



Medical Permit for Parking

If your current health condition requires parking accommodations, please refer to the information below.

University Disability Services (UDS) will consider providing parking permits according to the following documentation:

- Submission of a **letter to UDS written by a medical professional** and typed on medical office letterhead. (Prescription pad notes will **not** be accepted.)

Letter **MUST INCLUDE:**

- Description of the medical condition and the reason(s) for the parking pass
- Length of time pass will be needed
- Signature of the medical professional

Once student has secured this documentation:

- Either fax letter from medical professional to: **570-389-5053** or hand deliver to UDS for review.
- Call 570-389-4491 or stop by University Disability Services to schedule an appointment to meet with the Director to discuss the parking permit request.
