MATCH UP: The third-ranked and undefeated Huskies welcome Shippensburg to Redman Stadium in a game that will decide the winner of the PSAC Eastern Division. BU enters with a record of 8-0, 5-0 in the conference while Shippensburg is 6-2, 4-1 in the PSAC. The Red Raiders come into the matchup after last Saturday's 24-19 win over West Chester. The Huskies defeated Cheyney 28-6 last Saturday as TB **Derrick Price** scored three touchdowns on the ground and the defense forced two turnovers.

THE HEAD COACHES: Huskies coach **Danny Hale** (West Chester '68) is in his 17th year on the Bloomsburg sideline, racking up a 144-46-1 (.757) record. The 144 wins are first all-time in school history. For his career, Hale is 184-59-1 and his winning percentage of .756 is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in Division II. Hale has led BU to six playoff appearances, including the latest in 2008. He has been honored as the PSAC East Coach of the Year 10 times, the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year nine times, and was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year following the 2000 season.

Rocky Rees (West Chester '71) is in his 20th season as head coach of the Red Raiders and has amassed an overall record of 109-101-1 (.519). In his 37 years as a head coach, Rees has a career mark of 145-116-2 (.555) and ranks 10th among all active Division II coaches in wins. Shippensburg's all-time leader in career wins has coached 28 All-PSAC selections over the past three seasons, including 12 in 2006. Before the Red Raiders, Rees spent five years as the head coach at Susquehanna University.

REGIONAL RANKINGS: The Huskies remain ranked No. 1 in the third NCAA Division II Regional Football Poll of 2009. The poll, which determines playoff seeding in each region, features BU and its 8-0 record in the top spot of Super Regional One for the third straight week. The top six schools from each region make the playoffs, while the first two seeds receive first-round byes. This year, BU's region will be paired with Super Regional Four for the semifinal round. LAST MEETING

Bloomsburg 21, Shippensburg 0 October 25, 2008

SHIPPENSBURG-- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** rushed for 125 yards and two touchdowns to lead Bloomsburg University (9-0, 6-0 PSAC East) to a 21-0 win over Shippensburg University in Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) action. The win was the 14th straight for the Huskies dating back to last year which ties the school record first set back during the 1949-50 seasons. The winning streak is the third longest in all of college football.

The 125 yards rushing for Latorre, on just eight carries, was a career-high, while the shutout was the second of the season for the Huskies.

Bloomsburg scored on its second drive of the game when **Derrick Price** ran 37-yards for a score. On the drive Bloomsburg converted a fourth and one, which two plays later led to Price's touchdown run. The Huskies added to their lead in the second quarter when Latorre scrambled 48-yards down the sideline for a touchdown to make it 14-0 capping a 91-yard scoring drive. A big play in the drive was a 26-yard pickup on a swing pass from Latorre to Price.

Then, just before halftime the Huskies added to their lead when Latorre scrambled out of the pocket again and went 47-yard down the sidelines for his second score of the day and a 21-0 lead.

In the second half, with the game being played in a steady rain, there was no scoring for either team.

Along with Latorre rushing for more than 100 yards, Price finished with 111 yards on 21 carries and a touchdown.

SCOUTING SHIPPENSBURG: The Red Raiders enter as the top scoring team in the PSAC East, putting up an impressive 33.9 points per game. The Shippensburg offense averages 394.0 yards per game, good for third in the conference, with the running game ranked second overall at 180.5 yards per game. Shippensburg will use a variety of running backs, as Kevin Herod leads the team in rushing (67.9 pg), Kevin Marshall is second (42.4) and Roshaan McCain is the big play threat (6.8 avg.). Quarterback Chad DiFebbo leads a passing offense that is tied-for-fifth in the PSAC with 213.5 yards per game. He completes 51.5 percent of his passes, is second in the conference with 19 touchdown passes and has a pass efficiency rating of 142.9. Mike Harris is DiFebbo's go-to-guy, averaging 17.2 yards on 43 catches with eight touchdowns and averages a conference-best 92.6 yards per game.

The Red Raiders defense is led by a trio of linebackers in Vinne Ranauto, Andy Casale and Riley Bowen. The group has combined for 127 tackles and 17.5 tackles-for-loss. Cornerback Travis Proctor is second in the conference with four interceptions, returning one for a touchdown. The Red Raiders are eighth in the PSAC with a scoring defense of 21.8 points per game.

Kyler Ford handles all kicking duties for Shippensburg. He's connected on 7-of-11 field goals this season and is second in the PSAC with a 40.7-yard punting average.

