomsburg moved the ball 75 yards in 11 plays with Latorre covering the final seven yards with his 20th career rushing touchdown with 5:17 left in the first period.

Bloomsburg went ahead 14-0 later in the first period when defensive end **Justin Presley** intercepted Millersville quarterback Bill Shirk at the Marauders 40-yard line and returned it seven yards to the 33. Three plays later tailback **Derrick Price** scored from three yards out to put the Huskies on top by two scores with 2:19 left in the first.

In the second period, the Huskies made it 21-0 when Price scored his second touchdown of the game, this one from four yards out with 12:48 left in the half. After the BU defense forced its second three and out of the game, the Huskies drove 55 yards in seven plays with Latorre hitting **Jordan Weisman** with a nine-yard scoring pass with 7:07 left before the break.

Millersville got on the board later in the second period putting together a 40 yard drive capped off by a 47-yard field goal by John Banzhof with 2:06 before halftime. The Huskies, though, answered right back. After a 54-yard kickoff return by **Brandon Real** gave Bloomsburg the ball at the Marauders 46-yard line, the Huskies drove downfield in five plays with Latorre running 17 yards down the sideline and diving to the end zone for a score and a 35-3 lead at the half.

Real brought the fans to their feet early in the third period when he took a punt at his own 32-yard line and found a seam in the center of the field and went 68 yards for a score. It was the Huskies first punt return for a score since the 2006 season.

In the fourth period the Huskies added to their score with a 22-yard field goal by **Jon Koenig** for a 45-3 lead for the Huskies. Millersville's Cardoza Jacks got the Marauders only score of the night when he scored from a yard out with 2:32 to play to make the final 45-10.

Latorre finished with 69 yards rushing on six carries and two scores and 10 of 12 passing for 115 yards and one score. Defensively, **Mike Varanavage** made eight tackles for Bloomsburg, while **Thomas McFarland** had seven.
