MATCH UP: No. 4-ranked Bloomsburg University opens its conference schedule as the Huskies travel to Kutztown to take on the Golden Bears in the third of three straight road games. The Huskies won last season's matchup, 31-21, holding KU to 293 yards of total offense on 76 plays, a 3.9-yard-per-play average. Kutztown is 2-1 on the season after their 27-24 loss to Slippery Rock. The Golden Bears opened up with victories over St. Anselm and Clarion. The Huskies are coming off of a 17-7 victory over Mercyhurst last Saturday in Erie. LB **Anthony Smith** won PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week honors for his play, totaling 11 tackles and the first interception of his career. QB **Dan Latorre** threw for a touchdown and ran for one to lead the BU offense.

THE HEAD COACHES: Huskies coach **Danny Hale** (West Chester '68) is in his 17th year on the Bloomsburg sideline, racking up a 139-46-1 (.750) record. The 139 wins are first all-time in school history. For his career, Hale is 179-59-1 and his winning percentage of .751 is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in Division II. Hale has led BU to six playoff appearances, including the latest in 2008. He has been honored as the PSAC East Coach of the Year 10 times, the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year nine times, and was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year following the 2000 season.

Raymond Monica (North Alabama '90) entered his fourth season with the Bears in 2009 with an overall record of 14-18, while carrying an 8-10 PSAC East record. Monica has led the Golden Bears to improving records each year, going 5-6 in 2008 with a 4-3 PSAC East record - tying KU's single-season record for wins in a division. Prior to Kutztown, Monica served as the defensive coordinator at Temple for eight seasons, including the final seven as assistant head coach.

PSAC DEFENSIVE POW: Senior LB **Anthony Smith** earned his second East Defensive Player of the Week award in three weeks after keying another dominant defensive performance by Bloomsburg in the Huskies' 17-7 win over Mercyhurst. Smith made 11 tackles, his second game in three with double digit tackles and seven of which were solo stops, and had a key interception that set up a Bloomsburg touchdown late in the first half. His pick, the first of his career, came after the Huskies had gone up 3-0 with two minutes left in the first half. He returned it 15 yards to the Laker 23-yardline to set up a Huskies TD to put them up 10-0 at the half and what would eventually be the difference in the game. Smith also had a pass break up.

BEASTS OF THE EAST: Dating back to 2005, the Huskies own a 26-3 record against PSAC East foes. During that span, BU is 13-2 against the East at home and 13-1 away from Redman Stadium. 21 of the 26 wins have come while ranked in the top 25.

ROAD WARRIORS: BU has enjoyed much success on the road as of late. In their last 15 away games, the Huskies are 13-2 and are winning by an average margin of 28.3-16.6.

LAST MEETING

Bloomsburg 31, Kutztown 21 September 20, 2008

BLOOMSBURG-- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** threw for 210 yards and two touchdowns to lead the 10th-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies (4-0, 1-0 PSAC East) to a 31-21 win over Kutztown University (1-3, 0-1 PSAC East) on Saturday.

Kutztown took the early lead in the game when Matt Dineen connected on a 37-yard field goal with 1:22 left in the first period. Bloomsburg then scored on the ensuing drive when **Jon Koenig** hit a 35-yard field goal.

Kutztown regained the lead later in the period when Shane Martin hit Kaleb Klosky with a 15-yard scoring pass with 3:25 left in the half.

The Huskies needed just three plays to tie the score as Latorre hit **Kyle Ream** with a 55-yard pass to make it 10-10 at the half.

In the third period the Huskies took the lead for the first time in the game. Latorre and Ream clicked on the first play of the drive on a 28-yard scoring strike for a 17-10 lead.

Kutztown cut in the Huskies lead with a 34-yard field goal on the Golden Bears next possession, but BU responded with a seven play, 63-yard scoring drive to extend its lead. A touchdown run by **Kenny Domzalski** from seven yards out gave BU a 24-13 lead.

