MATCH UP: The No. 4 ranked Huskies continue their conference schedule as they host the Millersville Marauders. BU enters with a record of 5-0, 2-0 in the PSAC while Millersville has a record of 1-4, 0-2 in the conference. The Marauders enter the matchup having dropped four straight, including a 63-24 loss to Shippensburg last Saturday. Last week, Bloomsburg played its first home game in nearly a month, defeating C.W. Post 28-14. Price ran for 185 yards and three touchdowns and junior Cory Stiger caught four passes for 84 yards, including a 20-yard touchdown in the first quarter. Senior Anthony Smith had a game-high 19 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble.

THE HEAD COACHES: Huskies coach **Danny Hale** (West Chester '68) is in his 17th year on the Bloomsburg sideline, racking up a 141-46-1 (.753) record. The 140 wins are first all-time in school history. For his career, Hale is 181-59-1 and his winning percentage of .753 is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in Division II. Hale has led BU to six playoff appearances, including the latest in 2008. He has been honored as the PSAC East Coach of the Year 10 times, the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year nine times, and was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year following the 2000 season.

Greg Colby (Illinois '75) is in his second season on the Millersville sideline. Colby led a rebuilding MU program to a 1-10 record last year, playing mostly freshmen and sophomores. Colby has coached for 34 years, including 25 years as a collegiate coach and 10 years as a defensive coordinator at the NCAA Division I level. He has been on staff for two Big Ten Championships and 12 collegiate bowl games.

PSAC DEFENSIVE POW: Senior LB **Anthony Smith** earned his third PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week award of the season after another standout performance in helping Bloomsburg top C.W. Post 28-14. Smith made a career-high 19 tackles, including seven solo, and 1.5 tackles for loss, which included a sack. He also forced a fumble. The 19 tackles were just four shy of the school record and they are the most recorded by a PSAC player since 2007. Of his 19 stops, 11 came in the second half.

TEAM OF THE DECADE: From 2000-2009, the Huskies have been the most dominant team in the PSAC, boasting an overall record of 89-22 (.802). So far this decade, Bloomsburg has made the playoffs five times and has a conference record of 50-6 (.893).

BEASTS OF THE EAST: Dating back to 2005, the Huskies own a 28-3 record against PSAC East foes. During that span, BU is 14-2 against the East at home and 14-1 away from Redman Stadium. 23 of the 28 wins have come while ranked in the top 25.

WINNING WHEN THEY'RE RANKED: Bloomsburg has flexed its muscles when ranked in the top 25 posting a 78-19 overall record since 1985. The Huskies are 71-13 when ranked in the regular season and 40-7 while at home.

LAST MEETING

Bloomsburg 49, Millersville 24 October 4, 2008

MILLERSVILLE-- Bloomsburg University's freshmen running back duo of **Kenny Domzalski** and **Derrick Price** combined to rush for 251 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Huskies to a 49-24 win over Millersville on Saturday.

Bloomsburg took a 14-0 lead after one quarter when Price scored on an 11-yard run midway through the period and **Ryan Barr** caught an eight-yard pass from **Dan Latorre**.

Millersville got on the board in the second period when Brad Lantz caught a 23-yard pass from Bill Shirk to make it 14-7. On the ensuing kickoff, **Jesse Cooper** returned the kick 91-yards for a score to make it 21-7. It was the longest kickoff return in Cooper's career, breaking the mark of 90 he had in a game last season.

Once again though, the Marauders were able to move the ball downfield and got a two-yard pass from Shirk to Matthew Booker with 34 seconds left making it a 21-14 game at the break.

The Huskies took the 2nd half kickoff and marched 61-yards in eight plays with Latorre hitting **Kyle Ream** with a 20-yard pass to a 28-14 advantage. Millersville once again made it a one-touchdown game at 28-21 when Booker scored on a one-yard run.

Following the kickoff, Domzalski needed just one play to put Bloomsburg back up by two touchdowns when he rambled 63-yards for a score with 8:08 left in the third.

Millersville, though, once again cut into the lead when John Banzhof connected on a 50-yard field goal to make it a 35-24 lead for BU.

In the fourth quarter, the Huskies put together two scoring drives with Price racing 38-yards and Latorre scoring on a seven-yard quarterback keeper.

Domzalski finished 141 yards on 11 carries, while Price gained 110 on 14 rushes and scored twice. Defensively, **Dan Tillotson** had nine tackles.