TEAM OF THE DECADE: From 2000-2009, the Huskies have been the most dominant team in the PSAC, boasting an overall record of 92-22 (.807). That winning percentage puts the the Huskies as the fifth winningest Division II team this decade. Grand Valley State (.906), Tuskegee (.847), Valdosta State (.843) and Northwest Missouri State (.835) sit in front of BU for the best winning percentages this decade. Since 2000, Bloomsburg has made the playoffs five times and has a conference record of 53-6 (.898).

BEASTS OF THE EAST: Dating back to 2005, the Huskies own a 31-3 record against PSAC East foes. During that span, BU is 16-2 against the East at home and 15-1 away from Redman Stadium. 26 of the 31 wins have come while ranked in the top 25.

WINNING WHEN THEY'RE RANKED: Bloomsburg has flexed its muscles when ranked in the top 25 posting a 81-19 overall record since 1985. The Huskies are 74-13 when ranked in the regular season and 42-7 at home.

IN THE TOP 10: The Huskies are no stranger to a top-10 national ranking. Since 2001, BU has played 42 times while ranked in the top 10 of a national poll, five of those during the playoffs. They are 35-7 in games when ranked among the top 10 nationally, including 3-0 against Shippensburg.

HALE IN THE PSAC: With the win over East Stroudsburg, Danny Hale has moved into sole possession of third place for most career PSAC victories and now has 184. Hale was previously tied with IUP's Frank Cignetti and now stands behind behind ESU's Denny Douds (currently 224) and Millersville's Gene Carpenter (212).

THE GRADUATE: QB **Dan Latorre**, now in his fourth year as the starter, graduated as a triple major in the spring and is now in grad school. One of the best players to ever wear a Husky uniform, Latorre, who was named first team All-PSAC East last year, heads into the 2009 season third all-time in school history in both yards passing and touchdowns and is the all-time leader in rushing yards by a quarterback.

MR. EVERYTHING:

Latorre is featured in the latest edition of *Bloomsburg: The University Magazine*.

The story, written by Husky play-by-play commentator Jim Doyle, details Latorre's athletic and academic accomplishments. In addition to receiving first-team All-PSAC honors for his play in 2008, Latorre earned a 3.78 grade point average while taking 19 credits.

GOING FOR A GRAND: Latorre just doesn't rely on his arm to lead the Huskies down the field, but also his legs. His 545 rushing yards last season was a record for a BU quarterback and with his 191 yards during 2007, he is closing in on 1,000 career rushing yards. After rushing for 22 yards in the win over Cheyney, Latorre currently stands at 867 yards.

KRASH AND DASH: Sophomore tailbacks **Kenny Domzalski** (Krash) and **Derrick Price** (Dash) have proven to be a formidable duo during their nearly two years together on the Bloomsburg campus. They have combined for 13 100-yard games between them, including three times in the same game (Ashland, Mercyhurst and Millersville in 2008). The Huskies are 9-1 when either player breaks the century mark in rushing.

In the past five games, Krash and Dash have combined to rush 136 times for 809 yards and 12 touchdowns, with nine runs of over 20 yards, including a 59-yard joint (by Price) and a 38-yard touchdown (by Domzalski) against East Stroudsburg. Their combined average rushing yards per game (165.4) is tops in the PSAC East among running duos. C.W. Post's Anthony Beverly and Eric Anderwkavich is second (161.4) and Cheyney's Ron Hunter and Angel Rodriguez is third (122.4).

THE PRICE IS RIGHT: Derrick Price leads the Huskies in rushing in 2009, averaging 110.8 yards in five games. The sophomore is averaging 6.0 yards per carry and has 11 touchdowns. Price doesn't currently qualify for PSAC individual statistics because he has not played in 75 percent of the Huskies games, but if he did, he would rank first in rushing yards, first in scoring (13.2 points per game) and third in all-purpose yards (124.6 per game). With his 165-yard performance at East Stroudsburg, Price entered BU's top-10 in career rushing yards and currently has 1,833. Price passed **Jerry Marks** (1988-91), who had 1,694 yards in his career with the Huskies. **Josh Heck** (2003-07) is ninth all-time with 2,115 rushing yards. Last year, Price ran for 1,279 yards and seven touchdowns, winning PSAC East Rookie of the Year and receiving first team All-PSAC East honors.

In his freshman year of 2008, he ran for 878 yards, good for second on the team. So far this season, Domzalski is second on the Huskies with 437 yards on 99 carries. He now has 1,315 career rushing yards, 518 behind Price for 10th in BU history.

WEARING 'EM DOWN: The Huskies have relied on successful 4th quarter running performances to wear down opponents and help gain victories over Ashland, Cal, Kutztown, C.W. Post and most recently, East Stroudsburg. Against the Warriors, BU ran a total of 15 times for 164 yards and two touchdowns from Price and Domzalski.

