MATCH UP: The 10th-ranked Huskies host Gannon in a PSAC cross-over matchup and the final home game of the 2009 regular season. BU enters with an 8-2 record, 5-2 in the PSAC East after last week's 30-14 loss to West Chester, despite a career-high 350 yards and two touchdowns from Dan Latorre. The Huskies will look to end a two-game losing streak, their first multiple game losing streak since early in the 2007 season. The Golden Knights are 5-5, 3-4 in the PSAC West and have won three straight games. Gannon is looking for their first winning season since 2003.

THE HEAD COACHES: Huskies coach **Danny Hale** (West Chester '68) is in his 17th year on the Bloomsburg sideline, racking up a 144-48-1 (.749) record. The 144 wins are first all-time in school history. For his career, Hale is 184-61-1 and his winning percentage of .750 is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in Division II. Hale has led BU to six playoff appearances, including the latest in 2008. He has been honored as the PSAC East Coach of the Year 10 times, the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year nine times, and was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year following the 2000 season.

Jim Keirnan (St. Lawrence) is in his third season at the helm of the Gannon program and has shown considerable improvement each season. After going 1-10 in 2007, Keirnan guided Gannon to a 4-7 record last year, its first as a member of the PSAC, and is looking for its first winning season since 2003. Prior to Gannon, Keirnan was the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Saginaw Valley State for eight seasons, guiding one of Division II's top scoring offenses.

REGIONAL RANKINGS: The Huskies dropped to No. 5 in the latest NCAA Division II Regional Football Poll of 2009. The poll, which determines playoff seeding in each region, has BU ranked fifth in Super Regional One after back-to-back losses to Shippensburg and West Chester. The top six schools from each region make the playoffs, while the first two seeds receive first-round byes. This year, BU's region will be paired with Super Regional Four for the semifinal round. LAST MEETING

Bloomsburg 38, Gannon 10 November 8, 2008

ERIE-- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** threw for 208 yards and three touchdowns, two of them to **Kyle Ream**, to lead Bloomsburg University to a 38-10 win over Gannon University in the regular season finale for both teams. The Huskies end the season at 10-1, while Gannon falls to 4-7.

Bloomsburg got on the board late in the first period when Latorre hit Ream with 21-yard scoring pass with 37 seconds left in the period. The scoring drive was set up by the first career interception from **Alex Landis** and was helped by a 38-yard pass from Latorre to **Jordan Weisman**.

On the ensuing drive for Gannon, the Golden Knights quarterback Zack Boedicker was intercepted again, this time by **Jesse Cooper** who returned the ball 46-yards for a touchdown giving the Huskies two scores within a 56-second span.

The Huskies added to their lead when Latorre connected with Ream on a 19-yard yard pass play to make it a 21-0 lead with 11:06 left to play in the second period. Latorre then used his legs to add to the Huskies lead when he ran 15-yards on a quarterback keeper to make it 28-0 at the break.

In the third period, the Huskies made it a 31-0 game when **Jon Koenig** connected on a 33-yard field goal capping a 12-play drive. Gannon finally got on the board in the third period when Jeremy Ditzler hit a 29-yard field goal with 1:20 to go.

In the fourth period the Huskies added a 15-yard scoring pass from Latorre to **Ryan Barr**, while Gannon scored its only touchdown of the game on a six-yard run by Boedicker with 4:33 left to play.

Latorre finished the day 14-21 for 208 yards and three scores, while Ream caught seven passes for 98 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, **Mike Varanavage** made 12 tackles.

SCOUTING GANNON: The Golden Knights boast one of the conference's top rushing offenses, putting up 178.1 yards per game. Three players contribute heavily in running backs Jon Richardson (86.6 ypg) and Tyler Batts (45.1) and quarterback Zach Boedicker (49.9). Gannon has scored a PSAC-high 23 rushing touchdowns, including 16 by Richardson, which ties him for first in the conference. Boedicker sprays his passes around evenly to a number of different receivers. Levar Goff and Corey Bradley lead the team with 20 receptions apiece while Geoff Hicks has scored three touchdowns on just 15 catches and averages 15.0 yards per reception. Richardson also figures heavy in the passing game, totaling 19 catches on the year.

Gannon ranks 11th in the conference in total defense, giving up 340 yards per game. Their rushing defense is 13th in the PSAC, as the Golden Knights give up 161.1 yards per game. Defensive back Matthew Neal-Mink leads the team and is fifth in the PSAC with 9.1 tackles per game. Defensive lineman Randy Colling applies the pressure for the defense with 5.5 sacks and 12.0 tackles-for-loss this year.

Jeremy Ditzler is one of the most accurate kickers in the conference, hitting on 9-of-12 field goals on the year with a long of 45 yards. Batts handles both kickoff and punt returns for Gannon, averaging 12.3 yards on 11 punt returns and 21.1 yards on 18 kickoff returns.

TEAM OF THE DECADE: From 2000-2009, the Huskies have been the most dominant team in the PSAC, boasting an overall record of 92-23 (.800). That winning percentage puts the the Huskies as the fifth winningest Division II team this decade. Grand Valley State (.907), Tuskegee (.848), Valdosta State (.836) and Northwest Missouri State (.836) sit in front of BU for the best winning percentages this decade. Since 2000, Bloomsburg has made the playoffs five times and has a conference record of 53-8 (.869).