The Golden Bears got one more score as Martin hit Jason Uhlig on a two-yard scoring pass with 1:47 to play in the game, then added a two-point conversion pass to close to within a field goal at 24-21.

Following a failed KU onside kick, the Huskies drove in for one last score with **Derrick Price** going in from nine yards out with 1:16 left in the game.

Overall, Latorre was 10-15 for 210 yards, one interception and two scores. Price was held below 100-yards for the first time this season as he finished with 60 yards on the ground. Defensively, **Greg Myers** had 10 tackles, while **Earl McNeil** added seven.

SCOUTING KUTZTOWN: The Golden Bears are led by Dontay Wilson, who leads the PSAC and is 10th in Division II with 132.7 rushing yards per game. He had a career-high 174 yards on 26 carries against St. Anselm, including a 77-yard TD in the 4th quarter. QB Shane Martin is eighth in the conference in total yards per game with 181.7 (130.0 pass; 51.7 rush) and is completing 57.6 percent of his passes. WR Chris McCormick, a freshman, leads KU with 12 catches for 133 yards and one TD. The Golden Bears are second in the conference in time of possession, holding on to the ball an average of 33:31 per game.

KU's defense is giving up just 15.3 points per game, good enough for third in the PSAC. LB Joel Irwin is tied for third in the PSAC with 30 tackles, while DE Kevin Bolinsky leads the team with 5.5 tackles-for-loss and 1.5 sacks. The Golden Bears are giving up just 81.0 yards per game on the ground, which leads the conference and is tied for 18th in Division II. In the secondary, DBs Jay McNight, Mike Gardier and Kalief Evans have combined for 50 tackles, four pass breakups and two fumble recoveries in KU's 4-2-5 defense.

Matt Dineen handles extra points, field goals and punts and is currently fourth in the PSAC in scoring with 7.3 points per game. Kendall Coleman returns both kickoffs (27.0 avg.) and punts (9.0 avg.), ranking near the top of the PSAC in both categories.

WINNING WHEN THEY'RE RANKED: Bloomsburg has flexed its muscles when ranked in the top 25, posting a 76-19 overall record since 1985. The Huskies are 69-13 when ranked in the regular season and 37-12 while on the road.

IN THE TOP 10: The Huskies are no stranger to a top-10 national ranking. Since 2001, BU has played 37 times while ranked in the top 10 of a national poll, five of those during the playoffs. They are 30-7 in games when ranked among the top 10 nationally, including a 4-0 against Kutztown.

THE GRADUATE: QB **Dan Latorre**, now in his fourth year as the starter, graduated as a triple major in the spring and is now in grad school. One of the best players to ever wear a Husky uniform, Latorre, who was named first team All-PSAC East last year, heads into the 2009 season third all-time in school history in both yards passing and touchdowns and is the all-time leader in rushing yards by a quarterback.

MR. EVERYTHING: Latorre is featured in the latest edition of *Bloomsburg: The University Magazine*. The story, written by Husky play-by-play commentator Jim Doyle, details Latorre's athletic and academic accomplishments. In addition to receiving first-team All-PSAC honors for his play in 2008, Latorre earned a 3.78 grade point average while taking 19 credits.

GOING FOR A GRAND: Latorre just doesn't rely on his arm to lead the Huskies down the field, but also his legs. His 545 rushing yards last season was a record for a BU quarterback and with his 191 yards during 2007, he is closing in on 1,000 career rushing yards. After netting 48 yards in the win over Mercyhurst, Latorre currently stands at 811 yards.

GETTING A GRAND: With his game-high 86 yards in the win over Mercyhurst, sophomore TB **Kenny Domzalski** went over 1,000 rushing yards in his career. In his freshman year of 2008, he ran for 878 yards, good for second on the team. So far this season, Domzalski leads the Huskies with 182 yards on 55 carries. He now has 1,060 career rushing yards, which is 15th all-time at BU.