BU ROLLIN': The Huskies offense has improved dramatically over the last five games. Heading into the matchup against Kutztown, BU was averaging 14.7 points, 122.3 rushing yards and 267.7 total yards per game, each no better than 13th-ranked in the PSAC. In the five weeks since, the Huskies have averaged 31.8 points, 196.6 rushing yards and 348.6 total yards per contest and are 24-of-55 (43.6 percent) on third-down conversions.

SPREADING IT OUT: The Huskies have relied on several players to catch passes during their first eight games of 2009. BU's 101 total completions have been spread out among 15 different receivers: seven wide receivers, five running backs and three tight ends. Against Millersville, nine different players caught passes for the Huskies.

GOING DEEP: The Huskies have tried several deep passes each game in 2009, connecting on five passes of over 40 yards. Junior WR **Chris Tressler** has been the main beneficiary of those deep balls, recording a 47-yarder against Cal, a 41-yarder against Meryhurst, and another 47-yard pass against Kutztown. Senior WR **Jordan Weisman** has been on the receiving end of the other two 40-plus plays, catching a 40-yarder in the opener against Ashland and a 56-yarder against Kutztown.

WEABER GRILLS OPPONENTS: So far in 2009, junior TE **Ben Weaber** has 21 catches for 249 yards. Last week against Cheyney, Weaber had three catches for 76 yards, including a 38-yarder in third quarter. Against East Stroudsburg, Weaber recorded a career-high six receptions for 69 yards. Many of his catches included stiff arming defenders and breaking tackles. Three weeks ago, Weaber made a nice, one-handed grab against Millersville right after snatching a sidearm shovel pass from a scrambling Latorre. For his career, Weaber has 43 receptions for 510 yards and a touchdown.

HOLDING THE LEAD: The field goal by East Stroudsburg in the first quarter two weeks ago marked the first time all year that the Huskies had trailed in a game. BU would tie the game 6:36 later when **Jon Koenig** connected on a field goal of his own to tie the game at 3-3. Another ESU field goal in the second quarter put the Huskies down for just the second time, but would go ahead for good when Latorre found **Cory Stiger** for a 29-yard touchdown. In all, Bloomsburg has trailed for just seven minutes and 25 seconds this season.

NATIONALLY RANKED DEFENSE: The Huskies defense has dominated opponents this season, giving up just 9.9 points per game, which ranks first in the PSAC and is tops in all of Division II. BU is also near the top nationally in total yards allowed (268.6 - 13th in DII; second in PSAC), rushing yards allowed (96.6 - 26th in DII; fourth in PSAC), redzone defense (65.0% - tied for 17th in DII; third in PSAC) and fourth down defense (6.2% - first in DII; first in PSAC).

In addition, the BU defense averages 3.25 sacks per game (tied for 10th in DII), 7.63 tackles-for-loss per game (tied for 35th in DII), and forces opposing quarterbacks to post a pass efficiency rating of just 106.22 (26th in DII).

1ST HALF DOMINANCE: The touchdown by C.W. Post in the first quarter four weeks ago was the first given up in the first half by Bloomsburg all season. The week before at Kutztown, the Golden Bears field goal in the second quarter was the first points given up by the Huskies in the first half of any game this year.

KEEPIN' IT LOW: The Huskies have kept opposing offenses at bay, allowing an average of just 9.9 points per game. What is even more impressive is the amount of points BU's opponents have scored against other teams. Ashland, which is averaging 32.1 points per game against its seven other opponents, scored only seven against the Huskies. Cal, which managed only 10 points against BU, has averaged 37.3 points in other games, including 38 last week against Edinboro.

A-TRAIN: Senior LB **Anthony Smith** leads all Husky defenders and is second in the PSAC with 80 tackles (10.0 pg) in 2009. The senior has been named PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week after games against Ashland, Mercyhurst and C.W. Post. Against the Eagles, Smith registered 11 tackles, including five solo, and a half-sack. He led keyed a goal line stand in the second quarter and helped lead a defense that allowed just 261 yards to one of the nation's top ranked offenses. Against Mercyhurst, Smith had another 11-tackle game and had his first career interception, which was

returned 15 yards to set up a late 1st half score. Two weeks ago against the Pioneers, Smith recorded a career-high 19 tackles, a sack and a forced fumble to win the award for the third time this season.