BEASTS OF THE EAST: Dating back to 2005, the Huskies own a 31-5 record against PSAC East foes. During that span, BU is 16-3 against the East at home and 15-2 away from Redman Stadium. 26 of the 31 wins have come while ranked in the top 25.

WINNING WHEN THEY'RE RANKED: Bloomsburg has flexed its muscles when ranked in the top 25 posting a 81-21 overall record since 1985. The Huskies are 74-15 when ranked in the regular season and 39-13 on the road.

THE GRADUATE: QB **Dan Latorre**, now in his fourth year as the starter, graduated as a triple major in the spring and is now in grad school. One of the best players to ever wear a Husky uniform, Latorre was named first team All-PSAC in 2008 while taking 19 credits and earning a 3.78 grade point average. His 545 rushing yards last season was a record for a BU quarterback and with his 191 yards during 2007, he is closing in on 1,000 career rushing yards. Latorre currently stands at 869 yards.

THE RECORD BOOK: With his career-high 350 yards and two touchdowns on Saturday, Latorre moved into sole possession of second place in both passing yards (7,265) and passing touchdowns (59). He needs just 210 more yards to take over the top spot in BU history. Latorre is also first in career completion percentage and yards per completion. four times in the same game (Ashland, Mercyhurst and Millersville in 2008; Shippensburg in 2009). The Huskies are 9-2 when either player breaks the century mark in rushing.

In the past seven games, Krash and Dash have combined to rush 179 times for 1,148 yards and 15 touchdowns, with 13 runs of over 20 yards, including touchdown runs of 20 and 77 yards by Domzalski and 25 yards by Price against Shippensburg. Their combined average rushing yards per game (154.5) is second in the PSAC East among running duos. C.W. Post's Anthony Beverly and Eric Anderwkavich are first (165.0) and Cheyney's Ron Hunter and Angel Rodriguez are third (104.2).

THE PRICE IS RIGHT: Derrick Price leads the Huskies in rushing in 2009, averaging 98.3 yards in seven games. The sophomore is averaging 5.6 yards per carry and has 12 touchdowns. Price doesn't currently qualify for PSAC individual statistics because he has not played in 75 percent of the Huskies games, but if he did, he would rank second in rushing yards, second in scoring (10.3 points per game) and fifth in all-purpose yards (108.1 per game).

With his 165-yard performance at East Stroudsburg, Price entered BU's top-10 in career rushing yards and currently has 1,967. Price passed **Jerry Marks** (1988-91), who had 1,694 yards in his career with the Huskies. **Josh Heck** (2003-07) is ninth all-time with 2,115 rushing yards. Last year, Price ran for 1,279 yards and seven touchdowns, winning PSAC East Rookie of the Year and receiving first team All-PSAC East honors.

KENNY!: With his 121-yard effort against Shippensburg, Kenny Domzalski registered his fourth career 100-yard rushing game. He posted three during his freshman year, including a 172-yard effort in his very first game against Ashland.

With his game-high 86 yards in the win over Mercyhurst, Domzalski went over 1,000 rushing yards in his career. In his freshman year of 2008, he ran for 878 yards, good for second on the team. So far this season, Domzalski is second on the Huskies with 562 yards on 112 carries. He now has 1,440 career rushing yards, 527 behind Price for 10th in BU history.

WEARING 'EM DOWN: The Huskies have relied on successful 4th quarter running performances to wear down opponents and help gain victories over Ashland, Cal, Kutztown, C.W. Post and most recently, East Stroudsburg. Against the Warriors, BU ran a total of 15 times for 164 yards and two touchdowns from Price and Domzalski.

SPREADING IT OUT: The Huskies have relied on several players to catch passes during the 2009 season. BU's 130 total completions have been spread out among 15 different receivers: seven wide receivers, five running backs and three tight ends. Against Millersville, nine different players caught passes for the Huskies.

WEABER GRILLS OPPONENTS: So far in 2009, junior TE **Ben Weaber** has a career-high 25 catches for 328 yards. Against Shippensburg, Weaber made an incredible leaping 30-yard reception, falling back as he caught it. Against East

Stroudsburg, Weaber recorded a career-high six receptions for 69 yards. Many of his catches included stiff arming defenders and breaking tackles. Earlier in the season, Weaber made a nice, one-handed grab against Millersville right after snatching a sidearm shovel pass from a scrambling Latorre. For his career, Weaber has 47 receptions for 589 yards and a touchdown.

GOING DEEP: The Huskies have tried several deep passes each game in 2009, connecting on 14 passes of over 30 yards. Junior WR **Chris Tressler** has been the main beneficiary of those deep balls, recording four receptions each over 40 yards, including a 45-yarder against West Chester and a 41-yard catch against Shippensburg. Weaber has three of over 30 yards and senior WR **Jordan Weisman** has two, including a 56-yarder at Kutztown. Junior WR **Cory Stiger** has the Huskies longest reception of the year, a 57-yarder last week against West Chester.

NATIONALLY RANKED DEFENSE: The Huskies defense has dominated opponents this season, giving up just 13.7 points per game, which ranks first in the PSAC and is sixth in all of Division II. BU is also near the top nationally in total yards allowed (288.5 - 25nd in DII; fifth in PSAC), rushing yards allowed (98.8 - 22nd in DII; third in PSAC), redzone defense (67.9% - tied for 24th in DII; tied for second in PSAC) and fourth down defense (17.4% - third in DII; first in PSAC).

