

Decline in Student Retention

- The Math
 - Second year retention for the Fall 2013 cohort was 78.5%, and 72.2% for the 2017 cohort
 - This 6.3% decline represents 139 Students
 - Each student represented about \$17,000 in additional annual revenue.
 - 1 = \$17,000
 - 139 students = \$2,363,000 annually

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




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Six-Year Graduation Rates By College First-Time, Full-Time Freshmen Cohorts Fall 2006 through Fall 2012





2018-19 Strategic Priorities

1. Ensuring Student Success

- Increase First year student retention by 1 2%
- Increase new transfer student enrollment by 2 3%
- Increase residence hall occupancy by 1 3%
- Increase graduate student enrollment by 5%

 - Service learning opportunities
- Provide professional development opportunities for faculty and staff
- Establish a Presidential Commission on Diversity and Inclusion
 - Provide exemplary customer service to all constituencies

Student Retention

- •The Math
 - Fall 2018 entering class is approximately 1800 students
 - A 1% increase in retention means retaining an additional 18 students
 - 57 bachelors degrees on campus, plus undeclared
 - 1 additional student per degree offering, plus undeclared = 3% increase!
- •Each student represents an additional \$20,000 in annual revenue
 - 1 = \$20,000
 - 10 = \$200,000
 - 18 = \$360,000
 - 58 = \$1,160,000