SCOUTING MILLERSVILLE: On offense, the Marauders feature Jamal Smith, the team's leading receiver with 24 receptions for 324 yards and four touchdowns. The former quarterback is fourth in the PSAC with 112.8 all-purpose yards per game and has scored five total touchdowns. Matt Egenrieder is second on the team with 23 catches, grabbing at least four in every game this season. Bill Shirk directs the passing attack, averaging 173.8 yards (9th in PSAC) per game and throwing for five touchdowns. Brad Lantz and Cardoza Jacks have combined to rush for 426 yards and three touchdowns and catch 13 passes for the Marauders.

Defensively, the Marauders are led by safeties Matt Sutjak and Julius Carter. The duo are 1-2 on the team in tackles, while Sutjak's total ranks him seventh in the PSAC. Each have recorded an interception, a pass breakup and a fumble recovery this year while Carter has two forced fumbles. Ryan Christian leads the linebackers with 35 tackles, one sack and two tackles-for-loss. Chad Miller has been productive in the middle of the defensive line, leading the team with two sacks and recorded seven tackles for loss.

Smith and Lou Brown return kicks and punts for Millersville and each has shown the ability to break a long run. John Banzhof is has made 4-of-8 field goal attempts, including a 47-yards aagainst IUP.

All-PSAC East last year, heads into the 2009 season third all-time in school history in both yards passing and touchdowns and is the all-time leader in rushing yards by a quarterback.

MR. EVERYTHING: Latorre is featured in the latest edition of *Bloomsburg: The University Magazine*. The story, written by Husky play-by-play commentator Jim Doyle, details Latorre's athletic and academic accomplishments. In addition to receiving first-team All-PSAC honors for his play in 2008, Latorre earned a 3.78 grade point average while taking 19 credits.

Latorre just doesn't rely on his arm to lead the Huskies down the field, but also his legs. His 545 rushing yards last season was a record for a BU quarterback and with his 191 yards during 2007, he is closing in on 1,000 career rushing yards. After

GETTING A GRAND: With his game-high 86 yards in the win over Mercyhurst, sophomore TB **Kenny Domzalski** went over 1,000 rushing yards in his career. In his freshman year of 2008, he ran for 878 yards, good for second on the team. So far this season, Domzalski is second on the Huskies with 237 yards on 72 carries. He now has 1,115 career rushing yards, which is 15th all-time at BU.

HITTING 100: Sophomore TB **Derrick Price** has rushed for 100 yards in each of his first two games this season. Price ran 26 times for 185 yards, one yard shy of his career-high, last week vs. C.W. Post. In his first action of the season against Kutztown, he rushed for 105 yards and two touchdowns. Price has now rushed for 100 yards in a game nine times during his career. Senior FB **Stefan Adams** is the only other Husky to run for 100 yards in a game this season when he rushed for 104 yards on 15 carries against Ashland in the season opener.

WEARING 'EM DOWN: The Huskies have relied on successful 4th quarter running performances to wear down opponents and help gain victories over Ashland, Cal, Kutztown and C.W. Post. Against the Pioneers, the Huskies gained 89 yards on 15 carries with a touchdown in the 4th quarter. 81 of those yards came from Derrick Price. Against the Golden Bears, BU rushers gained 71 yards on 12 carries in the final stanza. Price totaled 50 yards on five carries, including a 29-yard touchdown run with 5:39 remaining. Stefan Adams ran nine times for 85 yards in the 4th against Ashland, helping BU hold the ball for 9:12. Kenny Domzalski had 47 of his team-high 68 yards in the final quarter against Cal, including a 25-yard jont on a key 3rd down.

SPREADING IT OUT: The Huskies have relied on several players to catch passes during their first four games of 2009. BU's 66 total completions have been spread out among 10 different receivers: Four wide receivers, four running backs and two tight ends.

GOING DEEP: The Huskies have tried several deep passes each game in 2009, connecting on five passes of over 40 yards. Junior WR **Chris Tressler** has been the main beneficiary of those deep balls, recording a 47-yarder against Cal, a 41-yarder against Meryhurst, and another 47-yard pass against Kutztown. Senior WR **Jordan Weisman** has been on the receiving end of the other two 40-plus plays, catching a 40-yarder in the opener against Ashland and a 56-yarder against Kutztown.