In addition, the BU defense averages 3.00 sacks per game (tied for 13th in DII), 7.30 tackles-for-loss per game (tied for 41st in DII), and forces opposing quarterbacks to post a pass efficiency rating of just 113.06 (39th in DII).

KEEPIN' IT LOW: The Huskies have kept opposing offenses at bay, allowing an average of just 13.7 points per game. What is even more impressive is the amount of points BU's opponents have scored against other teams. C.W. Post, which is averaging 30.9 points per game against its eight other opponents, scored only 14 against the Huskies. Cal, which managed only 10 points against BU, has averaged 37.0 points in other games, including 52 against Gannon and 44 against Slippery Rock.

A-TRAIN: Senior LB **Anthony Smith** leads all Husky defenders and is second in the PSAC and 19th in Division II with 105 tackles (10.5 pg) in 2009. The senior has been named PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week after games against Ashland, Mercyhurst and C.W. Post. Smith has recorded double-digit tackles six times this year, including four times in the last six games.

Against Ashland, Smith registered 11 tackles, including five solo, and a half-sack. He led keyed a goal line stand in the second quarter and helped lead a defense that allowed just 261 yards to one of the nation's top ranked offenses. Against Mercyhurst, Smith had another 11-tackle game and had his first career interception, which was returned 15 yards to set up a late 1st half score. Two weeks ago against the Pioneers, Smith recorded a career-high 19 tackles, a sack and a forced fumble to win the award for the third time this season. Against Shippensburg, Smith collected 14 tackles, his second highest output of the season, and one tackle-for-loss.

THE 'BACKERS: Smith isn't the only linebacker making plays for the Huskies. Junior **Mike Varanavage** topped all tacklers against Cal with 10 and against West Chester with 12. Against Shippensburg he had nine tackles and 2.5 tackles-for-loss, including the first sack of his career. He is second on the team and seventh in the PSAC with 84 tackles (8.4 pg) this year, recording at least seven in nine of the Huskies 10 games. Varanavage also knocked down the Vulcans Hail Mary pass in the closing seconds to seal a 17-10 victory.

Junior **Thomas McFarland** is third on the Huskies in tackles with 64, including a team-leading 10 against Cheyney and 11 against Shippensburg. He also recorded six with 3.0 tackles-for-loss and a sack against East Stroudsburg and eight with one tackle-for-loss against Mercyhurst.

Redshirt freshmen **Ryan Feldman** and **Jarrett Pidgeon** have also seen action in recent weeks, each posting career-highs in tackles against Millersville (Feldman with five, Pidgeon with four). Feldman also had a key forced fumble in the third quarter against East Stroudsburg that was recovered by the Huskies.

DOMINATING D-LINE: Senior **Justin Presley** is first in the PSAC and is tied for 25th in Division II with 9.0 sacks (0.90 pg) and his 14.5 tackles-for-loss (1.45 pg) is second in the conference. Presley has teamed with fellow senior **Alphonso Nathan** and juniors **Dave Huot** and **Marcus Zimmerman** to provide the defense with a constant pass rush and tackles behind the line of scrimmage. That trio has combined for 21.0 tackles-for-loss and 11.0 sacks this season.

Junior **Todd Givler** and sophomores **Kenny Orlando** and **John Pettine** have also been threats to opposing offenses, combining for 48 tackles, 8.5 tackles-for-loss, 4.5 sacks and two pass breakups so far in 2009.

THE DBs: Sophomore **Oscar Rivera** leads all Husky defensive backs and is fourth on the team with 57 tackles from his cornerback spot, including 3.0 tackles-for-loss. Rivera also has an interception and is third in the PSAC with 11 passes defensed, including four against Shippensburg. Junior **Alex Landis** has recorded 45 tackles and has an interception, two forced fumbles and six pass breakups this year.

Senior **Jesse Cooper** has been rarely tested this year, but has turned in some key defensive plays. He recorded a pass breakup on a key third down and returned a fumble 29 yards in the second quarter against East Stroudsburg and picked off a pass against Mercyhurst. Senior **Domenique Price** picked off his second pass of the season against the Warriors and has chipped in with 34 tackles, 4.0 tackles-for-loss and five pass breakups this season.

Sophomores **Vince Browning** and **Andre Glover** have received more playing time as the year has gone on, combining for 34 tackles, four pass breakups and two interceptions. Junior **Dan Oliver** received his first significant playing time against Kutztown, notching four tackles and a pass breakup. He is tied for ninth on the Huskies with 33 tackles and has two pass breakups this year.

POSITIVE RETURNS: Freshman **Brandon Real** has found success returning kicks in his first season with the Huskies. He ranks second in the PSAC and fifth in the nation with a 19.0-yard average on 10 punt returns and has a 22.5-yard kickoff return average. Real had a 68-yard punt return for a touchdown against Millersville and has kickoff returns of 51 (vs. Cheyney) and 54 (vs. Millersville) yards this season. Jesse Cooper has also flashed big plays in the return game, returning the opening kickoffs against Ashland and Mercyhurst 42 and 44 yards, respectively. He is averaging 24.3 yards on kickoff returns and has 11 punt returns for 52 yards, including a 28-yard return late in the 4th quarter against Ashland.

JUST FOR KICKS: After going 2-for-2 on extra points against West Chester, senior **Jon Koenig** extended his streak of consecutive made point-after kicks to 91. His streak started against Cheyney in 2007 and extended through 2008 when he connected on 54-of-54 kicks.