SPREADING IT OUT: The Huskies have relied on several players to catch passes during their first three games of 2009. BU's 40 total completions have been spread out among nine different receivers. Junior TE **Ben Weaber** leads the Huskies with nine catches; Senior WR **Jordan Weisman** and junior WR **Cory Stiger** and each have seven; Junior WR **Chris Tressler**, sophomore WR **Branden Wright** and Kenny Domzalski each have four; Senior FB **Stefan Adams** and sophomore TE **Dylan Manni** have two receptions apiece; And senior RB **James Sweeting** has one reception.

HITTING 100: Stefan Adams rushed for 104 yards on 15 carries against Ashland, including a key 46-yard run in the 4th quarter. It was the second time in his career that he has broken the 100-yard mark and was just seven yards shy of his career-high. In 2007 against Clarion, the fullback ran for 111 yards and two TDs in a 52-10 win.

WEARING 'EM DOWN: The Huskies relied on successful 4th quarter running performances to wear down opponents and help gain victories over Ashland and Cal. Against the Eagles, Adams ran nine times for 85 yards in the 4th, helping BU hold the ball for 9:12. Sophomore TB **Kenny Domzalski** had 47 of his team-high 68 yards in the final quarter against Cal, including a 25-yard jont on a key 3rd down.

KEEPIN' IT LOW: The 44 points scored in the first 3 games by the Huskies is their lowest total since 1994 when they lost two of three while scoring 36. It is the least amount scored while winning the first three games since 1948, when Bloomsburg scored 38 without allowing a point.

NATIONALLY RANKED DEFENSE: The Huskies defense has dominated opponents this season, giving up just eight points per game, which ranks fourth in all of Division II. The 234.3 total yards given up by BU ranks 15th in DII, and also rank 21st and 27th in rushing (86.0 ypg) and passing (148.3 ypg) defense.

THE 'BACKERS: **Anthony Smith** leads all Husky defenders and is tied for third in the PSAC and is 28th in the country with 30 tackles in 2009. The senior has been named PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week after games against Ashland and Mercyhurst, registering 11 stops in each game.

Junior **Mike Varanavage** topped all tacklers with 10 against Cal. The team's leading returning tackler with 53 in 2008, Varanavage also knocked down the Vulcans Hail Mary pass in the closing seconds of the game. Junior **Thomas McFarland** is sixth on the Huskies in tackles with 15, recording eight with one tackle-for-loss against Mercyhurst on Saturday.

THE DBs: The BU defensive backs have helped the Huskies limit their first three opponents to 148.3 passing yards per game. Junior **Alex Landis** leads all Husky defensive backs with 17 tackles, including 0.5 tackle-for-loss. He has also posted an interception, two pass breakups and a forced fumble. Sophomore **Oscar Rivera** has recorded 15 tackles, including one tackle-for-loss, one interception and two pass breakups.

Senior **Jesse Cooper** registered his first interception of the season against Mercyhurst last week and added four tackles, helping the defense hold the Lakers to 130 passing yards. Senior **Domenique Price** had the second pick of his career last week, and has chipped in with 12 tackles, one tackle-for-loss and two pass breakups this season. Junior **Dan Oliver** and sophomores **Vince Browning** and **Andrew Flogel** have also received playing time, combining for 10 tackles, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

DOMINATING D-LINE: Senior **Justin Presley** leads the PSAC and is second in Division II with six sacks through three weeks of action. His seven tackles-for-loss also is tops in the PSAC and is tied for ninth in all of Division II. Presley has teamed with fellow senior Alphonso Nathan and junior Dave Huot to provide the defense with a constant pass rush and tackles behind the line of scrimmage. Huot's four tackles-for-loss (1.33 per game) is tied for ninth in the conference

Juniors **Todd Givler** and **Marcus Zimmerman** and sophomores **Kenny Orlando** and **John Pettine** have also been threats to opposing offenses, combining for 15 tackles, 3.0 tackles-for-loss, 1.5 sacks and a fumble recovery so far in 2009.

