

Dear Student,

You are receiving this email because you had potential exposure to COVID-19. Please use the information below that outline the next steps you should take.

If you have **no symptoms** and are **fully vaccinated**:

- You do not need to quarantine.
- You should be tested for COVID 3-5 days after the date of your exposure.
- You should wear a mask at all times when you are around others.
- When eating and/or drinking, use social distancing measures until receiving a negative test result.

If you develop symptoms at any time, please call the Student Health Center or leave a message through the secure portal (see below) or use this list of options to arrange testing. The SHC is open Mon.-Fri. 8 am to 6 pm. If you leave a message, a staff member will get back to you as soon as possible.

Outside regular hours, please seek medical care. You may contact or visit any of the following options:

- COVID testing is also available at the Bloomsburg Rite Aid pharmacy. Register for a test at Riteaid.com.
- Call 911 if it is an emergency.

If you have **no symptoms** and **you are not fully vaccinated**:

- You will need to quarantine for 14 days. Even if COVID tests are negative, you still need to quarantine for 14 days because people can test positive 10-14 days after exposure.
- You should get tested **immediately** upon receiving this message and again 5-7 days after your exposure date. Testing is available through the Student Health Center – call the SHC first. If after-hours, leave a message and contact one testing affiliates listed above.
- An Extended Medical Illness (EMI) form is attached to this communication which you can forward to any professors that require an EMI from you.

The safest place for you to quarantine is at home with your family.

Students living on-campus and who cannot return home should contact Residence life to inform them of your need to quarantine.

If you test positive off-campus, please notify the Student Health Center.