Koenig established a new career-long against Kutztown with a 50-yard field goal. The kick came at the 11:17 mark of the 4th quarter and put the Huskies up 24-6. For the season he is 5-for-8 on field goals of 40-plus yards this year, including a 49-yarder against East Stroudsburg and a 45-yarder against Shippensburg.

In the first week of October, Koenig was honored as one of 13 recipients of the Fred Mitchell Award for the month of September. The award recognizes NCAA Division II and Division III place kickers for excellence on the football field and in the community.

KOENIG CLIMBING THE LIST: After his three extra points against the Red Raiders, Koenig moved into second place all-time in PSAC history in career PATs and currently has 173. He entered his final season with 146, 33 behind all-time leader Alex Walsh (179) of West Chester. Koenig now sits six behind West Chester's Alex Walsh, who finished his career with 179.

With his two field goals against Shippensburg, Koenig is now tied with **Bill Beall** (1992-95) and **Mark Weiss** (1988-91) for the most field goals made in BU history with 29. With nine

field goals this season he is tied for second all-time in a single season with Weiss, who also had nine in 1989. **Chris Mingrone** had 10 in 1986. Koenig also has the school record for most 40-plus yard field goals in a season with five and in a career with eight.

THE FRESHMEN: Kicker **Jared Shannon** has been one of a few true freshman getting playing time for the Huskies in 2009. He handles BU's kickoffs and the Huskies rank first in the PSAC in kickoff average at 62.4 yards, and Shannon has a PSAC-high seven touchbacks. In other words, he routinely makes the returner field the kick around their own seven-yard line. Given additional duties against C.W. Post, Shannon scored the first points of his career, going 4-for-4 on extra points.

In addition to his return duties, TB Brandon Real saw his first collegiate action earlier this year against Cal, carrying the ball eight times for 19 yards, including a 12-yard run on the Huskies first scoring drive early in the 2nd quarter. Real has 18 carries for 46 yards on the year. WR **Kyle Fisher** has played in four games this year for BU, making his mark on special teams. Fisher has four tackles this season, including two against Cal on kick coverage, and returned a kickoff 33 yards against Kutztown. Fisher saw his first action on offense against Cheyney, catching a swing pass for nine yards and losing one yard on a reverse.

FROM THE ARCHIVES: The Huskies 24.4 points per game average is the lowest in the Danny Hale-era since 19.5 in 1993. BU has scored 40 points just one time this season, also the lowest since 1993 when the Huskies reached the 40-point mark against Kutztown with 47 points.

The back-to-back losses to Shippensburg and West Chester marks only the fourth time this decade Bloomsburg has lost two in a row. The last time the Huskies lost two PSAC East games in a row was 1999 when they dropped games to Millersville and West Chester.

Against West Chester the Huskies trailed at halftime for the first time this season. In the 193 games Danny Hale has coached at Bloomsburg his record leading at the half is 122-11; trailing is 17-35-1; and tied is 5-2.

A victory Saturday over Gannon would be the 120th all-time for the Huskies in Redman Stadium since the first season in 1974. Their current mark is 119-64-4, and under Danny Hale they are 75-18-1 at home.

HALE IN THE PSAC: With the win over East Stroudsburg, Danny Hale moved into sole possession of third place for most career PSAC victories and now has 184. Hale was previously tied with IUP's Frank Cignetti and now stands behind ESU's Denny Douds (currently 225) and Millersville's Gene Carpenter (212).

A FAMILY AFFAIR: Huskies sophomore FB **Matt Cox** comes from a family of fullbacks. His father, Lawrence, played at Temple from 1979-82; his older brother Mike played collegiately at Georgia Tech from 2004-07 and is currently in his second year with the Kansas City Chiefs; and younger brother Lucas is a junior at Georgia Tech.

Coincidentally, current BU assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, **Paul Darragh**, began his playing career at Temple during Lawrence's final year.

HUSKIES IN THE PLAYOFFS: BU has made the NCAA Division II playoffs in three of the past four seasons and seven times overall. The Huskies claim a 7-7 overall playoff record, including a 5-2 mark in games played at Redman Stadium. Last year BU faced two PSAC foes in second round opponent West Chester and California (PA) in the quarterfinals. Bloomsburg defeated the Golden Rams 28-21 before falling to the Vulcans, 27-24.

The Huskies also reached the NCAA playoffs after the 1985, 1996, 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2006 seasons. In 2000, Bloomsburg went 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing to Delta State in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win.

BU VS. RANKED OPPONENTS: Through the years, the Huskies have found success against other top schools in Division II, compiling a 28-34-1 record against ranked teams since 1985. That record has improved since 2000, as BU has gone 19-15, including a 11-5 mark against ranked opponents at Redman Stadium.

Among the 19 victories this decade are home wins against No. 5 IUP, No. 10 Northwood and No. 13 Millersville in 2000; No. 23 West Chester in 2005; No. 17 California in 2006; No. 5 California in 2008; and No. 15 Ashland in 2009. Away wins include No. 2 Cal-Davis and No. 11 Slippery Rock in 2000; No. 3 East Stroudsburg in 2005; No. 5 Shepherd in 2006; No. 15 Ashland in 2008; and No. 17 California in 2009.