KEEPIN' IT LOW II: The 24 points given up on defense in three games is the least to start a season since 1997 when they allowed only 21, and is the third fewest points surrendered to start a season in 32 years.

POSITIVE RETURNS: Jesse Cooper, an All-PSAC defensive back, has flashed his ability in the return game in 2009. Cooper returned the opening kickoffs against Ashland and Mercyhurst 42 and 44 yards, respectively. He also returned three punts for 49 yards, including a 28-yard return late in the 4th quarter, against Ashland. Against Cal, the Vulcans twice angled their kickoffs away from Cooper, as he returned just one kick for 22 yards.

KOENIG CLIMBING THE LIST: Senior **Jon Koenig** currently stands sixth all-time in PSAC history in career PATs made with 151. He entered his final season with 146, 33 behind all-time leader Alex Walsh (179) of West Chester. Koenig sits four behind two players who are tied at 155.

JUST FOR KICKS: After going 2-for-2 on extra points against Mercyhurst on Saturday, Koenig has extended his streak of consecutive made point-after kicks to 69. His streak started against Cheyney in 2007 and extended through 2008 when he connected on 54-of-54 kicks.

Koenig established a new career-long with a 47-yard field goal against Mercyhurst. The kick came with two minutes left in the second quarter and put the Huskies up 3-0. This came one week after equaling his previous career-long, a 42-yarder against Cal early in the 2nd quarter. That kick equaled his career-long, which he established in 2006 against Northwest Missouri in the NCAA semi-finals and tied in 2008 against C.W. Post.

THE FRESHMEN: Kicker **Jared Shannon** has been one of a few true freshman getting playing time for the Huskies in 2009. Shannon handles

BU's kickoffs and the Huskies rank first in the PSAC East in kickoff average at 62.9 yards. In other words, he routinely makes the returner field the kick inside their own 6-yard line. Shannon also recorded his first career tackle, a touchdown saving stop in the 4th quarter against Cal.

TB **Brandon Real** saw his first collegiate action earlier this year against Cal, carrying the ball eight times for 19 yards, including a 12-yard run on the Huskies first scoring drive early in the 2nd quarter. WR **Kyle Fisher** has played in two games this year for BU, making his mark on special teams. Fisher has three tackles this season, including two against Cal on kick coverage.

FROM THE ARCHIVES: The Huskies have now won three consecutive games to start the season for the fourth time under Danny Hale but only the sixth time in the last 36 seasons. In 111 previous seasons Bloomsburg has started out with a 3-0 record 22 times, resulting in 20 winning years, only one losing season (1973), and one .500 record (1909).

The Mercyhurst win was the tenth consecutive road victory for the Huskies, and extends their school record which was set last year at Gannon. The previous record had been seven straight, first set from 1947-1948 under head coach Robert Redman. It was then tied several times, most recently from 2004-2005.

In the 53 games since the start of the 2005 season, BU's record is 45-8, with a very consistent mark of 21-4 at home and 24-4 away.

The 16 consecutive times the Huskies have beaten Kutztown is their second longest streak ever against a single opponent, behind the still active 19 game streak versus Cheyney. The 16 games have included eight both at home and on the road, and Bloomsburg has not lost at Kutztown since 1991.

A FAMILY AFFAIR: Huskies sophomore FB **Matt Cox** comes from a family of fullbacks. His father, Lawrence, played at Temple from 1979-82; his older brother Mike played collegiately at Georgia Tech from 2004-07 and is currently in his second year with the Kansas City Chiefs; and younger brother Lucas is a junior at Georgia Tech.

Coincidentally, current BU assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, **Paul Darragh**, began his playing career at Temple during Lawrence's final year.