THE 'BACKERS: Smith isn't the only linebacker making plays for the Huskies. Junior **Mike Varanavage** topped all tacklers against Cal with 10 and had 11 stops against C.W. Post. He is second on the team and tied-for-10th in the PSAC with 63 tackles (7.9 pg) this year, recording at least seven in seven of the Huskies eight games. Varanavage also knocked down the Vulcans Hail Mary pass in the closing seconds to seal a 17-10 victory. Junior **Thomas McFarland** is third on

He also recorded six with 3.0 tackles-for-loss and a sack against East Stroudsburg and eight with one tackle-for-loss against Mercyhurst. Redshirt freshmen **Ryan Feldman** and **Jarrett Pidgeon** have also seen action in recent weeks, each posting career-highs in tackles against Millersville (Feldman with five, Pidgeon with four). Feldman also had a key forced fumble in the third quarter against East Stroudsburg that was recovered by the Huskies.

DOMINATING D-LINE:

Senior **Justin Presley** is second in the PSAC and is tied-for-21st in Division II with seven sacks (0.88 pg) through eight weeks and his 12.0 tackles-for-loss (1.50 pg) is third in the conference. Presley has teamed with fellow senior **Alphonso**

Nathan and juniors **Dave Huot** and **Marcus Zimmerman** to provide the defense with a constant pass rush and tackles behind the line of scrimmage. That trio has combined for 19.0 tackles-for-loss and 10.0 sacks this season.

Junior **Todd Givler** and sophomores **Kenny Orlando** and **John Pettine** have also been threats to opposing offenses, combining for 40 tackles, 8.0 tackles-for-loss, 4.5 sacks and two pass breakups so far in 2009.

THE DBs: The BU defensive backs have helped the Huskies limit opponents to just 172.0 passing yards per game. Sophomore **Oscar Rivera** leads all Husky defensive backs and is fourth on the team with 44 tackles from his cornerback spot, including two tackles-for-loss. Rivera also has an interception and five pass breakups, including back-to-back breakups in the 3rd quarter against C.W. Post which helped end a Pioneers drive. Junior **Alex Landis** has recorded 35 tackles, including 0.5 tackle-for-loss. He has also posted an interception, has two forced fumbles and five pass breakups this year.

Senior **Jesse Cooper** has been rarely tested this year, but has turned in some key defensive plays. He recorded a pass breakup on a key third down and returned a fumble 29 yards in the second quarter against East Stroudsburg and picked off a pass against Mercyhurst. Senior **Domenique Price** picked off his second pass of the season against the Warriors and has chipped in with 27 tackles, 3.0 tackles-for-loss and four pass breakups this season.

Sophomores **Vince Browning** and **Andre Glover** have received more playing time as the year has gone on, combining for 30 tackles, three pass breakups, and two interceptions. Junior **Dan Oliver** received his first significant playing time against Kutztown, notching four tackles and a pass breakup. He is seventh on the Huskies with 28 tackles and has two pass breakups this year.

POSITIVE RETURNS: Freshman **Brandon Real** has found success returning kicks in his first season with the Huskies, averaging 27.6 yards on kickoff returns and 24.6 yards on punt returns. Last week against Cheyney, he had a 51-yard kickoff return. Against Millersville, Real had a 68-yard punt return for a touchdown and a 54-yard kickoff return. Jesse Cooper has also flashed big plays in the return game, returning the opening kickoffs against Ashland and Mercyhurst 42 and 44 yards, respectively. He is averaging 24.3 yards on kickoff returns and has 10 punt returns for 54 yards, including a 28-yard return late in the 4th quarter against Ashland.

JUST FOR KICKS: After going 4-for-4 on extra points against ESU, senior **Jon Koenig** has extended his streak of consecutive made point-after kicks to 86. His streak started against Cheyney in 2007 and extended through 2008 when he connected on 54-of-54 kicks.

Koenig established a new career-long against Kutztown with a 50-yard field goal. The kick came at the 11:17 mark of the 4th quarter and put the Huskies up 24-6. He is now 4-for-6 on field goals of 40-plus yards this year, including a 49-yarder last Saturday against the Warriors.

In the first week of October, Koenig was honored as one of 13 recipients of the Fred Mitchell Award for the month of September. The award recognizes NCAA Division II and Division III place kickers for excellence on the football field and in the community.

KOENIG CLIMBING THE LIST: Koenig currently stands third all-time in PSAC history in career PATs made with 168. He entered his final season with 146, 33 behind all-time leader Alex Walsh (179) of West Chester. Koenig now sits two behind East Stroudsburg's Mark Brubaker, who finished his career with 170.

Koenig also sits just two field goals behind **Bill Beall** (1992-95) and **Mark Weiss** (1988-91) for the most field goals made in BU history. Beall and Weiss both ended their careers with 29 field goals, while Koenig has 27 during his career.