1ST HALF DOMINANCE: The touchdown by C.W. Post in the first quarter on Saturday was the first given up in the first half by Bloomsburg all season. The week before at Kutztown, the Golden Bears field goal in the second quarter was the first points given up by the Huskies in the first half of any game this year.

NATIONALLY RANKED DEFENSE: The Huskies defense has dominated opponents this season, giving up just 10.0 points per game, which ranks first in the PSAC and is sixth in all of Division II. BU is also near the top nationally in total yards allowed (274.6 - 22nd in DII; third in PSAC), rushing yards allowed (84.8 - tied for 17th in DII; second in PSAC) and redzone defense (51.7% - tied for 11th in DII; second in PSAC).

In addition, the BU defense averages 8.00 tackles-for-loss per game (tied for 29th in DII), 3.40 sacks per game (tied for 14th in DII), and forces opposing quarterbacks to post a pass efficiency rating of just 104.25 (25th in DII).

KEEPIN' IT LOW: The Huskies have kept opposing offenses at bay, allowing an average of just 10.0 points per game. What is even more impressive is the amount of points BU's opponents have scored against other teams. Ashland, which is averaging 34.5 points per game against its four other opponents, scored only seven against the Huskies. Cal, which managed only 10 points against BU, has averaged 33.5 points in other games, including 52 two weeks ago.

THE 'BACKERS: Senior LB **Anthony Smith** leads all Husky defenders and is tied for first in the PSAC with 56 tackles (11.2 pg) in 2009. The senior has been named PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week after games against Ashland, Mercyhurst and C.W. Post. Against the Eagles, Smith registered 11 tackles, including five solo, and a half-sack. He led keyed a goal line stand in the second quarter and helped lead a defense that allowed just 261 yards to one of the nation's top ranked offenses. Against Mercyhurst, Smith had another 11-tackle game and had his first career interception, which was returned 15 yards to set up a late 1st half score. Last week against the Pioneers, Smith recorded 19 tackles, a sack and a forced fumble to win the award for the third time this season.

Junior **Mike Varanavage** topped all tacklers with 10 against Cal and had 11 stops against C.W. Post. He is second on the team with 42 tackles this year after recording 53 in 2008. Varanavage also knocked down the Vulcans Hail Mary pass in the closing seconds to seal a 17-10 victory. Junior **Thomas McFarland** is fifth on the Huskies in tackles with 24, recording eight with one tackle-for-loss against Mercyhurst three weeks ago.

THE DBs: The BU defensive backs have helped the Huskies limit their first five opponents to 189.8 passing yards per game. Sophomore **Oscar Rivera** leads all Husky defensive backs and is third on the team with 31 tackles, including two tackles-for-loss. Rivera also has an interception and four pass breakups, including back-to-back breakups in the 3rd quarter against C.W. Post which helped end a Pioneers drive. Junior **Alex Landis** has recorded 23 tackles, including 0.5 tackle-for-loss. He has also posted an interception and four pass breakups in 2009.

Senior **Jesse Cooper** registered his first interception of the season against Mercyhurst and added four tackles, helping the defense hold the Lakers to 130 passing yards. Senior **Domenique Price** had the second pick of his career against the Lakers, and has chipped in with 19 tackles, one tackle-for-loss and two pass breakups this season. Sophomores **Vince Browning** and **Andre Glover** have received more playing time as the year has gone on, combining for 18 tackles, three pass breakups, and an interception by Browning in last week's win over C.W. post. Junior **Dan Oliver** received his first significant playing time last week against the Golden Bears, notching four tackles and a pass breakup.

Presley has teamed with fellow senior **Alphonso Nathan** and juniors **Dave Huot** and **Marcus Zimmerman** to provide the defense with a constant pass rush and tackles behind the line of scrimmage. Huot and Zimmerman have combined for 24 tackles, including 10.5 tackles-for-loss and 4.0 sacks in 2009.

Junior **Todd Givler** and sophomores **Kenny Orlando** and **John Pettine** have also been threats to opposing offenses, combining for 22 tackles, 4.5 tackles-for-loss, 3.0 sacks and two pass breakups so far in 2009.

POSITIVE RETURNS: Jesse Cooper, an All-PSAC defensive back, has flashed his ability in the return game in 2009. Cooper returned the opening kickoffs against Ashland and Mercyhurst 42 and 44 yards, respectively. He also returned three punts for 49 yards, including a 28-yard return late in the 4th quarter, against Ashland. Against Cal, the Vulcans twice angled their kickoffs away from Cooper, as he returned just one kick for 22 yards.