TEAM OF THE DECADE: From 2000-2009, the Huskies have been the most dominant team in the PSAC, boasting an overall record of 87-22 (.798). So far this decade, Bloomsburg has made the playoffs five times and has a conference record of 48-6 (.889).

CROSSING OVER: The Huskies record with teams in the PSAC West since 1999 - which included Shippensburg until 2008 - is 31-11. They have won six of their last seven games, including last week's 17-7 win over Mercyhurst. BU is 17-4 at Redman Stadium and 14-7 on the road.

HUSKIES IN THE PLAYOFFS: BU has made the NCAA Division II playoffs in three of the past four seasons and seven times overall. The Huskies claim a 7-7 overall playoff record, including a 5-2 mark games played at Redman Stadium. Last year BU faced two PSAC foes in second round opponent West Chester and California (PA) in the quarterfinals. Bloomsburg defeated the Golden Rams 28-21 before falling to the Vulcans, 27-24.

The Huskies also reached the NCAA playoffs after the 1985, 1996, 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2006 seasons. In 2000, Bloomsburg went 12-3 and

advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing to Delta State in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win.

BU VS. RANKED OPPONENTS: Through the years, the Huskies have found success against other top schools in Division II, compiling a 28-34-1 record against ranked teams since 1985. That record has improved since 2000, as BU has gone 19-15, including a 11-5 mark against ranked opponents at Redman Stadium.

Among the 19 victories this decade are home wins against No. 5 IUP, No. 10 Northwood and No. 13 Millersville in 2000; No. 23 West Chester in 2005; No. 17 California in 2006; No. 5 California in 2008; and No. 15 Ashland in 2009. Away wins include No. 2 Cal-Davis and No. 11 Slippery Rock in 2000; No. 3 East Stroudsburg in 2005; No. 5 Shepherd in 2006; No. 15 Ashland in 2008; and No. 17 California in 2009.

REDMAN AT NIGHT: The opening game against Ashland was the very first night game at Redman Stadium. Lights were added prior to the 2008 season, however the latest start time for a game was 3:30 p.m. The Huskies will have another late start this week when they travel to California to play the Vulcans and will play host to the Marauders of Millersville on Saturday, October 3 at 5 p.m.

FOR OPENERS: After the season opening win over Ashland, the Huskies are now 30-41-2 in season openers from 1935-2009. Bloomsburg has found early season success recently, going 6-1 in openers since 2003. The lone loss came at the hands of Division I-FCS opponent James Madison, 14-3, in Harrisonburg, Virginia. Danny Hale is 9-8 in season openers at Bloomsburg, including a 6-2 record in home openers.

Danny Hale

Bloomsburg University Head Coach



Danny Hale, one of the winningest coaches in all of Division II, will begin his 17th season at the helm of the Huskies in 2009. Hale also spent five years as head coach at West Chester University.

At Bloomsburg, Hale has posted a career record of 139-46-1 (.750) and holds the school record for most coaching victories. Overall in 21 years as a head coach he has a mark of 179-59-1 (.751) and is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in NCAA Division II in winning percentage. In his 16 seasons as head coach at Bloomsburg he has led the Huskies to 10 outright or shared Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern

Division titles and six NCAA post-season playoff berths. In the period from 2000 to 2008 the Huskies are also one of the most successful NCAA Division II programs with a combined record of 84-22 (.792).

In 2008 the Huskies started the season winning the first nine games of the year, including wins over nationally-ranked Ashland and California (Pa). Bloomsburg earned a bid to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the sixth time overall, and fifth time this decade, reaching the NCAA Region One finals.

In 2006, the Huskies posted a mark of 12-2 and won the PSAC Eastern Division title, while also capturing the NCAA Northeast Regional title and advancing to the NCAA Division II national semi-finals. Hale was named the PSAC East Coach of the Year, the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division II District I Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year award. By virtue of being a finalist for the award he was featured on an ABC-TV special hosted by Keith Jackson.