Danny Hale

Bloomsburg University Head Coach



Danny Hale, one of the winningest coaches in all of Division II, will begin his 17th season at the helm of the Huskies in 2009. Hale also spent five years as head coach at West Chester University.

At Bloomsburg, Hale has posted a career record of 144-48-1 (.749) and holds the school record for most coaching victories. Overall in 21 years as a head coach he has a mark of 184-61-1 (.750) and is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in NCAA Division II in winning percentage. In his 16 seasons as head coach at Bloomsburg he has led the Huskies to 10 outright or shared Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern

Division titles and six NCAA post-season playoff berths. From 2000 to 2009 the Huskies are also one of the most successful NCAA Division II programs with a combined record of 92-24 (.793).

In 2008 the Huskies started the season winning the first nine games of the year, including wins over nationally-ranked Ashland and California (Pa). Bloomsburg earned a bid to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the sixth time overall, and fifth time this decade, reaching the NCAA Region One finals.

In 2006, the Huskies posted a mark of 12-2 and won the PSAC Eastern Division title, while also capturing the NCAA Northeast Regional title and advancing to the NCAA Division II national semi-finals. Hale was named the PSAC East Coach of the Year, the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division II District I Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year award. By virtue of being a finalist for the award he was featured on an ABC-TV special hosted by Keith Jackson.

In 2005, Hale led the Huskies to a record of 11-1, including an unbeaten (11-0) mark in the regular season. It was just the fourth time in school history that a Bloomsburg team went through the regular season without a loss. He also earned PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year honors and the AFCA District One Coach of the Year award.

The Huskies have reached the NCAA playoffs in 1996, 2000 and 2001 seasons. During the 2000 season the Huskies were 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win. Hale earned the American Football Coaches Association Division II National Coach of the Year following the season.

At West Chester Hale posted a mark of 40-13 and won three PSAC East titles and advanced to the NCAA playoffs in 1988.

Prior to West Chester, Hale was an offensive line and defensive coordinator at Colgate from 1981 to 1983. Prior to Colgate, Hale was the offensive line coach at Bucknell from 1975-80 and was defensive coordinator/linebacker coach at Vermont in 1974.

Hale is a graduate of West Chester, earning his bachelor's and master's degrees in Health and Physical Education in 1968 and 1973. He was an all-conference pick at West Chester and earned the team's most valuable player in the 1967 State Championship game, while also lettering three times for the track and field team. He is a member of the West Chester Football Hall of Fame and the Delaware County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

In 1968 Hale signed with the Pottstown Firebirds, the semi professional farm club of the Philadelphia Eagles, before entering the Marine Corps where he played middle linebacker for the Quantico Marines. Following a three-year stint, he was honorably discharged as a first lieutenant in 1972.

2009 Game Recaps

Game 1

Bloomsburg 10, Ashland 7 August 27, 2009

BLOOMSBURG-Senior running back **Stefan Adams** ran for 104 yards, including a key 46-yard run in the fourth quarter, as Bloomsburg University defeated Ashland 10-7 in a battle between two nationally ranked football teams on Thursday night at Redman Stadium.

The 13th-ranked Huskies (1-0) got on the board first with a 28-yard field goal by senior **Jon Koenig** at the 11:11 mark in the first quarter. The kick came after a nine-play, 29-yard drive that was set up by a 42 yard kickoff return by senior cornerback **Jesse Cooper**.

After 15th-ranked Ashland's (0-1) first drive stalled at the Bloomsburg 34, the Eagles tried some trickery when punter Derek Reidel's fourth-down pass was intercepted by sophomore cornerback **Oscar Rivera**. The Huskies then started an eight-play, 85-yard drive that ended when senior quarterback **Dan Latorre** bolted into the endzone from eight yards out to put Bloomsburg up 10-0.

The Huskies defense controlled Ashland for most of the game, forcing two fumbles, two punts and stopping the Eagles four times on fourth down plays through nearly three quarters of play. Seniors **Justin Presley** and **Anthony Smith** led a Bloomsburg goal line stand late in the second quarter, coming up with three stops inside the Husky one yard line.

The Eagles closed the Bloomsburg advantage to three late in the third when Carlin Isles scored from 50 yards out to make the score 10-7. However, the Husky defense stifled Ashland's fourth quarter drives, registering three sacks and forcing Billy Cundiff into 4-of-11 passing for just 24 yards.

Smith led Bloomsburg with 11 tackles while Presley recorded eight, including three sacks. Smith, senior **Alphonso Nathan**, and juniors **Marcus Zimmerman** and **Todd Givler** were also able to get to Cundiff, combining for three sacks.

Latorre finished the game 16-of-28 for 158 yards, while rushing for an additional 18 yards on eight carries. Four of Latorre's runs went for key Bloomsburg first downs. Senior **Jordan Weisman** and sophomore **Branden Wright** each caught four passes for the Huskies.

Game 2

Bloomsburg 17, California (PA) 10 September 5, 2009

CALIFORNIA,PA- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** hit **Cory Stiger** with a four-yard touchdown pass with 22 seconds left to play to lift the sixth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies over 17th-ranked California (PA), 17-10, on Saturday night.

After Cal (0-2) had tied the game at 10-10 on an 18-yard scoring pass from Josh Portis to AJ Jackson with a minute to play, the Huskies (2-0) started their game winning drive on their own 39-yard line. After Latorre's first pass fell incomplete, he scrambled for 10 yards out to the Huskies 49-yard line. Following a timeout with 36 seconds to play, the senior quarterback hit a wide-open **Chris Tressler** with a 47-yard bomb to the Vulcans four-yard line. On the next play, Latorre hit Stiger with a touchdown pass, Stiger's first career scoring catch, to put Bloomsburg in front 17-10 with 22 seconds to play.