JUST FOR KICKS: After going 4-for-4 on extra points against Kutztown, senior **Jon Koenig** has extended his streak of consecutive made point-after kicks to 73. The streak almost died against the Golden Bears, as Koenig's third extra point attempt was 40 yards long because of two BU penalties. His streak started against Cheyney in 2007 and extended through 2008 when he connected on 54-of-54 kicks.

Koenig established a new career-long for the second week in a row with a 50-yard field goal against Kutztown. The kick came at the 11:17 mark of the 4th quarter and put the Huskies up 24-6. This came one week after kicking a then-career-long 47-yard field goal against Mercyhurst. Koenig has also kicked a 42-yarder against Cal.

KOENIG CLIMBING THE LIST: Koenig currently stands tied for fourth all-time in PSAC history in career PATs made with 155. He entered his final season with 146, 33 behind all-time leader Alex Walsh (179) of West Chester. Koenig now sits six behind Slippery Rock's Morgan Anderson, who has 161.

THE FRESHMEN: Kicker **Jared Shannon** has been one of a few true freshman getting playing time for the Huskies in 2009. Shannon handles BU's kickoffs and the Huskies rank first in the PSAC in kickoff average at 62.3 yards, including two touchbacks against C.W. Post. In other words, he routinely makes the returner field the kick inside their own 10-yard line. Given additional duties against the Pioneers, Shannon scored the first points of his career, going 4-for-4 on extra points.

TB **Brandon Real** saw his first collegiate action earlier this year against Cal, carrying the ball eight times for 19 yards, including a 12-yard run on the Huskies first scoring drive early in the 2nd quarter. He has also returned kicks this year, averaging 18.3 yards on three punt returns and 16.7 yards on three kickoff returns. WR **Kyle Fisher** has played in three games this year for BU, making his mark on special teams. Fisher has three tackles this season, including two against Cal on kick coverage, and returned a kickoff 33 yards against Kutztown.

Bloomsburg University Football Game Notes

FROM THE ARCHIVES: Bloomsburg is now 3-0 all-time versus C.W. Post and 8-11-2 against teams from New York, including a 7-4-1 record at home.

The Huskies have gone five consecutive games giving up no more than 14 points for the first time since 2001, and for the first time to start a season since 1951.

Bloomsburg has won five straight to start the season for the 10th time in school history, the third time under Danny Hale, and for the second consecutive year. The only other time this has happened in back-to-back seasons was in 1950 and 1951 under Robert Redman.

The C.W. Post game was the 10th consecutive game the Huskies have not scored 40 points, the longest since a 19 game stretch from 1991 to 1993.

A victory over Millersville will clinch a school record 11th consecutive winning season for the Huskies, breaking the old mark of 10 set from 1946 to 1955.

A FAMILY AFFAIR: Huskies sophomore FB **Matt Cox** comes from a family of fullbacks. His father, Lawrence, played at Temple from 1979-82; his older brother Mike played collegiately at Georgia Tech from 2004-07 and is currently in his second year with the Kansas City Chiefs; and younger brother Lucas is a junior at Georgia Tech.

Coincidentally, current BU assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, **Paul Darragh**, began his playing career at Temple during Lawrence's final year.

ROAD WARRIORS: BU has enjoyed much success on the road as of late. In their last 16 away games, the Huskies are 14-2 and win by an average margin of 28.5-16.3.

CROSSING OVER: The Huskies record with teams in the PSAC West since 1999 - which included Shippensburg until 2008 - is 31-11. They have won six of their last seven games, including the 17-7 win over Mercyhurst. BU is 17-4 at Redman Stadium and 14-7 on the road.

HUSKIES IN THE PLAYOFFS: BU has made the NCAA Division II playoffs in three of the past four seasons and seven times overall. The Huskies claim a 7-7 overall playoff record, including a 5-2 mark games played at Redman Stadium. Last year BU faced two PSAC foes in second round opponent West Chester and California (PA) in the quarterfinals. Bloomsburg defeated the Golden Rams 28-21 before falling to the Vulcans, 27-24.

The Huskies also reached the NCAA playoffs after the 1985, 1996, 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2006 seasons. In 2000, Bloomsburg went 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing to Delta State in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win.