In 2005, Hale led the Huskies to a record of 11-1, including an unbeaten (11-0) mark in the regular season. It was just the fourth time in school history that a Bloomsburg team went through the regular season without a loss. He also earned PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year honors and the AFCA District One Coach of the Year award.

The Huskies have reached the NCAA playoffs in 1996, 2000 and 2001 seasons. During the 2000 season the Huskies were 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win. Hale earned the American Football Coaches Association Division II National Coach of the Year following the season.

At West Chester Hale posted a mark of 40-13 and won three PSAC East titles and advanced to the NCAA playoffs in 1988.

Prior to West Chester, Hale was an offensive line and defensive coordinator at Colgate from 1981 to 1983. Prior to Colgate, Hale was the offensive line coach at Bucknell from 1975-80 and was defensive coordinator/linebacker coach at Vermont in 1974.

Hale is a graduate of West Chester, earning his bachelor's and master's degrees in Health and Physical Education in 1968 and 1973. He was an all-conference pick at West Chester and earned the team's most valuable player in the 1967 State Championship game, while also lettering three times for the track and field team. He is a member of the West Chester Football Hall of Fame and the Delaware County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

In 1968 Hale signed with the Pottstown Firebirds, the semi professional farm club of the Philadelphia Eagles, before entering the Marine Corps where he played middle linebacker for the Quantico Marines. Following a three-year stint, he was honorably discharged as a first lieutenant in 1972.

2009 Game Recaps

Game 1

Bloomsburg 10, Ashland 7 August 27, 2009

BLOOMSBURG-Senior running back **Stefan Adams** ran for 104 yards, including a key 46-yard run in the fourth quarter, as Bloomsburg University defeated Ashland 10-7 in a battle between two nationally ranked football teams on Thursday night at Redman Stadium.

The 13th-ranked Huskies (1-0) got on the board first with a 28-yard field goal by senior **Jon Koenig** at the 11:11 mark in the first quarter. The kick came after a nine-play, 29-yard drive that was set up by a 42 yard kickoff return by senior cornerback **Jesse Cooper**.

After 15th-ranked Ashland's (0-1) first drive stalled at the Bloomsburg 34, the Eagles tried some trickery when punter Derek Reidel's fourth-down pass was intercepted by sophomore cornerback **Oscar Rivera**. The Huskies then started an eight-play, 85-yard drive that ended when senior quarterback **Dan Latorre** bolted into the endzone from eight yards out to put Bloomsburg up 10-0.

The Huskies defense controlled Ashland for most of the game, forcing two fumbles, two punts and stopping the Eagles four times on fourth down plays through nearly three quarters of play. Seniors **Justin Presley** and **Anthony Smith** led a Bloomsburg goal line stand late in the second quarter, coming up with three stops inside the Husky one yard line.

The Eagles closed the Bloomsburg advantage to three late in the third when Carlin Isles scored from 50 yards out to make the score 10-7. However, the Husky defense stifled Ashland's fourth quarter drives, registering three sacks and forcing Billy Cundiff into 4-of-11 passing for just 24 yards.

Smith led Bloomsburg with 11 tackles while Presley recorded eight, including three sacks. Smith, senior **Alphonso Nathan**, and juniors **Marcus Zimmerman** and **Todd Givler** were also able to get to Cundiff, combining for three sacks.

Latorre finished the game 16-of-28 for 158 yards, while rushing for an additional 18 yards on eight carries. Four of Latorre's runs went for key Bloomsburg first downs. Senior **Jordan Weisman** and sophomore **Branden Wright** each caught four passes for the Huskies.

Bloomsburg 17, California (PA) 10 September 5, 2009

CALIFORNIA,PA- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** hit **Cory Stiger** with a four-yard touchdown pass with 22 seconds left to play to lift the sixth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies over 17th-ranked California (PA), 17-10, on Saturday night.