Cal, though, wasn't done. Portis completed passes of 21 and 14 yards on consecutive plays putting the ball at the Bloomsburg 36-yard line with six seconds to play. After an incomplete pass left just one second to play, Portis' last pass was knocked down by the Huskies **Mike Varanavage** preserving the Bloomsburg win.

The game was a back and forth struggle between the defenses with the only scoring threw the first three quarters being a field goal from Jon Koenig from 42-yards out which tied his career long with 12:47 to play in the second period. In the third period, Cal's Kevin Hagerman connected from 30-yards out tying the score at 3-3 heading to the fourth period.

Bloomsburg went in front 10-3 on a special teams play. A long punt from Bloomsburg was muffed by Cal's Mike Brown and recovered in the end zone by Bloomsburg's **Branden Wright** with 4:29 to play setting up the wild finish.

Latorre finished 12-22 for 166 yards and one score, while **Ben Weaber** caught five passes for 37 yards to lead the receivers. Varanavage finished with 10 tackles and the one key pass break-up, while **Anthony Smith** added eight tackles.

Bloomsburg 17, Mercyhurst 7 September 12, 2009

ERIE-- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** rushed for one score and passed for another to lead fifth-ranked Bloomsburg University to a 17-7 win over Mercyhurst College on Saturday. The win was the 10th straight road win for the Huskies dating back to 2007.

After a scoreless opening period of the game, the Huskies (3-0) finally got on the board on a career-best 47-yard field goal from **Jon Koenig** with two minutes left in the half. The senior's kick capped an eight-play, 46-yard for the Huskies that included a 20-yard run from **Kenny Domzalski** and an 18-yard pass from Latorre to **Ben Weaber**.

On the ensuing drive for the drive Mercyhurst (1-2) quarterback Joe Laffey had a pass intercepted by Bloomsburg linebacker **Anthony Smith** who returned the ball to the Laker 23-yard line 1:03 left in the period. The Huskies drove to the Mercyhurst one-yard line, aided with a pass interference call, which set up a one-yard run from Latorre with 19 seconds left in the half making it 10-0 at the break.

Bloomsburg made it 17-0 early in the fourth period when **Cory Stiger** caught a four-yard scoring pass from Latorre to cap a 44-yard scoring drive. The big play in the drive was a 41-yard reception by **Chris Tressler** putting the Huskies in scoring position.

Mercyhurst finally got on the board in the fourth period when Laffey completed a one-yard pass to Josh Szeluga with 6:08 to go. The Lakers would get the ball back two more times in the final six minutes, but the Bloomsburg defense stopped the Lakers on both occasions. On a fourth and two at the Bloomsburg 38, the Huskies **Thomas McFarland** made a stop for a loss of two yards to turn the ball over on downs, while **Domenique Price** intercepted a pass on Mercyhurst's final drive to seal the victory.

Domzalski rushed for a game-high 86 yards and went over 1,000 yards for his career. Latorre finished 12-24 for 112 yards and one score. Defensively, Smith had another big game for the Huskies with a team-high 11 tackles, seven of them solo. He also intercepted one pass and broke up another. As a team, Bloomsburg allowed just one touchdown for the third straight game and allowed just 192 yards of total offense. Mercyhurst quarterback Joe Laffey was 19-36 for 130 yards and one interception.

KUTZTOWN-- The fourth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies extended their road winning streak to 11 games with a 31-12 win over Kutztown University on Saturday night.

Bloomsburg (4-0, 1-0 in the PSAC East) took the lead midway through the first period when sophomore **Derrick Price**, seeing his first action of the season, scored on a three-yard run with 5:39 left in the first period. The score capped a 91-yard drive with the big play being a 56-yard completion from **Dan Latorre** to **Jordan Weisman**.

Kutztown (2-2, 0-1 PSAC East) got on the board at 10:18 of the second on a 30-yard field goal by Matt Dineen. The points were the first scored against the Huskies defense in the first half this season.

Bloomsburg 28, C.W. Post 14 September 26, 2009

BLOOMSBURG-Sophomore **Derrick Price** ran for 185 yards and three touchdowns as No. 4 Bloomsburg University defeated C.W. Post 28-14 in PSAC football action on Saturday afternoon at Redman Stadium.

The Huskies (5-0, 2-0) got on the scoreboard first at the 10:57 mark in the first quarter with a 20-yard touchdown pass from senior **Dan Latorre** to junior **Cory Stiger**. This capped off a four-play, 62-yard drive. Freshman **Jared Shannon** tacked on the extra point to give Bloomsburg an early 7-0 lead.

The Pioneers (1-4, 1-1) struck back with an eight-play drive that covered 80 yards, resulting in a 17-yard scoring toss from Eric Anderwkavich to Chris Harris to tie the score at 7-7.

Starting at their own 33-yard line, the Huskies regained the lead using first down receptions by Stiger and several runs by sophomore **Kenny Domzalski** to get the ball to the C.W. Post one-yard line. A second down touchdown run by Price helped stretch the Huskies lead to 14-7.

The Huskies defense made two second quarter stops when they forced a turnover on downs inside their own 10-yard line and got an interception by sophomore **Vince Browning**, ending the late first half drive.

