- ✓ Upon successful completion of the required courses, students will receive a certificate of program completion from Bloomsburg University.
- ✓ Upon successful completion of the multidisciplinary curriculum, students are eligible to apply for a 600-hour child life clinical internship at an approved children's hospital under the direction of a Certified Child Life Specialist.
- ✓ Upon successful completion of the internship, students are eligible to sit for the Child Life Professional Certification Exam.
- ✓ Upon receiving a passing score on the Child Life Professional Certification Examination, students become certified by the Association of Child Life Professionals (ACLP) for a five-year period, after which time they must recertify.