After Cal (0-2) had tied the game at 10-10 on an 18-yard scoring pass from Josh Portis to AJ Jackson with a minute to play, the Huskies (2-0) started their game winning drive on their own 39-yard line. After Latorre's first pass fell incomplete, he scrambled for 10 yards out to the Huskies 49-yard line. Following a timeout with 36 seconds to play, the senior quarterback hit a wide-open **Chris Tressler** with a 47-yard bomb to the Vulcans four-yard line. On the next play, Latorre hit Stiger with a touchdown pass, Stiger's first career scoring catch, to put Bloomsburg in front 17-10 with 22 seconds to play.

Cal, though, wasn't done. Portis completed passes of 21 and 14 yards on consecutive plays putting the ball at the Bloomsburg 36-yard line with six seconds to play. After an incomplete pass left just one second to play, Portis' last pass was knocked down by the Huskies **Mike Varanavage** preserving the Bloomsburg win.

The game was a back and forth struggle between the defenses with the only scoring threw the first three quarters being a field goal from Jon Koenig from 42-yards out which tied his career long with 12:47 to play in the second period. In the third period, Cal's Kevin Hagerman connected from 30-yards out tying the score at 3-3 heading to the fourth period.

Bloomsburg went in front 10-3 on a special teams play. A long punt from Bloomsburg was muffed by Cal's Mike Brown and recovered in the end zone by Bloomsburg's **Branden Wright** with 4:29 to play setting up the wild finish.

Latorre finished 12-22 for 166 yards and one score, while **Ben Weaber** caught five passes for 37 yards to lead the receivers. Varanavage finished with 10 tackles and the one key pass break-up, while **Anthony Smith** added eight tackles.

Game 3

Bloomsburg 17, Mercyhurst 7 September 12, 2009

ERIE-- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** rushed for one score and passed for another to lead fifth-ranked Bloomsburg University to a 17-7 win over Mercyhurst College on Saturday. The win was the 10th straight road win for the Huskies dating back to 2007.

After a scoreless opening period of the game, the Huskies (3-0) finally got on the board on a career-best 47-yard field goal from **Jon Koenig** with two minutes left in the half. The senior's kick capped an eight-play, 46-yard for the Huskies that included a 20-yard run from **Kenny Domzalski** and an 18-yard pass from Latorre to **Ben Weaber**.

On the ensuing drive for the drive Mercyhurst (1-2) quarterback Joe Laffey had a pass intercepted by Bloomsburg linebacker **Anthony Smith** who returned the ball to the Laker 23-yard line 1:03 left in the period. The Huskies drove to the Mercyhurst one-yard line, aided with a pass interference call, which set up a one-yard run from Latorre with 19 seconds left in the half making it 10-0 at the break.

Bloomsburg made it 17-0 early in the fourth period when **Cory Stiger** caught a four-yard scoring pass from Latorre to cap a 44-yard scoring drive. The big play in the drive was a 41-yard reception by **Chris Tressler** putting the Huskies in scoring position.

Mercyhurst finally got on the board in the fourth period when Laffey completed a one-yard pass to Josh Szeluga with 6:08 to go. The Lakers would get the ball back two more times in the final six minutes, but the Bloomsburg defense stopped the Lakers on both occasions. On a fourth and two at the Bloomsburg 38, the Huskies **Thomas McFarland** made a stop for a loss of two yards to turn the ball over on downs, while **Domenique Price** intercepted a pass on Mercyhurst's final drive to seal the victory.

Domzalski rushed for a game-high 86 yards and went over 1,000 yards for his career. Latorre finished 12-24 for 112 yards and one score. Defensively, Smith had another big game for the Huskies with a team-high 11 tackles, seven of them solo. He also intercepted one pass and broke up another. As a team, Bloomsburg allowed just one touchdown for the third straight game and allowed just 192 yards of total offense. Mercyhurst quarterback Joe Laffey was 19-36 for 130 yards and one interception.