THE FRESHMEN: Kicker **Jared Shannon** has been one of a few true freshman getting playing time for the Huskies in 2009. He handles BU's kickoffs and the Huskies rank first in the PSAC in kickoff average at 62.2 yards, and Shannon has six touchbacks. In other words, he routinely makes the returner field the kick around their own eight-yard line. Given additional duties against C.W. Post, Shannon scored the first points of his career, going 4-for-4 on extra points.

In addition to his return duties, TB Brandon Real saw his first collegiate action earlier this year against Cal, carrying the ball eight times for 19 yards, including a 12-yard run on the Huskies first scoring drive early in the 2nd quarter. Real has 18 carries for 46 yards on the year. WR **Kyle Fisher** has played in four games this year for BU, making his mark on special teams. Fisher has four tackles this season, including two against Cal on kick coverage, and returned a kickoff 33 yards against Kutztown. Fisher saw his first action on offense against Cheyney, catching a swing pass for nine yards and losing one yard on a reverse.

FROM THE ARCHIVES: A victory over Shippensburg will give the Huskies the Eastern Division title for the first time since 2006 and allow them to play in the PSAC title game for the first time since 1985 when they defeated IUP.

Since 1995 Bloomsburg has won five of the last six at home versus Shippensburg, losing only in 2003.

The 21-0 shut-out last year was the first time the Huskies had blanked Shippensburg since 1932.

Bloomsburg has won five straight to start the season for the sixth time in school history and the third time in the last five years.

The 79 points the Bloomsburg defense has surrendered in their first eight games is the least since the 1997 team gave up 76, and is the third best start in the last 50 seasons. The best defensive start during that time period was 59 points surrendered in the first eight games in 1988.

The Huskies have gone eight consecutive games giving up no more than 14 points for the first time since a 14 game stretch from 1950 to 1952. Only seven streaks in school history have been longer than the current one.

Bloomsburg now has 40 all-time victories against Cheyney: 20 at home, 20 on the road, and 20 straight overall.

The 22 point win over Cheyney was the closest game in the series since Danny Hale's first season in 1993 when BU won by 18 points, 24-6.

A FAMILY AFFAIR: Huskies sophomore FB **Matt Cox** comes from a family of fullbacks. His father, Lawrence, played at Temple from 1979-82; his older brother Mike played collegiately at Georgia Tech from 2004-07 and is currently in his second year with the Kansas City Chiefs; and younger brother Lucas is a junior at Georgia Tech.

Coincidentally, current BU assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, **Paul Darragh**, began his playing career at Temple during Lawrence's final year.

HUSKIES IN THE PLAYOFFS: BU has made the NCAA Division II playoffs in three of the past four seasons and seven times overall. The Huskies claim a 7-7 overall playoff record, including a 5-2 mark in games played at Redman Stadium. Last year BU faced two PSAC foes in second round opponent West Chester and California (PA) in the quarterfinals. Bloomsburg defeated the Golden Rams 28-21 before falling to the Vulcans, 27-24.

The Huskies also reached the NCAA playoffs after the 1985, 1996, 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2006 seasons. In 2000, Bloomsburg went 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing to Delta State in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win.

Danny Hale

Bloomsburg University Head Coach



Danny Hale, one of the winningest coaches in all of Division II, will begin his 17th season at the helm of the Huskies in 2009. Hale also spent five years as head coach at West Chester University.

At Bloomsburg, Hale has posted a career record of 144-46-1 (.757) and holds the school record for most coaching victories. Overall in 21 years as a head coach he has a mark of 184-59-1 (.756) and is ranked among the top 10 active coaches in NCAA Division II in winning percentage. In his 16 seasons as head coach at Bloomsburg he has led the Huskies to 10 outright or shared Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern

Division titles and six NCAA post-season playoff berths. From 2000 to 2009 the Huskies are also one of the most successful NCAA Division II programs with a combined record of 92-22 (.807).

In 2008 the Huskies started the season winning the first nine games of the year, including wins over nationally-ranked Ashland and California (Pa). Bloomsburg earned a bid to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the sixth time overall, and fifth time this decade, reaching the NCAA Region One finals.

In 2006, the Huskies posted a mark of 12-2 and won the PSAC Eastern Division title, while also capturing the NCAA Northeast Regional title and advancing to the NCAA Division II national semi-finals. Hale was named the PSAC East Coach of the Year, the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division II District I Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year award. By virtue of being a finalist for the award he was featured on an ABC-TV special hosted by Keith Jackson.

In 2005, Hale led the Huskies to a record of 11-1, including an unbeaten (11-0) mark in the regular season. It was just the fourth time in school history that a Bloomsburg team went through the regular season without a loss. He also earned PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year honors and the AFCA District One Coach of the Year award.