The Huskies would increase their lead less than five minutes into the second half when, after a 28-yard pass from Latorre to senior **Jordan Weisman**, Price galloped up the middle for a 33-yard touchdown run. The scoring drive covered 79 yards and used up just 1:35 on the clock.

The defenses tightened up as both teams traded punts and neither was able to get much going throughout the rest of the third and much of the fourth quarter. The Pioneers did find some offensive life and closed the gap to 21-14 on a 15-yard pass from Anderwkavich to Harris with 3:08 left in the game.

After a failed pouch kickoff gave the Huskies the ball at their own 49-yard line, Price went to work rushing four times for 44 yards to the Pioneers seven-yard line. After a three yard pass to sophomore **Dylan Manni**, Price busted up the middle for his third touchdown of the day to give the Huskies a 14-point advantage with 1:34 remaining.

Latorre finished 10-of-17 for 125 yards and a touchdown and Stiger caught four passes for 84 yards. Senior **Anthony Smith** led all tacklers with 19 stops, including a sack and a forced fumble. Junior **Mike Varanavage** recorded 11 tackles while sophomore **Oscar Rivera** had nine tackles and two pass breakups.

Bloomsburg 45, Millersville 10 October 3, 2009

BLOOMSBURG --Quarterback **Dan Latorre** rushed for two touchdowns and passed for another to lead the fourth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies to a 45-10 win over Millersville University on Saturday night. The win was the 90th win of this decade (2000-09) for the Huskies and giving them an overall mark of 90-22.

After the Huskies stopped the Marauders on the opening drive of the game, Bloomsburg moved the ball 75 yards in 11 plays with Latorre covering the final seven yards with his 20th career rushing touchdown with 5:17 left in the first period.

Bloomsburg went ahead 14-0 later in the first period when defensive end **Justin Presley** intercepted Millersville quarterback Bill Shirk at the Marauders 40-yard line and returned it seven yards to the 33. Three plays later tailback **Derrick Price** scored from three yards out to put the Huskies on top by two scores with 2:19 left in the first.

In the second period, the Huskies made it 21-0 when Price scored his second touchdown of the game, this one from four yards out with 12:48 left in the half. After the BU defense forced its second three and out of the game, the Huskies drove 55 yards in seven plays with Latorre hitting **Jordan Weisman** with a nine-yard scoring pass with 7:07 left before the break.

Millersville got on the board later in the second period putting together a 40 yard drive capped off by a 47-yard field goal by John Banzhof with 2:06 before halftime. The Huskies, though, answered right back. After a 54-yard kickoff return by **Brandon Real** gave Bloomsburg the ball at the Marauders 46-yard line, the Huskies drove downfield in five plays with Latorre running 17 yards down the sideline and diving to the end zone for a score and a 35-3 lead at the half.

Real brought the fans to their feet early in the third period when he took a punt at his own 32-yard line and found a seam in the center of the field and went 68 yards for a score. It was the Huskies first punt return for a score since the 2006 season.

In the fourth period the Huskies added to their score with a 22-yard field goal by **Jon Koenig** for a 45-3 lead for the Huskies. Millersville's Cardoza Jacks got the Marauders only score of the night when he scored from a yard out with 2:32 to play to make the final 45-10.

Latorre finished with 69 yards rushing on six carries and two scores and 10 of 12 passing for 115 yards and one score. Defensively, **Mike Varanavage** made eight tackles for Bloomsburg, while **Thomas McFarland** had seven.

EAST STROUDSBURG-- Tailback **Derrick Price** carried 23 times for 165 yards and one score to lead the fifth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies to a 27-13 win over East Stroudsburg in a PSAC Eastern Division matchup.

East Stroudsburg jumped in front on its second possession of the game when it took over in Bloomsburg territory at the 49-yard line and quickly moved downfield on a 35-yard pass from quarterback Matt Marshall to Ed Kiser before the drive stalled at the Huskies eight yard line. From there Drew Reinhard connected on a 26-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead for the Warriors.

The Huskies responded on their second drive going 57-yards in 13 plays and getting a 26-yard field goal from **Jon Koenig**. Bloomsburg had the ball inside the 10-yard line, but a penalty and a couple of incomplete passes forced the Huskies to settle for three points.

BLOOMSBURG-- **Derrick Price** rushed for three touchdowns to lead the fourth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies to a 28-6 win over Cheyney University (0-8, 0-5 PSAC East) in the Huskies annual homecoming game on Saturday.

The Wolves answered on the ensuing drive moving to the Huskies 18 yard line before settling for a 35-yard field goal from Tyler Wilkinson cutting the lead to 7-3.

On the kickoff following the Cheyney field goal, the Huskies' **Branden Wright** had a 45-yard return giving Bloomsburg the ball at the Cheyney 34-yard line. Five plays later Price scored from one yard out for a 14-3 lead.

Cheyney then put together a 17-play, 78 yard drive that ate up 9:44 on the clock, but stalled at the Bloomsburg four-yard line. Wilkinson connected on 22-yard field goal with 1:36 to go before half cutting the deficit to 14-6.

In the third period the Bloomsburg defense set up the Huskies third score when **Alphonso Nathan** recovered a fumble at the Wolves 40-yard line. A 38-yard pass from quarterback **Dan Latorre** to tight end **Ben Weaber** brought the ball to the Cheyney two-yard line before Price capped the short drive with a two-yard run.

