A Few Facts About Bloomsburg

Enrollment— Total enrollment is over 8,040 with an average incoming SAT of 1070 and class rank in the upper 25 percent; Bloomsburg admits one in seven applicants and has a four-year retention rate significantly higher than the national average. About 60 percent are women and 10 percent are non-traditional. About 90 percent of Bloomsburg graduates are quickly placed in their chosen fields.

Faculty— With approximately 1,000 employees, Bloomsburg University has 383 full-time faculty, 70 percent of whom hold doctoral degrees and 72 percent of whom are tenured. The staff is organized into four divisions: Academic Affairs, Administration, Student Life and University Advancement. Governance is through the State System of Higher Education's Board of Governors and through the university's Council of Trustees.

Degrees— Bloomsburg University offers 63 baccalaureate degrees, one associate degree, 19 master's degrees and a joint doctoral degree in elementary education in cooperation with Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

Financial Aid— About 70 percent of all students receive some form of financial aid; average amount of aid is \$4,782 per year.

School Colors, Mascot— The school colors of Bloomsburg University, originally "lemon and garnet," have been maroon and gold since the 1920s. In the early 1930s, the Husky became the school mascot when a dog owned by a faculty member accompanied Adm. Richard E. Byrd on an expedition to the South Pole.

2007 HUSKIES

HEAD COACH Leah Quigley



Leah Quigley begins her first season as head coach of the Bloomsburg University lacrosse team. Quigley is a 2005 graduate of East Stroudsburg University with a degree in Sport Management.

While at East Stroudsburg, Quigley was a four-year member of the lacrosse team and earned All-PSAC honors three times. She was also named the PSAC Rookie of the Year and first team All-ECAC in 2002 after scoring 25 goals and assisting on 14 others in her freshman season.

As a junior, she was named an IWLCIA second team All-American after scoring 49 goals and assisting on 11 and finished her career by being named to the NCAA Division II North/South Senior All-Star game. Quigley, a native of Lansdale, Pa, was also East Stroudsburg's co-captain and Women's Lacrosse Outstanding Athlete in both 2004 and 2005. Overall, she scored 129 goals and assisted on 60 in her career.

Off the field, she was a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), the PSAC Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and the East Stroudsburg Sport Management Club.

In the fall of 2005, Quigley coached the junior varsity field hockey team at Methacton High School leading the team to a mark of 11-5-4. She also served as assistant varsity coach and helped the team to a record of 17-3 and the Suburban I League title.

ASSISTANT COACH Gary Agard



Gary Agard is entering his fifth season as assistant coach at Bloomsburg.

A native of Trinidad and Tobago, Agard was a member of both the Jr. and Sr. national teams from 1981 to 1983. During the 1980's he continued to play local hockey for the Rangers field hockey club, a team comprised of nine members of the national team.

In 1992, Agard came to the U.S. to pursue a college degree. Here he coached with the late

Michael Graham who was, at the time, one of the selectors for the United States Men's National team and the head coach of the Tristate Falcons Field Hockey Club.

After graduating from Brooklyn College in 1996 with a degree in Physical Education, Agard continued to play and coach for Tristate. The team was the champions of the North East Field Hockey Association from 1996-2001. In 2000, the team represented the United States at the inaugural Pan Am Field Hockey Club Championships held in Jamaica.

Agard, who has his Master's Degree in Education, resides in Bloomsburg.



2007 Season Preview

The 2007 Bloomsburg lacrosse team can be defined with one word, "change." A year after finishing 6-11 overall and 6-6 in the PSAC, the Huskies are back with a new head coach, a new crop of talented freshmen and even a new turf field in Bloomsburg's Sports Stadium.

First year head coach Leah Quigley is no stranger to PSAC lacrosse. A four-year member of East Stroudsburg's team, Quigley scored 129 goals and assisted on 60 in her career. The former PSAC Rookie of the Year feels that her experience within the conference will help her team adjust to the coaching change. "I've played in the PSAC, so I am familiar with the coaches and schools in the conference. I have also played against some of these women so I know their potentials and capabilities."



Although the season promises many changes for the Bloomsburg squad, a core of experienced players return for the 2007 season. Four seniors will lead the Huskies in their quest for a conference championship. On defense, All-American and All-PSAC player **Brittany Wilkins** returns for her senior year. Wilkins, the Huskies top defender from last season, is joined by senior **Alex Totino**, a vocal leader on the field. Wilkins and Totino combined for 61 ground balls and 37 caused turnovers in 2006. Rounding out the senior class are **Megan Taylor** and **Alison McFatridge**. Taylor returns to the attack as one of the team's leading scorers in 2006 with 28 goals and seven assists. McFatridge is a strong player that Quigley will look for in the midfield.

In addition to four seniors, a strong junior class will be back for the Huskies. Leading scorer **Cali Toms** returns for her third year as a starter. A two-time All-PSAC selection, Toms has great stick skills and will control the midfield for Bloomsburg. Also returning for the Huskies is **Angie Picciotti**, who is expected to step-up on defense this season. She led the 2006 team with 36 ground balls and is a relentless and very competitive player.

In goal, junior **Bridget Maenner** and sophomore **Justine Coleman** both return, and will split time. The pair had a 13.52 goals against average in 2006 and combined for 159 saves.

Although the Huskies will suffer due to the absence of **Sam Alexander** who will sit out the year with an injury, an experienced sophomore class will be back on the field for Bloomsburg. On attack, **Kelsey Quigley** returns after scoring 15 goals and assisting on six a year ago. Quigley will be another go-to player that can create scoring opportunities. Midfielder and defender **Cara McGroarty** will also return for the Huskies after starting all 17 games in her freshman season. Also on defense, **Lindsey Giusto** is expected to step-up with **Andrea Schweitzer** looking for increased playing time. **Mary Chirichella** will also join the fight for space on the attack.

Along with a solid group of returning players, there are also five freshmen joining the Huskies this season. **Kimberly Springman**, a versatile player with good speed and an aggressive style, will see significant time in the midfield. **Erica Nevin** is also expected to contribute right away, playing midfield and defense while **Beth Stewart** will look for playing time after sitting out the fall recovering from surgery. In addition, **Rachel Heil** and **Meg Moran** will battle for time on the attack.

Playing on a new \$1.5 million dollar multi-purpose, lighted stadium will also change the game plan for the Huskies. The turf will change the style of play to quicker pace with different shot opportunities. Quigley is excited for the change and thinks the new style will be beneficial "It will be more of a consistent game. When you're going for ground ball pick-ups, you're not worried about bumps or divots created. It's all the same."

Another change in the style of play comes from Quigley. This season, she plans to work on the team's transition game, moving the Huskies to a style often seen in men's lacrosse.

Bloomsburg opens the season with a strong non-conference schedule highlighted by Gannon and Mercyhurst and then will jump right into the tough PSAC action.



Overall, the future is bright for the Huskies. Quigley sees this season as a transition year, but still expects the team to compete for a spot in the conference tournament. "You have to build a program and you can't change something over night. I've told these players that if they work with me and listen to what I'm telling them, we can go places. I'm very excited and I think they are excited too. From what I saw in the fall, all their hard work is paying off."