The Huskies have reached the NCAA playoffs in 1996, 2000 and 2001 seasons. During the 2000 season the Huskies were 12-3 and advanced to the NCAA championship game, eventually losing in the title contest. The team reached the finals after rallying from a 19-point deficit against UC-Davis in the national semi-finals to post a 58-48 win. Hale earned the American Football Coaches Association Division II National Coach of the Year following the season.

At West Chester Hale posted a mark of 40-13 and won three PSAC East titles and advanced to the NCAA playoffs in 1988.

Prior to West Chester, Hale was an offensive line and defensive coordinator at Colgate from 1981 to 1983. Prior to Colgate, Hale was the offensive line coach at Bucknell from 1975-80 and was defensive coordinator/linebacker coach at Vermont in 1974.

Hale is a graduate of West Chester, earning his bachelor's and master's degrees in Health and Physical Education in 1968 and 1973. He was an all-conference pick at West Chester and earned the team's most valuable player in the 1967 State Championship game, while also lettering three times for the track and field team. He is a member of the West Chester Football Hall of Fame and the Delaware County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

In 1968 Hale signed with the Pottstown Firebirds, the semi professional farm club of the Philadelphia Eagles, before entering the Marine Corps where he played middle linebacker for the Quantico Marines. Following a three-year stint, he was honorably discharged as a first lieutenant in 1972.

2009 Game Recaps

Game 1

Bloomsburg 10, Ashland 7 August 27, 2009

BLOOMSBURG-Senior running back **Stefan Adams** ran for 104 yards, including a key 46-yard run in the fourth quarter, as Bloomsburg University defeated Ashland 10-7 in a battle between two nationally ranked football teams on Thursday night at Redman Stadium.

The 13th-ranked Huskies (1-0) got on the board first with a 28-yard field goal by senior **Jon Koenig** at the 11:11 mark in the first quarter. The kick came after a nine-play, 29-yard drive that was set up by a 42 yard kickoff return by senior cornerback **Jesse Cooper**.

After 15th-ranked Ashland's (0-1) first drive stalled at the Bloomsburg 34, the Eagles tried some trickery when punter Derek Reidel's fourth-down pass was intercepted by sophomore cornerback **Oscar Rivera**. The Huskies then started an eight-play, 85-yard drive that ended when senior quarterback **Dan Latorre** bolted into the endzone from eight yards out to put Bloomsburg up 10-0.

The Huskies defense controlled Ashland for most of the game, forcing two fumbles, two punts and stopping the Eagles four times on fourth down plays through nearly three quarters of play. Seniors **Justin Presley** and **Anthony Smith** led a Bloomsburg goal line stand late in the second quarter, coming up with three stops inside the Husky one yard line.

The Eagles closed the Bloomsburg advantage to three late in the third when Carlin Isles scored from 50 yards out to make the score 10-7. However, the Husky defense stifled Ashland's fourth quarter drives, registering three sacks and forcing Billy Cundiff into 4-of-11 passing for just 24 yards.

Smith led Bloomsburg with 11 tackles while Presley recorded eight, including three sacks. Smith, senior **Alphonso Nathan**, and juniors **Marcus Zimmerman** and **Todd Givler** were also able to get to Cundiff, combining for three sacks.

Latorre finished the game 16-of-28 for 158 yards, while rushing for an additional 18 yards on eight carries. Four of Latorre's runs went for key Bloomsburg first downs. Senior **Jordan Weisman** and sophomore **Branden Wright** each caught four passes for the Huskies.

CALIFORNIA,PA- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** hit **Cory Stiger** with a four-yard touchdown pass with 22 seconds left to play to lift the sixth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies over 17th-ranked California (PA), 17-10, on Saturday night.

After Cal (0-2) had tied the game at 10-10 on an 18-yard scoring pass from Josh Portis to AJ Jackson with a minute to play, the Huskies (2-0) started their game winning drive on their own 39-yard line. After Latorre's first pass fell incomplete, he scrambled for 10 yards out to the Huskies 49-yard line. Following a timeout with 36 seconds to play, the senior quarterback hit a wide-open **Chris Tressler** with a 47-yard bomb to the Vulcans four-yard line. On the next play, Latorre hit Stiger with a touchdown pass, Stiger's first career scoring catch, to put Bloomsburg in front 17-10 with 22 seconds to play.

Cal, though, wasn't done. Portis completed passes of 21 and 14 yards on consecutive plays putting the ball at the Bloomsburg 36-yard line with six seconds to play. After an incomplete pass left just one second to play, Portis' last pass was knocked down by the Huskies **Mike Varanavage** preserving the Bloomsburg win.

