

An Honors degree consists of five Honors seminar classes and a capstone project in at least one of the five tracks.

COURSE WORK

All students will take **Honors 101 Liberal Arts Seminar** or **Honors Foundations of Writing**. These classes fulfill the writing requirement and will introduce the possible tracks the student can choose. In addition to this first-year seminar, students must complete 4 other courses with an Honors designation. However, TWO of these courses can be taken in Poland or can be courses by contract. These courses are designed to correspond to your general education classes and to fall into the sequence that you need. For example, if you are a nursing major, you should take Honors Psychology your fall semester, Honors Sociology and Honors Statistics your second semester. After completing these courses, you will have completed the basic coursework you need for Honors and fulfilled the general education requirements for nursing.

Standard Honors courses will be offered each fall and spring so that you can plan your schedule accordingly.

In addition to the general education, you will complete your Honors degree by following one of five tracks. You should pick the track that corresponds best with your major and interests and will help you get into graduate school or make professional connections. For example, many digital forensics students pick the intern track while many speech pathology majors choose the

research track. If you accepted the Presidential Leadership scholarship as an incoming student, you are required to follow the PLP track in order to maintain your scholarship. Non-scholarship students are able to select the PLP track as well.

TRACKS

Honors College tracks with concentrations in:

- A. Undergraduate Research
- B. Internship or Practicum
- C. International Experience
- D. Presidential Leadership Program (Service and Leadership Track)
- E. Additional Honors Coursework

Throughout your first year, you will attend presentations about research, internships, international trips, and service and leadership to further your knowledge on the expectations and requirements for each track. You will also meet with professors during events and Capstone Night to discuss what option might be best for you. By the end of your first year, students will declare their track.
