NOTES: 1.) Prerequisites denoted by \* Check with individual department on how to meet these or whether they might be waved. 2.) Study abroad is highly encouraged for students in the IS Minor. A maximum of 6 credits from study abroad will be accepted for the Minor. Students should seek prior approval to make sure that the courses taken abroad have a BU equivalent listed among the courses in the Minor. 3.) Similar to most multidisciplinary programs, we realize there is some overlap between the IS Minor and other majors and minors. To limit the inevitable "double-dipping", a student may only count two courses toward both the IS Minor and another major or minor. In cases where this requirement is difficult to meet, a student may appeal to substitute a course from one Section of the Minor curriculum for another.