The game was a back and forth struggle between the defenses with the only scoring threw the first three quarters being a field goal from Jon Koenig from 42-yards out which tied his career long with 12:47 to play in the second period. In the third period, Cal's Kevin Hagerman connected from 30-yards out tying the score at 3-3 heading to the fourth period.

Bloomsburg went in front 10-3 on a special teams play. A long punt from Bloomsburg was muffed by Cal's Mike Brown and recovered in the end zone by Bloomsburg's **Branden Wright** with 4:29 to play setting up the wild finish.

Latorre finished 12-22 for 166 yards and one score, while **Ben Weaber** caught five passes for 37 yards to lead the receivers. Varanavage finished with 10 tackles and the one key pass break-up, while **Anthony Smith** added eight tackles.

Bloomsburg 17, Mercyhurst 7 September 12, 2009

ERIE-- Quarterback **Dan Latorre** rushed for one score and passed for another to lead fifth-ranked Bloomsburg University to a 17-7 win over Mercyhurst College on Saturday. The win was the 10th straight road win for the Huskies dating back to 2007.

After a scoreless opening period of the game, the Huskies (3-0) finally got on the board on a career-best 47-yard field goal from **Jon Koenig** with two minutes left in the half. The senior's kick capped an eight-play, 46-yard for the Huskies that included a 20-yard run from **Kenny Domzalski** and an 18-yard pass from Latorre to **Ben Weaber**.

On the ensuing drive for the drive Mercyhurst (1-2) quarterback Joe Laffey had a pass intercepted by Bloomsburg linebacker **Anthony Smith** who returned the ball to the Laker 23-yard line 1:03 left in the period. The Huskies drove to the Mercyhurst one-yard line, aided with a pass interference call, which set up a one-yard run from Latorre with 19 seconds left in the half making it 10-0 at the break.

Bloomsburg made it 17-0 early in the fourth period when **Cory Stiger** caught a four-yard scoring pass from Latorre to cap a 44-yard scoring drive. The big play in the drive was a 41-yard reception by **Chris Tressler** putting the Huskies in scoring position.

Mercyhurst finally got on the board in the fourth period when Laffey completed a one-yard pass to Josh Szeluga with 6:08 to go. The Lakers would get the ball back two more times in the final six minutes, but the Bloomsburg defense stopped the Lakers on both occasions. On a fourth and two at the Bloomsburg 38, the Huskies **Thomas McFarland** made a stop for a loss of two yards to turn the ball over on downs, while **Domenique Price** intercepted a pass on Mercyhurst's final drive to seal the victory.

Domzalski rushed for a game-high 86 yards and went over 1,000 yards for his career. Latorre finished 12-24 for 112 yards and one score. Defensively, Smith had another big game for the Huskies with a team-high 11 tackles, seven of them solo. He also intercepted one pass and broke up another. As a team, Bloomsburg allowed just one touchdown for the third straight game and allowed just 192 yards of total offense. Mercyhurst quarterback Joe Laffey was 19-36 for 130 yards and one interception.

KUTZTOWN-- The fourth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies extended their road winning streak to 11 games with a 31-12 win over Kutztown University on Saturday night.

Bloomsburg (4-0, 1-0 in the PSAC East) took the lead midway through the first period when sophomore **Derrick Price**, seeing his first action of the season, scored on a three-yard run with 5:39 left in the first period. The score capped a 91-yard drive with the big play being a 56-yard completion from **Dan Latorre** to **Jordan Weisman**.

Kutztown (2-2, 0-1 PSAC East) got on the board at 10:18 of the second on a 30-yard field goal by Matt Dineen. The points were the first scored against the Huskies defense in the first half this season.

Koenig pushed the Huskies lead to 24-6, when the senior stepped back and drilled a career-long 50-yard field goal. It was just a week ago that Koenig hit a then career-long 47-yard field goal.

Later in the period the Huskies made it a 31-6 game when Price would run 29-yards for a score with 5:39 left in the game. Kutztown tacked on a late score to make the final 31-12.

Price finished with 105 yards rushing and two scores, while Smith was one of four defenders with seven tackles each for the Huskies.

Bloomsburg 28, C.W. Post 14 September 26, 2009

BLOOMSBURG-Sophomore **Derrick Price** ran for 185 yards and three touchdowns as No. 4 Bloomsburg University defeated C.W. Post 28-14 in PSAC football action on Saturday afternoon at Redman Stadium.

The Huskies (5-0, 2-0) got on the scoreboard first at the 10:57 mark in the first quarter with a 20-yard touchdown pass from senior **Dan Latorre** to junior **Cory Stiger**. This capped off a four-play, 62-yard drive. Freshman **Jared Shannon** tacked on the extra point to give Bloomsburg an early 7-0 lead.