BU VS. RANKED OPPONENTS: Through the years, the Huskies have found success against other top schools in Division II, compiling a 28-34-1 record against ranked teams since 1985. That record has improved since 2000, as BU has gone 19-15, including a 11-5 mark against ranked opponents at Redman Stadium.

Among the 19 victories this decade are home wins against No. 5 IUP, No. 10 Northwood and No. 13 Millersville in 2000; No. 23 West Chester in 2005; No. 17 California in 2006; No. 5 California in 2008; and No. 15 Ashland in 2009. Away wins include No. 2 Cal-Davis and No. 11 Slippery Rock in 2000; No. 3 East Stroudsburg in 2005; No. 5 Shepherd in 2006; No. 15 Ashland in 2008; and No. 17 California in 2009.

REDMAN AT NIGHT: The opening game against Ashland was the very first night game at Redman Stadium. Lights were added prior to the 2008 season, however the latest start time for a game was 3:30 p.m. The Huskies had another late start when they traveled to California and defeated the Vulcans 17-10 on September 5, and will play host to the Marauders of Millersville on Saturday, October 3 at 5 p.m.

Danny Hale

Bloomsburg University Head Coach



Danny Hale, one of the winningest coaches in all of Division II, will begin his 17th season at the helm of the Huskies in 2009. Hale also spent five years as head coach at West Chester University.

At Bloomsburg, Hale has posted a career record of 141-46-1 (.753) and holds the school record for most coaching victories. Overall in 21 years as a head coach he has a mark of 181-59-1 (.753) and is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in NCAA Division II in winning percentage. In his 16 seasons as head coach at Bloomsburg he has led the Huskies to 10 outright or shared Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern

Division titles and six NCAA post-season playoff berths. In the period from 2000 to 2008 the Huskies are also one of the most successful NCAA Division II programs with a combined record of 84-22 (.792).

In 2008 the Huskies started the season winning the first nine games of the year, including wins over nationally-ranked Ashland and California (Pa). Bloomsburg earned a bid to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the sixth time overall, and fifth time this decade, reaching the NCAA Region One finals.

In 2006, the Huskies posted a mark of 12-2 and won the PSAC Eastern Division title, while also capturing the NCAA Northeast Regional title and advancing to the NCAA Division II national semi-finals. Hale was named the PSAC East Coach of the Year, the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division II District I Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year award. By virtue of being a finalist for the award he was featured on an ABC-TV special hosted by Keith Jackson.

In 2005, Hale led the Huskies to a record of 11-1, including an unbeaten (11-0) mark in the regular season. It was just the fourth time in school history that a Bloomsburg team went through the regular season without a loss. He also earned PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year honors and the AFCA District One Coach of the Year award.

The Huskies have reached the NCAA playoffs in 1996, 2000 and 2001 seasons. During the 2000 season the Huskies were 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win. Hale earned the American Football Coaches Association Division II National Coach of the Year following the season.

At West Chester Hale posted a mark of 40-13 and won three PSAC East titles and advanced to the NCAA playoffs in 1988.

Prior to West Chester, Hale was an offensive line and defensive coordinator at Colgate from 1981 to 1983. Prior to Colgate, Hale was the offensive line coach at Bucknell from 1975-80 and was defensive coordinator/linebacker coach at Vermont in 1974.

Hale is a graduate of West Chester, earning his bachelor's and master's degrees in Health and Physical Education in 1968 and 1973. He was an all-conference pick at West Chester and earned the team's most valuable player in the 1967 State Championship game, while also lettering three times for the track and field team. He is a member of the West Chester Football Hall of Fame and the Delaware County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

In 1968 Hale signed with the Pottstown Firebirds, the semi professional farm club of the Philadelphia Eagles, before entering the Marine Corps where he played middle linebacker for the Quantico Marines. Following a three-year stint, he was honorably discharged as a first lieutenant in 1972.

Game 1

Bloomsburg 10, Ashland 7 August 27, 2009

BLOOMSBURG-Senior running back **Stefan Adams** ran for 104 yards, including a key 46-yard run in the fourth quarter, as Bloomsburg University defeated Ashland 10-7 in a battle between two nationally ranked football teams on Thursday night at Redman Stadium.