Bloomsburg's final score came on an 11-yard pass from Latorre to **Jordan Weisman** with 5:47 to go in the third period for a 28-6 advantage. Latorre finished 8-10 for 110 yards and one touchdown, while **Thomas McFarland** made 10 tackles to lead the defense. Ron Hunter carried 22 times for 121 yards for the Wolves.

Bloomsburg 27, Shippensburg 28 October 24, 2009

BLOOMSBURG--Chase DiFebbo caught an 11-yard scoring pass with 46 seconds left to lift Shippensburg University past Bloomsburg University 28-27 on Saturday afternoon in PSAC Eastern Division showdown.

DiFebbo's catch of the throw from his brother Chad DiFebbo capped a 15-play, 79-yard drive for Shippensburg. Driving to the Bloomsburg 11-yard line and facing a third and six, Chad DiFebbo threw to Chase in the corner of the end zone for the game tying points. Tyler Ford converted the extra point to put Shippensburg in front 28-27 with 46 seconds to go.

Bloomsburg would drive out to its own 47-yard line, but quarterback **Dan Latorre** was sacked on the game's final play giving Shippensburg the win. Both teams are now tied for the PSAC East lead with one game to play. Should the teams remain tied after next week, the Red Raiders would play for the PSAC championship based on head-to-head competition.

The Huskies took the early lead in the game when **Kenny Domzalski** capped a four-play, 65-yard scoring drive with 20-yard run to put the Huskies on top 7-0 with 12:17 left in the first. Shippensburg answered right back with Harris catching an 11-yard pass from Chad DiFebbo to knot the score at 7-7 with 8:36 to play in the first.

Bloomsburg wasted little time in regaining the lead, needing just four plays to score with **Derrick Price** going 25 yards for a 14-7 lead.

The Huskies extended that lead to 21-7 early in the second quarter when Domzalski ran a career-long 77 yards for a score on the first play of the drive with 10:15 to go in the second period. Shippensburg, though, trimmed the lead 21-13 by halftime with a pair of field goals from Ford of 19- and 38-yards.

In the third period, the Huskies took the second half kickoff and got a 39-yard field goal from Jon Koenig to extend its lead to 24-13 with 10:15 to play in the quarter. Bloomsburg later had a chance to extend the lead, but a 40-yard field goal from Koenig went wide left.

The Red Raiders answered later in the period when Mike Frenette scored on a 55-yard run and then converted a two-point conversion to pull within three at 24-21 with 45 seconds to go in the third.

On Bloomsburg's ensuing drive the Huskies moved to the Shippensburg seven yard line with the help of a 41-yard pass from Latorre to **Chris Tressler**. The Shippensburg defense stiffened, though, and forced the Huskies to settle for a 24-yard field goal from Koenig with 12:30 to go in the game setting up Shippensburg's late game heroics.

Chad DiFebbo was 13-30 for 195 yards and two scores for the Red Raiders with Harris catching nine passes for 147 yards and one score. Defensively, Cody Fleming made 12 tackles for the Red Raiders. Domzalski finished with 121 yards rushing and two scores for Bloomsburg, while Price totaled 109 yards and one score. On defense, **Anthony Smith** made 14 tackles to lead the Huskies.

Bloomsburg 14, West Chester 30 October 31, 2009

WEST CHESTER--The Bloomsburg University football dropped its second straight game falling 30-14 to West Chester on Saturday afternoon.

The Huskies (8-2, 5-2 PSAC East) started quickly in the game stopping the Golden Rams (6-4, 5-2 PSAC East) on their opening drive of the game, then, quickly scoring on its first possession. After forcing West Chester to go three and out on its first series, the Huskies took over at their own-42 yard line. On second and nine, quarterback **Dan Latorre** connected with **Cory Stiger** on a 57-yard touchdown strike putting Bloomsburg on top 7-0 just 1:26 into the game.

West Chester responded on its next possession and put together a 11-play, 77-yard drive capped by a one-yard run from Lee Hopkins to tie the game at 7-7 with 7:57 to play in the first period. The Huskies regained the lead at 14-7 on its next drive moving 60-yards in eight plays with Latorre connecting with Stiger on a seven-yard pass for the go-ahead score. A big play in the drive was a 35-yard completion from Latorre to **Ben Weaber** giving the Huskies a first and goal at the six-yard line.

The Golden Rams tied the game at 14-14 on its ensuing drive quarterback Joe Wright hitting Dan DePalma with a 38-yard scoring pass with 13:01 to go in the first half.

Later in the second period after a short punt by the Huskies gave West Chester the ball at its own 41-yard line, the Golden Rams needed just eight plays to get a four-yard run from D'Andre Webb to grab the lead at 21-14. On Bloomsburg's next drive Latorre was intercepted by Kevin Garland who returned the ball 25-yards to the Huskies 40-yard line. After driving to the Bloomsburg four-yard line and facing fourth down, Wright hit DePalma with a four-yard pass for a 28-14 lead at halftime.

In the second half the Huskies drove into West Chester territory four times, but missed on 32-yard field goal try and fumbled at three-yard line with 12 seconds to play.

Latorre finished 18-36 for a career-high 350 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. **Mike Varanavage** made 12 tackles to lead the defense, while **Anthony Smith** added 11. Joe Wright finished 23-38 for 326 yards and two scores for West Chester.