The Pioneers (1-4, 1-1) struck back with an eight-play drive that covered 80 yards, resulting in a 17-yard scoring toss from Eric Anderwkavich to Chris Harris to tie the score at 7-7.

Starting at their own 33-yard line, the Huskies regained the lead using first down receptions by Stiger and several runs by sophomore **Kenny Domzalski** to get the ball to the C.W. Post one-yard line. A second down touchdown run by Price helped stretch the Huskies lead to 14-7.

The Huskies defense made two second quarter stops when they forced a turnover on downs inside their own 10-yard line and got an interception by sophomore **Vince Browning**, ending the late first half drive.

The Huskies would increase their lead less than five minutes into the second half when, after a 28-yard pass from Latorre to senior **Jordan Weisman**, Price galloped up the middle for a 33-yard touchdown run. The scoring drive covered 79 yards and used up just 1:35 on the clock.

The defenses tightened up as both teams traded punts and neither was able to get much going throughout the rest of the third and much of the fourth quarter. The Pioneers did find some offensive life and closed the gap to 21-14 on a 15-yard pass from Anderwkavich to Harris with 3:08 left in the game.

After a failed pouch kickoff gave the Huskies the ball at their own 49-yard line, Price went to work rushing four times for 44 yards to the Pioneers seven-yard line. After a three yard pass to sophomore **Dylan Manni**, Price busted up the middle for his third touchdown of the day to give the Huskies a 14-point advantage with 1:34 remaining.

Latorre finished 10-of-17 for 125 yards and a touchdown and Stiger caught four passes for 84 yards. Senior **Anthony Smith** led all tacklers with 19 stops, including a sack and a forced fumble. Junior **Mike Varanavage** recorded 11 tackles while sophomore **Oscar Rivera** had nine tackles and two pass breakups.

Bloomsburg 45, Millersville 10 October 3, 2009

BLOOMSBURG --Quarterback **Dan Latorre** rushed for two touchdowns and passed for another to lead the fourth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies to a 45-10 win over Millersville University on Saturday night. The win was the 90th win of this decade (2000-09) for the Huskies and giving them an overall mark of 90-22.

After the Huskies stopped the Marauders on the opening drive of the game, Bloomsburg moved the ball 75 yards in 11 plays with Latorre covering the final seven yards with his 20th career rushing touchdown with 5:17 left in the first period.

Bloomsburg went ahead 14-0 later in the first period when defensive end **Justin Presley** intercepted Millersville quarterback Bill Shirk at the Marauders 40-yard line and returned it seven yards to the 33. Three plays later tailback **Derrick Price** scored from three yards out to put the Huskies on top by two scores with 2:19 left in the first.

In the second period, the Huskies made it 21-0 when Price scored his second touchdown of the game, this one from four yards out with 12:48 left in the half. After the BU defense forced its second three and out of the game, the Huskies drove 55 yards in seven plays with Latorre hitting **Jordan Weisman** with a nine-yard scoring pass with 7:07 left before the break.

Millersville got on the board later in the second period putting together a 40 yard drive capped off by a 47-yard field goal by John Banzhof with 2:06 before halftime. The Huskies, though, answered right back. After a 54-yard kickoff return by **Brandon Real** gave Bloomsburg the ball at the Marauders 46-yard line, the Huskies drove downfield in five plays with Latorre running 17 yards down the sideline and diving to the end zone for a score and a 35-3 lead at the half.

Real brought the fans to their feet early in the third period when he took a punt at his own 32-yard line and found a seam in the center of the field and went 68 yards for a score. It was the Huskies first punt return for a score since the 2006 season.

In the fourth period the Huskies added to their score with a 22-yard field goal by **Jon Koenig** for a 45-3 lead for the Huskies. Millersville's Cardoza Jacks got the Marauders only score of the night when he scored from a yard out with 2:32 to play to make the final 45-10.

Latorre finished with 69 yards rushing on six carries and two scores and 10 of 12 passing for 115 yards and one score. Defensively, **Mike Varanavage** made eight tackles for Bloomsburg, while **Thomas McFarland** had seven.

EAST STROUDSBURG-- Tailback **Derrick Price** carried 23 times for 165 yards and one score to lead the fifth-ranked Bloomsburg University Huskies to a 27-13 win over East Stroudsburg in a PSAC Eastern Division matchup.

East Stroudsburg jumped in front on its second possession of the game when it took over in Bloomsburg territory at the 49-yard line and quickly moved downfield on a 35-yard pass from quarterback Matt Marshall to Ed Kiser before the drive stalled at the Huskies eight yard line. From there Drew Reinhard connected on a 26-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead for the Warriors.