The 13th-ranked Huskies (1-0) got on the board first with a 28-yard field goal by senior **Jon Koenig** at the 11:11 mark in the first quarter. The kick came after a nine-play, 29-yard drive that was set up by a 42 yard kickoff return by senior cornerback **Jesse Cooper**.

After 15th-ranked Ashland's (0-1) first drive stalled at the Bloomsburg 34, the Eagles tried some trickery when punter Derek Reidel's fourth-down pass was intercepted by sophomore cornerback **Oscar Rivera**. The Huskies then started an eight-play, 85-yard drive that ended when senior quarterback **Dan Latorre** bolted into the endzone from eight yards out to put Bloomsburg up 10-0.

The Huskies defense controlled Ashland for most of the game, forcing two fumbles, two punts and stopping the Eagles four times on fourth down plays through nearly three quarters of play. Seniors **Justin Presley** and **Anthony Smith** led a Bloomsburg goal line stand late in the second quarter, coming up with three stops inside the Husky one yard line.

The Eagles closed the Bloomsburg advantage to three late in the third when Carlin Isles scored from 50 yards out to make the score 10-7. However, the Husky defense stifled Ashland's fourth quarter drives, registering three sacks and forcing Billy Cundiff into 4-of-11 passing for just 24 yards.

Smith led Bloomsburg with 11 tackles while Presley recorded eight, including three sacks. Smith, senior **Alphonso Nathan**, and juniors **Marcus Zimmerman** and **Todd Givler** were also able to get to Cundiff, combining for three sacks.

Latorre finished the game 16-of-28 for 158 yards, while rushing for an additional 18 yards on eight carries. Four of Latorre's runs went for key Bloomsburg first downs. Senior **Jordan Weisman** and sophomore **Branden Wright** each caught four passes for the Huskies.

CALIFORNIA,PA- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** hit **Cory Stiger** with a four-yard touchdown pass with 22 seconds left to play to lift the sixth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies over 17th-ranked California (PA), 17-10, on Saturday night.

After Cal (0-2) had tied the game at 10-10 on an 18-yard scoring pass from Josh Portis to AJ Jackson with a minute to play, the Huskies (2-0) started their game winning drive on their own 39-yard line. After Latorre's first pass fell incomplete, he scrambled for 10 yards out to the Huskies 49-yard line. Following a timeout with 36 seconds to play, the senior quarterback hit a wide-open **Chris Tressler** with a 47-yard bomb to the Vulcans four-yard line. On the next play, Latorre hit Stiger with a touchdown pass, Stiger's first career scoring catch, to put Bloomsburg in front 17-10 with 22 seconds to play.

Cal, though, wasn't done. Portis completed passes of 21 and 14 yards on consecutive plays putting the ball at the Bloomsburg 36-yard line with six seconds to play. After an incomplete pass left just one second to play, Portis' last pass was knocked down by the Huskies **Mike Varanavage** preserving the Bloomsburg win.

The game was a back and forth struggle between the defenses with the only scoring threw the first three quarters being a field goal from Jon Koenig from 42-yards out which tied his career long with 12:47 to play in the second period. In the third period, Cal's Kevin Hagerman connected from 30-yards out tying the score at 3-3 heading to the fourth period.

Bloomsburg went in front 10-3 on a special teams play. A long punt from Bloomsburg was muffed by Cal's Mike Brown and recovered in the end zone by Bloomsburg's **Branden Wright** with 4:29 to play setting up the wild finish.

Latorre finished 12-22 for 166 yards and one score, while **Ben Weaber** caught five passes for 37 yards to lead the receivers. Varanavage finished with 10 tackles and the one key pass break-up, while **Anthony Smith** added eight tackles.

Bloomsburg 17, Mercyhurst 7 September 12, 2009

ERIE-- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** rushed for one score and passed for another to lead fifth-ranked Bloomsburg University to a 17-7 win over Mercyhurst College on Saturday. The win was the 10th straight road win for the Huskies dating back to 2007.

After a scoreless opening period of the game, the Huskies (3-0) finally got on the board on a career-best 47-yard field goal from **Jon Koenig** with two minutes left in the half. The senior's kick capped an eight-play, 46-yard for the Huskies that included a 20-yard run from **Kenny Domzalski** and an 18-yard pass from Latorre to **Ben Weaber**.

On the ensuing drive for the drive Mercyhurst (1-2) quarterback Joe Laffey had a pass intercepted by Bloomsburg linebacker **Anthony Smith** who returned the ball to the Laker 23-yard line 1:03 left in the period. The Huskies drove to the Mercyhurst one-yard line, aided with a pass interference call, which set up a one-yard run from Latorre with 19 seconds left in the half making it 10-0 at the break.

Bloomsburg made it 17-0 early in the fourth period when **Cory Stiger** caught a four-yard scoring pass from Latorre to cap a 44-yard scoring drive. The big play in the drive was a 41-yard reception by **Chris Tressler** putting the Huskies in scoring position.

Mercyhurst finally got on the board in the fourth period when Laffey completed a one-yard pass to Josh Szeluga with 6:08 to go. The Lakers would get the ball back two more times in the final six minutes, but the Bloomsburg defense stopped the Lakers on both occasions. On a fourth and two at the Bloomsburg 38, the Huskies **Thomas McFarland** made a stop for a loss of two yards to turn the ball over on downs, while **Domenique Price** intercepted a pass on Mercyhurst's final drive to seal the victory.

Domzalski rushed for a game-high 86 yards and went over 1,000 yards for his career. Latorre finished 12-24 for 112 yards and one score. Defensively, Smith had another big game for the Huskies with a team-high 11 tackles, seven of them solo. He also intercepted one pass and broke up another. As a team, Bloomsburg allowed just one touchdown for the third straight game and allowed just 192 yards of total offense. Mercyhurst quarterback Joe Laffey was 19-36 for 130 yards and one interception.

KUTZTOWN-- The fourth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies extended their road winning streak to 11 games with a 31-12 win over Kutztown University on Saturday night.

Bloomsburg (4-0, 1-0 in the PSAC East) took the lead midway through the first period when sophomore **Derrick Price**, seeing his first action of the season, scored on a three-yard run with 5:39 left in the first period. The score capped a 91-yard drive with the big play being a 56-yard completion from **Dan Latorre** to **Jordan Weisman**.

Bloomsburg 28, C.W. Post 14 September 26, 2009

BLOOMSBURG-Sophomore **Derrick Price** ran for 185 yards and three touchdowns as No. 4 Bloomsburg University defeated C.W. Post 28-14 in PSAC football action on Saturday afternoon at Redman Stadium.

The Huskies (5-0, 2-0) got on the scoreboard first at the 10:57 mark in the first quarter with a 20-yard touchdown pass from senior **Dan Latorre** to junior **Cory Stiger**. This capped off a four-play, 62-yard drive. Freshman **Jared Shannon** tacked on the extra point to give Bloomsburg an early 7-0 lead.

The Pioneers (1-4, 1-1) struck back with an eight-play drive that covered 80 yards, resulting in a 17-yard scoring toss from Eric Anderwkavich to Chris Harris to tie the score at 7-7.

Starting at their own 33-yard line, the Huskies regained the lead using first down receptions by Stiger and several runs by sophomore **Kenny Domzalski** to get the ball to the C.W. Post one-yard line. A second down touchdown run by Price helped stretch the Huskies lead to 14-7.

The Huskies defense made two second quarter stops when they forced a turnover on downs inside their own 10-yard line and got an interception by sophomore **Vince Browning**, ending the late first half drive.

The Huskies would increase their lead less than five minutes into the second half when, after a 28-yard pass from Latorre to senior **Jordan Weisman**, Price galloped up the middle for a 33-yard touchdown run. The scoring drive covered 79 yards and used up just 1:35 on the clock.

The defenses tightened up as both teams traded punts and neither was able to get much going throughout the rest of the third and much of the fourth quarter. The Pioneers did find some offensive life and closed the gap to 21-14 on a 15-yard pass from Anderwkavich to Harris with 3:08 left in the game.

After a failed pouch kickoff gave the Huskies the ball at their own 49-yard line, Price went to work rushing four times for 44 yards to the Pioneers seven-yard line. After a three yard pass to sophomore **Dylan Manni**, Price busted up the middle for his third touchdown of the day to give the Huskies a 14-point advantage with 1:34 remaining.

Latorre finished 10-of-17 for 125 yards and a touchdown and Stiger caught four passes for 84 yards. Senior **Anthony Smith** led all tacklers with 19 stops, including a sack and a forced fumble. Junior **Mike Varanavage** recorded 11 tackles while sophomore **Oscar Rivera** had nine tackles and two pass breakups.
